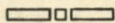

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

IT was a remarkable victory of the Boys at Bury on Wednesday, all the more remarkable, because we did not expect it. Yes, why not be candid. How many of us did expect it? I venture to suggest that even the most optimistic of our supporters could at the most only hope for a draw. But the Boys won on their merits and I am informed it was a thrilling game, everyone rising to their best. Joe Coen made some marvellous saves, whilst Bob Carte and Bert Lutterloch came through the ordeal with flying colours. I suppose pride of place must be given to Joe Payne. He reached his old form and all his goals were perfect gems. If this is what contemplated marriage does for you Joe, I should make arrangements with your fiancée to be divorced and remarried at regular intervals in the seasons to come. Apart from those I have mentioned individually all the remaining players did exceedingly well and all deserve equal amount of credit for the victory.

Today we have as our guests our old rivals, Coventry City and I am sure they will receive a special cheer when they enter the arena. Who does not remember those terrific struggles at the close of season 1935/6, when three points from the two games would have meant promotion to us instead of the City. If we have a repetition of that thrilling match here today I do not think any of us will have a grumble. The "Bantams" have still a chance of the championship, especially so after Sheffield United's home defeat on Thursday, but the odds on them gaining this honour has considerably diminished during the past few weeks. At one time they had not lost a match during 16 games. Very little change has occurred in the personnel of their team since last we met, but the following few notes on their expected team may prove of interest.

Morgan, goalkeeper, was signed on from the Newcastle district as long ago as March 1932, as a very young man. His development was consistent with his youthful promise and he has been automatic choice for the past three seasons.

Astley, right full back, an expensive capture from Brentford, two years ago, he has not missed a

first team game since. Took an invaluable part in the last few months of the promotion campaign when the City beat Luton for the honour "on the post."

Metcalfe, left full back, signed last close season from Brentford to renew a happy association there with Astley. Has kept his place since his arrival in Coventry; is sound and steady and extraordinary quick for a big 'un.

Frith, right half back, another long-service Bantam. Manager Harry Storer converted him into a half back from an inside forward when he secured him from Chesterfield five years ago. Despite his great experience, Frith still is one of the young men of a young side and on form he is considered one of the best attacking wing halves in the Division.

Mason, centre half, captain of the side. "Stonewall Mason" they call him in Coventry. A school-boy international, Mason, who is still in his early twenties, is looked upon as a certainty for an English "cap" soon. He and Joe Payne had many a tussle in the old Third Division days.

Archer, left half back, one of the first men Manager Storer bought after the side won promotion in 1936. Formerly with Everton, Archer is one of the fastest men in the game, and a great attacking force.

Taylor, outside right, was signed from Bolton Wanderers in October 1937, for whom he had played 170 consecutive First Division games. His first appearance, and incidentally his first goal for the City, was against Luton on October 9th last, when City won 2-1.

Roberts, inside right, a youngster secured from Derby County last March. His constructive ability, allied with a deadly shot makes his promise exceptional.

Lake, centre forward, is normally the Reserve side inside left. He has been brought back to help the first team get over their goal-shy complex which has attacked them since Christmas. Twelve months ago he did the same with beneficial effect all round.

MacDonald, inside left, the worker of the side, spelt with a capital "W." When City obtained his services from Tranmere Rovers in June 1936, MacDonald was described as the best inside forward in the Northern Section of the Third Division.

Brown, outside left, normally plays on the other flank where he is still capped regularly for Ireland. When Taylor came from Bolton, Brown obliged by taking over duty on the other wing, and this dapper little player, who is the team's highest scorer, solved one of Manager Storer's problems without impairing his own efficiency in the least.

The "Stiffs" are visiting Brighton, and I am hoping for a victory. They have been having a very rough time of late, but I would not be surprised that with the added strength of our latest acquisition, John Lewis, from Wrexham in the pivotal position, the "Stiffs" will regain their confidence and team spirit and treat us once again to those enjoyable games we had from them earlier in the season. Anyhow here's wishing them luck.

LUTON DISTRICT SCHOOLS F.A.

Old Bedford Road are the champions of the Senior League for this season. With two more matches to be played they have a lead of 9 points over their nearest challengers. Their captain and left back, Raymond Ruffett, played in the International Trial at Southend on February 5th. This may be one good explanation of their goals against column, which has not been added to this year. Surrey Street, who are Luton's representatives in the Wix Trophy, are next in the league. Beech Hill hold the record score for this season. They gained this honour when they defeated Waller Street by eleven clear goals. Denbigh Road, who challenged Old Bedford Road for the top position earlier in the season, have 3 matches in hand, but they may get second place yet. The newcomers to our association, The Junior Technical School, have settled down and are making a good reputation. In friendly matches this term they have defeated Waller Street 5-1, Surrey Street 3-1, Denbigh Road 5-1 and Beech Hill 5-1.

The Intermediate League presents a different aspect to the Senior. Here, Denbigh Road are undefeated this season, but they are closely followed by Old Bedford Road. When these two teams met on Pope's, on February 26th, the championship of the league will probably depend on the match. Earlier this season Denbigh won by the only goal of the match. Perhaps they will lose their undefeated record, but not without a fight. Northfields seem to be a good third in the final placings. The last four teams will fight among themselves for the bottom position of the table. Surrey Street have three points this term in their endeavour to escape the bottom rung and Britain Street seem to be slipping further down, especially when one considers that in their last three matches they have conceded twenty-two goals, eleven of which were collected by Old Bedford Road.

In the Junior Table, Queens Square and Norton Road are Luton's representatives in the Junior Wix Trophy. In the Luton Division they defeated Hitchin Road 3-1, Denbigh Road 1-0 and Christ Church 3-1. In the competition proper they accounted for Welwyn Church of England School by 6-0. Their centre forward, Gurkin, winged on by the offer of one penny for every goal he scored, netted five times.
