

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

IT was a good performance to bring one point away from Upton Park last Saturday and the boys are to be congratulated on a fine performance. From all accounts goals should have been scored by both teams, but it seems a general opinion that a draw was a fair reflex of the game. Perhaps this does not give the defence the plaudits they deserve, but all the same it was a source of satisfaction to know that after a lapse of over two months the rearguard was again impregnable. This naturally speaks well for Jack Lewis who was making his initial pivotal appearance in the premier side, and perhaps augurs well for the future. Bert Lutterloch again gave another polished display, which gave great pleasure to his adherants, and it seems that the perseverance given to him for the full back berth is now bearing the desired fructification.

The "Stiffs" gave us an example of their early season form and if the score had been doubled or trebled no one would have been surprised. A little more quickness on the part of the inside forwards would have made this an actual fact, but the lively ball was not controlled quickly enough before a defender had tackled. It would not be right to mention any name individually in connection with the result, for all pulled together and it was the team work which gave them the success.

Today we receive a visit from old rivals, Southampton. How many have been the tussles between us in the past and how keen the contests? In fact they have always resembled a Luton-Watford Derby. The "Saints" are immediately below us in the League Table, with the same number of points from the same number of matches, but with an inferior goal average. They have something to wipe away also, for we scored six of the nine goals at the Dell on October 30th last. But I suppose our boys will have a say here.

The Southampton Football Club was formed in the year 1885 and its origin is one of the many romances of Association football. Some youths at St. Mary's, the parish church of Southampton, conceived the idea of forming a football club and with Archdeacon Wilberforce as their President, the Club

was inaugurated. Their connection with the Church continued for a number of years and was not severed until 1897 when the name of the Club was changed to Southampton. The Cup fighting reputation of the "Saints" has always been a high one and they commenced their collection of trophies in 1887 when they won the Hampshire Junior Cup. Their record in this competition was remarkable as they never lost the trophy until 1890, and then they claimed it as their own property. Application for admission to the Southern League was made in 1895, but permission was refused, only to be followed by an invitation to join on account of another team dropping out. The following year the "Saints" broke all records by winning the championship without suffering a single defeat, thus more than justifying their promotion to a higher grade. The year 1900 saw Southampton in the final of the F.A. Cup, but despite every endeavour they had to admit defeat to Bury by four clear goals. This defeat however, did not deter them in their efforts and for five successive seasons they alternated between capturing the championship of the League and figuring in the Final of the Cup.

Few Clubs cater more for the youth of the town and district than this Hampshire Club and the Southampton Boys Club have a record of which they are proud. To Southampton also is attached perhaps the most successful Supporters' Club in the country, who have been responsible for contributing many huge sums to the Exchequer of the Club.

Well "Saints" we are more than delighted to renew your acquaintance today, but we want those points more than you do.

Can YOU Answer This?

A referee has occasion to drop the ball to restart the game; if a player continually plays the ball before it has touched the ground and after a proper caution he is sent off the field for ungentlemanly conduct, should the referee drop the ball again or or should he give a free kick against the player who has been sent off the field?

Answer. The recent alteration to Rule 16 makes it apparent that when the game has to be restarted by the referee dropping the ball, that is the only way the game can be restarted. If therefore any incident occurs during the temporary suspension of play it must be dealt with according to the law governing it and then the game should be restarted by the referee dropping the ball.





