

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

WHAT can we say about a team which travels to Plymouth and wins by four goals to two, compared with that which a week previous was exceedingly fortunate to make a drawn game at home against Chesterfield. It is inexplicable. Just look for a moment at some of the results last Saturday, Notts Forest won at Sheffield Wednesday by two clear goals, the Wednesday the week previous having travelled to Coventry and inflicted on them their first defeat of the season. Fulham won at Notts Forest by one goal to nil a fortnight ago, but lost at home to Newcastle United by two goals to one. So you could go on and on, and to me the only moral you can obtain from this is never to put 'cert' home wins on your pools. But to return to our lads, none can gainsay that it was not a great victory, and as it was more or less unexpected, it was all the more sweeter. Fred Roberts' happy event during that week seemed to have put him in fine fettle and he scored two glorious goals (in fact I am informed that all the six goals scored were real good ones). Isn't it a pity he cannot have a son and heir, twins would be better perhaps each week of the season. The boys played more together as a team and seemed to have taken a leaf out of Chesterfields copy-book, in running into a vacant space once they had loosed the ball, in order to receive it back again.

The Arsenal Reserves were not so attractive as on previous occasions and although they won by the odd goal in three I think they were fortunate to find the "Stiffs" only ten strong after about the first ten minutes of the game. In spite of this handicap the "Stiffs" put up a remarkable game and one felt real sorry when their goal eventually capitulated five minutes from the end. All our six defenders did exceedingly well and compared favourably with the Arsenal sextette, Gordon Dreyer being a big success in the pivotal position.

Today we entertain and renew acquaintances with the "Cottagers" from Fulham, with whom we parted company at the end of Season 1931/2. Like ourselves the "Cottagers" are not going too great guns this term and occupy the twenty-first position in the League table. They will have to improve somewhat if they are to retain their Second Division status, but I hope they will not commence their

improvement against ourselves this afternoon.

Like many other well known combinations, Fulham had their origin in a Sunday School and were known as St. Andrews. As an amateur club they only enjoyed modest success in the early days, but joined the Southern League in 1898 when the present club was founded. They were admitted members of the Football League in 1907 and the following year in 1908 they reached the semi-final of the F.A. Cup only to be well beaten by Newcastle United. The best achievements of the Club were winning the Dewar Shield in 1905, winning the Southern League championship in 1906/7 and finishing as champions of Division III in 1932. From 1907 until 1927 the "Cottagers" were in Division II, having a spell in the Southern Section until their return for the 1932/3 season.

Many famous footballers have been associated with Fulham, including Arthur Berry, the Oxford University International, Wattie White, the Scottish International from Bolton, Arthur Brown and Bert Pearce. Among the leading players who joined the Club after the War were, Andy Ducat, the double international, Danny Shea, Joe Edleston, Peter Gavigan, Donald Cock and Jimmy Torrance.

One of the most sensational measures taken by the club, was the signing of Hassan Hegazi, an Egyptian at Cambridge University, who played for the "Cottagers" as an amateur, whilst before this the transfer of the famous Bob Templeton was effected. People still declare, that the disaster at Ibrox Park, when twenty-six people were killed, was due to the crowd swaying as Bob put in one of his electrifying runs.

LUTON SCHOOLBOYS' FOOTBALL

The Luton Schools football has reached the halfway stage for this season.

Old Bedford Road have maintained their early season form and are worthy leaders of the Senior League. They have won all their matches and hold a clean lead over Surrey Street and Denbigh Road. When Old Bedford Road and Denbigh Road met on Pope's Meadow, a very good match was played. The result, 3-1 for Old Bedford Road, was a good result as the Denbigh Road defence were unable to cope with the nippy, sharpshooting forwards of Old Bedford Road. Surrey Street have moved into second place by winning their last three matches in succession. Waller Street have also found the way to score goals. Ten goals in two matches have won them four points. The Dunstable schools occupy the two bottom places in the league. Britain Street are unfortunate, because they have a great task in finding a team each week as their boys live, in some cases, two or three miles from the school.

In the Intermediate League, Denbigh Road have a lead of five points over their nearest challengers, Old Bedford Road, and have defeated all their opponents. Their teamwork, for boys under 12½ years of age, is remarkable. Their keenest match was on Blundell Road ground with Old Bedford Road. A very even match ensued, but Denbigh Road collected both the points by scoring the only goal of the match. Northfields commenced the season by scoring twenty goals in three matches.

Unfortunately for them they have lost their shooting powers, for in their last three matches they have only gained one point.

On December 11th the Finals of the Luton Division of the Wix Trophy will be played on Hillborough Road ground. In the Senior Final, Surrey Street meet Beech Hill. When these teams met in a league match, Surrey Street won by the only goal of the match. Beech Hill have a long list of good performances in the Wix Trophy, having won it on more than one occasion. In the Junior Final, Christ Church are opposed to Norton Road.
