

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

Heartiest congratulations Joe. Your selection for the International Trial Match at Burnley on Wednesday next is an honour indeed and I hope you will make the most of it. Just remember what the Chairman told you last Easter Monday, that when you had scored three goals go on and score another three and even then don't give up, just put three more in. I am sure everyone round the rails today hope that you put up a game similar to those you have played for the club this season, and if such should prove to be the case, then your selection for England against Scotland should be positive. I can assure you Joe, that if this further honour does fall to you, the Club will be only too happy to release you, for here in Luton our national pride is still the highest factor. Good hunting boy and may you realise your ambition. By so doing you will not only bring honour to yourself but to the old Club who has given you your chance in Soccer. Now you Joe Payne fans, here is an opportunity to show your appreciation of a whole hearted player. Why not send him a telegram on Wednesday, care of the Burnley Football Club, wishing him the best of luck. Joe I hope the Post Office authorities reap a handsome revenue over you! You deserve it, and we deserve our income tax lowered.

I wish I could also congratulate our boys over a victory at Bournemouth, but alas. A defeat should never have occurred for at the interval we ought to have been five goals to the good instead of our solitary point, for our supremacy was most marked, and quite a hatful of chances were allowed to go a-begging. The commencement of the second half saw Bournemouth take the lead in five minutes, a lead which never should have been obtained for both goals were the result of atrocious mistakes. Having tasted blood the "Cherries" went all out and our boys literally fell to pieces, with the result that we lost two much needed points. Now then boys we cannot afford these lapses.

The "Stiffs" had a great duel with Brentford Reserves, finally running out victors by four goals

to two. It was quite a hard fought tussle and goal scoring chances on both sides were badly missed. The "Bees" should have been two goals in the lead in as many minutes and five minutes play should have resulted in four goals to one in their favour. When the interval arrived however, they were leading by a solitary goal, the result of a brilliant cross shot which cannoned into the net off the upright. Ten minutes after lemons, Brentford added to their number, but Jack Ball and then George Martin equalised the scores. Towards the close of the game too much vigour crept into it, but although our third goal came from a penalty, taken by Jack Ball, it was for a handling infringement, quite a ridiculous move on the part of the Brentford culprit for the ball was never in danger of reaching the net at the time. The final goal came right on the stroke of time and was the best of the match, a brilliant drive by Lance Hall finding a true berth. Well done "Stiffs" your exhibition in this game was much in advance of your recent performances and I hope you will keep it up. Remember at Fulham today you have that ten goals defeat to wipe off.

Now a word for our visitors today, the "Cobblers," your record this season is much superior to that attained in recent years and none welcomes this improvement more than your old rivals of Luton. Whilst we always like to have the best of our meetings, we always wish you to have a successful season. At one time this term I thought you were going to be serious contenders for the championship but those three away defeats recently, have, I feel, cancelled your chances. You will doubtless be all out today to lower our colours and although I sincerely hope you fail, I also trust that the game will be fought out in true British spirit and at the end of the tussle the losers will admit the winners as worthy of the laurels and the winners pay a compliment to the losers. Let us hope also that irrespective of the result the friendly relationships between the two clubs are more firmly cemented and that both of us will look forward to a renewal of our rivalry.

Here are a few notes of the "Cobblers" team who will be on the field today.

Wm. Cormlie (goalkeeper) Height 5 ft. 11 in. Weight 11 st. 10 lb. Born at Liverpool. Had trials with Blackpool and Blackburn Rovers then had a year as a professional with Fleetwood. Back again to Blackburn Rovers where he remained for four seasons. Nearly decided to give up football as a career, but was eventually persuaded to sign for the "Cobblers" and he is now in his second term with them.

S. Russell (right full back) Height 6 ft. Weight 12 st. 4 lb. Birthplace—Feltham, Middlesex. Started with Tunbridge Wells Rangers and then transferred his affections to Queens Park Rangers, where he stayed four seasons. Transferred to Northampton last season.

J. Little (left full back) Height 5 ft. 8½ in. Weight 10 st. 10 lb. Birthplace—Denston-on-Tyne. First played with Southport, from which Club he was transferred to Chester. Remained here some time then had a period in France. Transferred to Northampton last year.

L. Riches (right half back) Height 5 ft. 7 in. Weight 10 st. 6 lb. Can be looked upon as a "local." Played for Desborough and Kettering before Northampton secured him as a senior service player.

W. Thayne (centre half back) Height 5 ft. 11 in. Weight 11 st. 10 lb. Born at West Hartlepools. Had a turn with Crystal Palace before being attached to Hartlepools United in 1930. Came to Luton for 1934/5 season and after remaining here two terms was transferred to Northampton the back end of last season.

W. Simpson (left half back) Height 5 ft. 8 in. Weight 11 stones. Birthplace—Cowdenbeath. Was a Scottish Junior International centre forward before being gathered in by Clyde. After 4 years with the Scotch club was along with Blair, the full back, transferred to Aston Villa. Re-transferred to the "Cobblers" last close season.

S. D. Rawlings (outside right) Height 5 ft. 7 in.
Weight 10 st. 8 lb. Born at Wombwell and as
an amateur played with Dick Kerrs. His first
pro club was Preston North End with whom he
remained two seasons before being transferred
to Huddersfield. Had one season with the
Yorkshire club before going to West Bromwich
Albion. Transferred to Northampton in the
close season. A young player with experience.

D. Tolland (inside right) Height 5 ft. 8 in.
Weight 11 st. 6 lb. Birthplace—Glasgow. His

first professional club was Ayr United with whom he stayed eight seasons. Went to the "Cobblers" four years ago. Plays the typical Scotch style of the game.

R. Allen (centre forward) Height 5 ft. 11 in. Weight 12 st. 6 lb. Birthplace—Newburn, Northumberland. Graduated in the North Eastern League before having two seasons with Fulham. Was then 3½ seasons with Brentford before having a couple of terms with Charlton. Before being transferred to Northampton in October, had had 6 months with Reading.

J. Lauderdale (inside left) Height 5 ft. 8 in.
Weight 11 st. 3 lb. Birthplace—Glasgow. His
first League club was Third Lanark and then
had a turn with Queen of the South. Was
transferred to Blackpool, where he remained
two seasons gaining a promotion medal.
Transferred to Coventry, remaining there five
seasons and gaining a further promotion medal.
Went to the "Cobblers" during this present
season.

C. Lyman (outside left) Height 5 ft. 7 in. Weight 10 st. 7 lb. Birthplace—Northampton. Had trials with Southend and West Bromwich Albion, but turned professional for his native town's club. Now in his third season.


