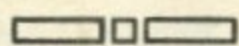

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

SO another great day for Luton soccer fans has drawn nigh. Dare we hope for an even greater day? One can never tell in this game. After the match with Sheffield United I made a remark to the effect that we should play a much worse game and win, but little did I think that this would come true so soon, for there is no doubt that on the exhibitions given, as we had lost to Sheffield United we undoubtedly deserved to lose to Burnley. But it's Cup Tie day today, so therefore for a brief span let us forget our League worries.

We extend a most cordial welcome to our visitors Manchester City, and let me say here and now that if the game this afternoon rivals the one I witnessed at Maine Road two seasons back, then not one of you will have grudged the money spent. It was the finest game of football I have ever seen.

Many people may be under the impression that Manchester City are breaking new ground today. That is not the case however, for old supporters of both clubs may recall the meetings in the Second Division in 1897-8 and 1898-9. It was on New Year's Day, 1898 that the City made their debut here, winning by three goals to nil and they also completed the double by winning by the odd goal in three at Maine Road. This triumph they repeated the following season again winning by three clear goals at Luton and by two clear goals at Maine Road. This latter season was a memorable occasion for our visitors for they carried off the Second Division Championship for the first time. Quite a large percentage of the players who were on view in our previous Cup Tie on January 25th, 1936, will be appearing today and to save any comments I give here the composition of the two teams.

Manchester City. Swift, Dale, Barkas, Percival, Marshall, Bray, Toseland, Herd, McLeod, Tilson, Brook.

Luton Town. Coen, Mackey, Smith, Finlayson, Nelson, Fellowes, Crompton, Martin, Ball, Roberts, Stephenson.

Herd and McLeod scored for the City and George Martin replied for Luton.

I am able to give here, thanks mainly to the assistance of "Volant" of the Manchester Evening Chronicle, a few notes on the men who comprise the City team here today.

Frank V. Swift, goalkeeper, has had a remarkable career. He has never missed a match of any description since he was given his first chance at Derby four years last Christmas after making only one appearance with the Reserves. He was then 19 years of age and had joined the City from a junior club, Fleetwood. He was a member of the team which won the F.A. Cup in 1934 and he has also a League Championship Medal. Is a native of Blackpool and a brother of the Bolton Wanderers goalkeeper of the same name. Height, 6ft. 2in., Weight, 14 st.

W. Dale, right full back, is the only Manchester born player in the side. He was brought out by Manchester United and is a model of consistency. Rarely has an off-day and is a cool and sound tackler and also a judicial distributor of the ball. Height, 5ft. 9in., Weight, 11 stones.

Sam Barkas, left full back, is the captain of the team and has had that privilege also in the England team in this season's internationals. A clever and stylish defender who places the ball well and never wastes a chance of going through. Brother of the Chelsea defender. Born at Wardley Colliery in the North East and reached the City from Bradford City. Height, 5ft. 9ins., Weight, 13 st. 6lb.

J. Percival, right half back. One of the youngest members of the team and another product of the North East. A quick footed player and an adept at bringing the ball under immediate control. Height, 5ft. 8½ ins., Weight, 11st. 7lb.

R. S. Marshall, centre half. The "veteran" of the side and known to everyone as "Bobby." A native of Hucknall, Notts, and was understudy to Charlie Buchan at Sunderland, from whom he was transferred to the City, nearly ten years ago. From an inside forward he has developed into a splendid pivot and is one of football's gentlemen, on and off the field. Height, 5ft. 10½ ins., Weight, 13st. 2lb.

J. Rogers, left half back. Is really the understudy to Bray who has been out through injury. He is a Yorkshireman from Normanton, although he joined the City from Oswestry. Rather on the small side, but is a tireless worker and has the courage of a lion. Played in the last Cup Tie against Bury. Height, 5ft. 6½ ins., Weight, 10st. 10lb.

E. Toseland, outside right. One of the fastest and most graceful wing forwards in the game and also one of the oldest members of the team. Joined the Club from Coventry City in March, 1929, and has rendered splendid service. Has been honoured by the League against the Irish League. Born at Northampton. Height, 5ft. 6 ins., Weight, 10st. 6lb.

Alex Herd, inside right. The only Scotchman in the side. Born at Bowhill and secured from Hamilton Academicals. A schemer and a strong shot. Height, 5ft. 8 in., Weight, 11st. 1lb.

J. Heale, centre forward. Has been a most unfortunate player. Suffered a very severe knee injury two seasons ago and another last season which kept him out of the senior team until a few weeks ago. Has made a complete recovery and has been serving the club well as a leader of the attack, though really an inside forward. Born at Bristol. Height, 5ft. 11½ ins., Weight, 11st. 7lb.

P. Doherty, inside left. One of the cleverest inside forwards in the game. An Irish International, born at Mogherafelt and secured from Blackpool at a fee of £10,000. Has been worth every penny of it to the City. A lovely player to watch and as energetic as he is clever. Height, 5ft. 10 ins., Weight, 11st. 7½ lb.

Eric Brook, outside left. A wonder man and one who surprised the football world a few weeks ago by turning out in the replayed Cup Tie against Millwall only six weeks and four days after an operation for appendicitus. A remarkable footballer, by reason of his capers, his wandering propensities and his terrific shooting. Born at Mexborough and joined the City from Barnsley nearly ten years ago along

with Freddy Tilson, his left wing partner, who until the return of Heale was the leader of the City attack. Brook has had all the honours the game can bestow, including Cup and League Championship Medals (both divisions). Height, 5ft. 7½ ins., Weight, 11st. 12½ lb.
