





## CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

SO after all we are to have a Cup Tie at Luton this season and to our Scarborough opponents we offer them a hearty welcome to our town, and at the same time our congratulations on having reached this round of the F.A. Cup competition. True we all hope that at the end of the game this afternoon they will have met their Waterloo, but one never knows. I am sure also it is the express wish of the Directors and Players of our Club to heartily thank the Scarborough F.C. for their exceedingly hospitable reception of ourselves on Thursday, Friday and Saturday last. No club could have been welcomed more profusely and we are glad for this replay today, if only to reciprocate in some small measure the many kindnesses we received at their hands. Supporters will thus see therefore that there is another side to professional football than the mere financial consideration.

Scarborough who have fought their way through every round of the Cup Competition this season, joined the Midland League in season 1927-8 after only a year in the Yorkshire League. They are one of the oldest clubs in the Football Association and celebrated their Jubilee in their Midland League Championship season. Professionalism was adopted in 1926 and membership of the Midland League obtained. In their first year in that League they were runners-up to Gainsborough Trinity. The season following they became champions, securing 81 points out of fifty matches. This number of points in a season stands as a record which will probably never be equalled as in later years the number of clubs in the League has been reduced to 22. During more recent years however, the club has been in dire straits through lack of support and in the last two seasons the question was discussed as to whether the Club could carry on. Fortunately this season saw an immense revival of interest in football in Scarborough, and the Club having gone so far in the F.A. Cup and having average receipts of £110 per match, are in quite a rosy position financially. This season their Midland League career has been affected by the Cup Ties and

consequently they have only been able to play 19 matches, of these they have won ten, lost five and drawn four (24 points). Their position is seventh and their goal average 27 for and 19 against. In the F.A. Cup they have played nine matches, including one replay—the original fixture being abandoned, only a few minutes from time through fog, when Scarborough were winning by four goals to one—and have scored twenty goals to five against them.

Robinson is a brilliant goalkeeper—one of the best in the Midland League—and their two full backs, Mitchell and Fieldsend, are dour cup fighters. Jolly, centre half, a clever footballer of the "stopper" type, is one of the mainstays of the defence, whilst Llewellyn and Heelbeck, the skipper, are a fine pair of wing halves. Nicol, centre forward, has been of inestimable value to the Club, having scored eight goals in the nine Cup Ties, and Beckett and Agar who form the right wing are a dangerous combination, for a great number of Scarborough's goals have originated from them. Sharpe, the inside left, is a constructive player, with a strong kick, whilst Varty, the left winger, who by the way is a doubtful starter this afternoon owing to an injury sustained on Saturday last, is rather an erratic player, sometimes playing brilliantly and at other times medioculously.

Anyway I am sure everyone hopes for a good game with the honours going to the team which deserves them most. The winners have the privilege and honour of entertaining Grimsby Town or Swindon Town who are fighting out their own cup battle at Swindon today.

## POSERS FOR SPORTSMEN

1. Two players have returned to Football League service this season after being out of it for eight and six years respectively. Can you name them?

2. Both extreme wingers of a club began this season credited with an identical total of Football League goals, for the whole of their careers, as did both the regular inside forwards of another club. What are the circumstances?

3. Among all the 88 Football League clubs how many are there which have never made a managerial change throughout the post war period?

4. Who is the only player in the game with the record of having moved to a new Football Club in each of the last eight close seasons, but never having done so during an actual playing campaign?

5. There are only two contemporary players who ever scored three or more goals in each of three successive Football League matches. Can you name them?

## HERE ARE THE ANSWERS

1. Eric Humphrey, an inside forward secured by Rotherham United, last was with a Football League club when he appeared for Torquay United in season 1928/9 and John Prince, a goalkeeper acquired by Crew Alexander, had been out of the League ever since he left Wrexham in December 1931.

2. Samuel Crooks and Douglas Duncan, Derby County's extreme wingers, had each scored 93 Football League goals and Horatio Carter and Patrick Gallacher, Sunderland's inside forwards, each 92.

3. Only four in Bolton Wanderers (Charles Foweraker) West-Bromwich Albion (Fred Everiss)

Plymouth Argyle (Robert Jack) and Brighton & Hove Albion (Charles Webb).

4. Harry O'Grady, an inside forward, who has had exactly a season each with Port Vale, Southampton, Leeds United, Burnley, Bury, Millwall and Carlisle United and now is with Accrington Stanley.

5. Alfred Lythgoe (now with Huddersfield) when playing with Stockport County in the Northern Section scored three goals against Darlington on March 10th, 1934, three against Southport on March 17th, and four against Wrexham on March 24th. Frank Wrightson playing with Chester in the Northern Section, obtained four against York City on February 1st, 1936, three against Barrow on February 8th, and three against New Brighton on February 15th.
