## CLUB GOSSIP.—By NOMAD.

As the result of our drawn game at Ninian Park we went up one place in the table. As Brighton were defeated at Northampton; Notts County, with a win over Bourne-mouth, went into the lead with Watford, after their win against Bristol Rovers, third. Luton fell at home to the Rangers, while Millwall and Gillingham also suffered defeat. Newport did well to win at Swindon. Aldershot's win was their first since October 3rd, when curiously enough they beat Gillingham.

Dean, after all, was not included in the attack against Cardiff City, Barley partnering Briggs on the right wing. The City missed an early chance when Talbot missed badly, and then Poland saved well from Tait. The referee refused a penalty appeal against Hayhurst. Whittaker made a splendid save from Pinxton. Then against the run of the play we took the lead, for following a centre by Briggs Tait shot, but Poland pushed the ball out and Fielding secured and beat Poland. However, the City were soon on equal terms when Walton beat Whittaker following good work by Pinxton. Then Paterson flashed in a shot which nearly beat Poland, who deflected it with his foot.

At the start of the second half Barley went near with a long shot, and then at the other end Whittaker had to deal with an attack from their left wing. There were some exciting moments in the City goal-mouth, when Poland bungled a shot, but the ball was eventually cleared. Gregory kicked away a shot from Walton right on the goal-line.

Barley had hard luck when one of the defence happened to get in the way from a fierce drive. Whittaker was hurt in a scramble in the goal-mouth but was able to resume at once.

The defence had rather a hectic time in the first half against their attack, but came out of it with credit. Wright was the best of the halves. It probably would have paid to send the ball out oftener to the wings, who had much dryer turf to operate on than that in the centre.

This afternoon we entertain Luton Town, who put up such sterling displays against both Blackpool and Sunderland in the Cup. They lost their home record to Queen's Park Rangers on Saturday, when they were no doubt feeling the effects of their strenuous match in mid-week. Away from home they have beaten Walsall, Exeter, Millwall, Aldershot and Crystal Palace; drawn with Torquay; and lost to Cardiff, Queen's Park Rangers, Brighton, Northampton, Newport, Southend and Notts County. Of their 56 goals Payne has scored 29 and Stephenson 10. Payne has scored in every match in a run of 7 and another of 6. They have, like ourselves, scored in all but 3 matches. Last season we won

by 2 goals (both scored by Tait) to 1, when supporters will no doubt remember a magnificent display of goal-keeping by Coen.

The Reserves entertained Tottenham Hotspur Reserves with Dean at inside left. Neither goal-keeper was really troubled at the outset, but Brown, their right winger, should

Reid resumed on the left wing after the interval and receiving a pass from Dean put across a centre, which was headed goal-wards by Fielding, and Hooper brought off a fine clearance. Robertson sent a free kick only just wide with Hooper well beaten by the shot. Hedley got away on the left wing and his shot was deflected by the defence to Hall, who had an easy task of scoring.

Kirkman played a fine game in an unaccustomed position of back. The attack never got really going after Reid's injury except on one occasion in the second half.
