### PLYMOUTH ARGYLE NOTES TO-DAY'S VISITORS—LUTON TOWN.

This afternoon we greet old friends and rivals Luton Town, whom we meet under Second Division auspices for the first time. Actually the Luton Town club is one of the oldest professional clubs in the South of England. Established in 1885, the history of the Bedfordshire Club is of a very chequered character. Reference to the activities of the Club show that in 1890 an offer of five shillings per week was made to each of three local players, Frank and Harry Whitby, and Read. At the end of that season it was decided to pay the whole of the first team, the agreed amount being two shillings and sixpence per week, with an extra sixpence for away matches and payment for working time lost before twelve noon on Saturdays. The following season the "wages" of the local players were doubled. In 1893, Alderman Harry Arnold became associated with the Club, eventually holding the chairmanship for nearly forty years, and in 1893-94 the club gained new fame by defeating the famous Old Westminsters. From 1898 to 1900-01, Luton enjoyed Second Division status, and the present officials are naturally hoping that the recent return to higher circles will meet with greater success. We congratulate them on victories already achieved against such doughty opponents as Aston Villa, Bradford and Manchester United at home, and against Newcastle United away.

It is of interest to note that when Argyle and Luton last met, goal-scoring formed a prominent part of the proceedings, the match at Home Park resulting in a win for the "Pilgrims" by 6-1, and the return match at Luton ending in a win for the homesters by 5-2, the players taking part on those occasions being:—

Born at Woolsthorpe-by-Belvoir, Grantham, his first professional club was Notts County. After a spell there moved to Bournemouth, and cost the Town a substantial fee. Was a gardener, Plays golf. Was married during the summer. 5 ft. 8½ ins., 10st. 11lb.



**Bert R. Lutterloch**, full-back, second season. Born in London. Came to Luton from Aldershot as an inside-right, but did not settle down; was tried successively first as a half-back, and then as a full-back. Gives promise of developing into a fine defender. Amateur with Tufnell Park before becoming a professional for Lille. Helped French club to win championship of France, 1933. Signed for Wolves, but, after two seasons went to Aldershot, 5 ft. 10 ins., 11st. 10lb.

**Thos. S. Smith**, full-back, fourth season. Born at Higham, near Burnley; played for them in his early days. Was in the Leeds Training College team, and centre-half for Nelson and Rochdale three seasons. Wing-half when he joined the Town, but has developed into a first-class full-back. School teacher in Luton, and plays cricket with his scholastic colleagues in the summer. Also plays lawn tennis, and is a swimmer of ability. 5 ft. 10 ins., 12st.

**John Finlayson**, *right-half*, in his third season with Luton, born at Thornliebank, Scotland. Played for his native village, and then went to Motherwell as an inside forward. Thence to Cowdenbeath, and on to Clapton Orient, where he became a half-back. Signed by the Town and gained his place at right-half. Grand attacking half, whose footwork is a delight. Star golfer of the team, 5 ft. 11 ins., 12st.

**John Nelson**, *centre-half*, also in his third season Captain and ideal leader. Chorley his birthplace, and played for Chorley All Saints before joining Chorley, the Lancashire Combination Club. Preston North End fixed him up, and from Deepdale he was transferred to the Wolves. Had three seasons at Molyneux and then the Town paid a large fee for him, particularly good with his head. Plays cricket and tennis. Was in the bleaching trade before a professional footballer, 6 ft. 1½ ins., 12st. 7lb.

**William J. Fellowes**, *half-back*, another player in his third season. Bradford born, but a Devonshire man at heart, being taken to Tavistock when very young. First club was Tavistock and then assisted Argyle, first as an amateur and later as a professional. Remained at Home Park for three seasons and then joined Clapton Orient, for whom he played at centre-half. Took over left-half position at Luton. Has a business at Tavistock. Plays cricket and golf, 5 ft. 9½ ins., 12st.

#### PLYMOUTH ARGYLE NOTES

**George I. Kidd**, *half-back*, joined Luton just before end of 1934-5 season. Born at Dundee, and played for Dundee North End. Charlton Athletic took him as an inside forward, but, when he went to Gillingham, was developed as a wing-half. A brainy player, shines in attack. Has a Scottish Junior International Cap. Plays tennis, 5 ft. 10 ins., 12 st.

**Joseph Loughran**, *half-back*, recruit. School teacher in Luton. Born at Consett, Co. Durham, and first played for Medomsley Juniors. Went to Dudley Training College; gained his place in the team there. Birmingham spotted him, made him a professional. Played in 35 First Division matches for Birmingham. Gained Junior International Caps against Scotland and Ireland in 1935. Good swimmer, 5 ft. 6 ins., 11 st.

**Charles Ferguson**, *inside-forward*, recruit. Born at Dunfermline. While playing for Glasgow Benburb, was awarded Scottish Junior International honours. Fixed up by Middlesbrough, where he was a contemporary of George Martin's. Joined Notts County from whom Luton signed him during the close season. Clever player of whom much is expected. 




