DIRECTORS' NOTES.

ON Saturday last we again failed to obtain our first away point, at Southampton. We were definitely unfortunate, as, after being a goal down at half-time, we immediately equalised on resuming, Buckley obtaining the goal. After this we certainly held the upper hand until mid-way through the second-half, the whole team playing delightful football.

Numerous Tranmere attacks were broken up by Southampton's latest acquisition—Emanuel, obtained from Swansea Town during the current season. The second goal scored by Southampton was of a most unusual character, a very tame shot being put in from about 25 to 30 yards out, which found the net through our goal-keeper being unsighted. The third goal quickly followed from the right wing, and this seemed to have an adverse effect on our players for the remaining 15 minutes of the game.

The local Southampton Football "Echo" gave a very prominent head-line in their report of the match praising Tranmere's football.

Both our team and officials were struck by the extremely sporting attitude of the Southampton supporters, our goal being received with practically the same enthusiasm as the Southampton club's.

During our stay in Southampton, the boys had the pleasure on the Saturday morning, of visiting the C.P.R. Liner "Empress of Britain." A very enjoyable time was spent by all. One of the pleasant features of the trip was meeting with one of the ex-Directors, Mr. Ernest Dimmer, and family. He was a member of the Tranmere Board for many years prior to his removal to Southampton for business reasons.

The Second team "Gate" last Saturday was very pleasing, as the best part of 2,000 spectators attended to witness a very sporting encounter with our neighbours, Liverpool F.C.

To-day we have as visitors the Luton Town club, generally referred to as the "Hatters." This is their first visit to Prenton Park, and we extend to them a hearty welcome. We are hopeful that our team will re-produce the form shown against West Bromwich Albion a fortnight ago, and we are confident that providing this happens, we will again record a victory, and thereby rise in the League Chart.

A very different atmosphere prevailed at the West Bromwich match, amongst the spectators, and we trust that they will keep up the good work, and play their part towards helping the boys to success.



EDITORIAL NOTES.

BRIGHTER OUTLOOK.

The events of the past fortnight have been such that although we are still at the moment at the foot of the table, we consider our outlook is much brighter. It is our confirmed opinion that the turn in the tide of our fortunes was heralded by our striking and convincing victory over West Bromwich Albion here two weeks ago. The "Throstles" came here occupying second place and we have no doubt confident of gaining two points that would have put them at the head of affairs. In their quest they had the encouragement of an early lead, but our boys revealed enthusiasm and craft that was reminiscent of their play all last season and a thrilling game saw us gaining the day by 3—1. There was no disputing the merit of the win which was the outcome of fine all round team work. Docking (2) and Cassidy were our marksmen.

Last week we lost at Southampton by 3—1 but the generally expressed opinion of all who saw the game was that we deserved at least a point if not both. The home side were not nearly so impressive in their midfield work but they had the luck in front of goal and it was this alone that decided the issue in their favour. In this game too there was marked evidence of fine team spirit and it was this that gives us reason to anticipate that from now on we shall gain a greater measure of success and long before the end of the season rise to a position that will leave us free of all relegation worries.

LUTON AS VISITORS.

We have a home engagement this afternoon and once again face new opposition in meeting Luton Town. Like ourselves Luton a few years back were a Third Division side and we congratulate them on having established themselves in the higher sphere.

We anticipate a hard struggle against them for they are comfortably placed in the middle of the table with thirteen points to their credit from twelve games. They are one of the teams who as yet have not been beaten on their own turf but three of their six visitors have succeeded in taking away a point. That the southerners are not purely a home team however is borne out by the fact that they have won twice on opponents' territory and it will certainly not be through a lack of endeavour if they fail to improve on this record at our expense.

When our boys were last at home an appeal was made to our supporters to be more liberal with their vocal encouragement, and we are glad to say the response was as good as it could possibly be. We go further and say that the whole-hearted enthusiasm had a vital part in the success that was gained. It was easily seen how the players appreciated the backing they were given by the onlookers, and we are convinced that all present for this game will once again do their part in making Clark and company feel really at home. The players have regained their confidence and will be seen pulling out their last ounce in order to record a further win.






