CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

SO once more the boys confounded the critics, myself included, although I have been dubbed a pessimist, by forcing a draw at Blackburn. I say quite openly and unashamedly that I did not expect this, my conclusions being arrived at by the facts that the Rovers needed the points, were playing before their own supporters and had been beaten by four goals to one at Luton earlier in the season. The result just shows how difficult it is for anyone to weigh up football form and as it proved last Saturday, I am glad I could not. From all accounts we were more than unfortunate to only make a draw and had we been leading by four or five goals at the interval nobody could have said us nay. Indeed after the game the Rovers openly admitted they had been exceedingly fortunate. All the boys did extraordinary well, the defence playing right up to form, although they will be advised to play to the whistle instead of taking for granted that all their appeals will be given. This was the cause of the loss of one point, all standing still appealing for offside with the forward running on and shooting past Joe Coen as the latter advanced. The forwards did more shooting than usual, but unfortunately missed many "sitters." The combination frequently was delightful but the final effort, with the exception of two occasions, was rather deplorable. It was good though to see George Stephenson and Ted Hancock amongst the scorers. It is one of my contentions that the majority of goals scored today should go to the credit of the extreme wingers for rules and working formations have been so framed as to leave them with more scope than any player on the field.

The "Stiffs" gave another grand exhibition against Fulham and the "Cottagers" have much to thank their goalkeeper Lawrence for, as any slightly inferior custodian would have had a dozen goals

registered against him. This is indeed no exaggeration for I do not remember any game this season in which we have seen so many accurate shots put in. The forwards all played well and it was quite pleasing and refreshing to see George Cox's first timers. The two goals he scored were real gems taken first time from quite thirty yards distance and giving the custodian absolutely no chance whatsoever. If the "Stiffs" had given us this form all the season we should have been fighting for the Championship of the Combination. Today they are at Millwall and an opportunity is being given to Norman Thorn, the Markyate boy who has shown up well in the Mid-Week League matches.

Today we entertain famous campaigners in Sheffield Wednesday. They have been the heroes of many hectic struggles in the past, but this term nothing seems to go right for them. The game has every indication of being a battle royal, for the Wednesday are desperate for points and a defeat here would put them more than ever in the doldrums. Yes, this afternoon's game is a vital one for the Wednesday, of course we too, have not anything to throw away, for points are just as precious to us as to our visitors. In an endeavour to get on the winning track the Sheffields have been spending the week at Skegness, trusting, I suppose that the bracing breezes of the East Coast will help to regain their confidence. Well here's hoping that the best team will win.




