

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

WE offer a cordial welcome today to Swansea Town, who will also doubtless receive an ovation as they enter the field from the Welsh contingent who are now domiciled in our town. The "Swans" have been facing a titanic struggle to retain Second Division status now for some years and although fortune has not altogether favoured them they have somehow or other managed to weather the storm and by so doing have earned the plaudits of all soccer enthusiasts. Swansea has been one of the towns that has suffered through the industrial depression and in addition have to contend with the great counter-attraction of the Rugger code. We, here in Luton, do not realise what this means, but as one travels westwards and also northwards, in this respect, it is borne upon one more forcibly what a struggle clubs, who have this competition to meet, have to face.

Swansea have a very curious record this term for it was not until December 24th that they obtained their first victory before their own fans. Prior to this they had played nine matches at Vetch Field, five of which were drawn, the other four ending in defeat. Strangely enough it is the League leaders or I should say the more firm favourites for championship honours who have met their Waterloo in Wales. Manchester City were the first victims and were quickly followed by West Bromwich Albion and Blackburn Rovers, whilst West Ham United also bit the dust there the other week. Unfortunately they received another set back last Saturday, for Norwich City, a club also in danger of the relegation bogey, came away victors by the only goal of the match and in this instance the pill was all the more greater for it was a Swansea player who deflected the ball past his own custodian. Their team today is quite a little changed from that which opposed us in October for on that occasion they were represented as follows—Moore, Lawrence, Emanuel, Harris, Simons, Lloyd, Richardson, Paton, Bamford, Olsen, Millington. The following are a few pen pictures of the players who will be wearing their colours this afternoon.

Moore, goalkeeper, is a native of Worksop and has been with them for several seasons. He is preferred to Roy John, the Welsh International.

Lawrence, right back, is a Welsh International and has played against England, Scotland and Ireland. This is his ninth season with the "Swans."

Emanuel, left back, is another Welshman and also a local. When his brother was transferred to Southampton some weeks ago, he assumed his mantle.

Tabram, right half back, is another young local, who has shown to advantage recently.

Imrie, centre half, is a Scot for whom the "Swans" paid their biggest transfer fee to Newcastle United. His previous clubs were St. Johnstone and Blackburn Rovers.

Rhodes, left half back, joined the Welsh Club from Sheffield Wednesday being part of the deal

when Lewis, the extreme right winger, made the trek to Hillsborough. A Wolverhampton lad, he had several seasons with his native town before going to Sheffield.

Bruce, outside right.

Meek, inside right, is a player from whom much is expected, having recently been obtained from Tottenham Hotspur. He has appeared for the Spurs here on several occasions. Previous clubs, Bradford and Gateshead.

Bamford, centre forward, is their leading goalscorer, having nine goals to his credit. Although born in South Wales, it was with Wrexham that he first obtained recognition. A Welsh International secured by Swansea from Manchester United during the close season.

Olsen, inside left, is a native of Aberaman and has been with the club since 1931. A temporary loss of form lost him his place in the team, but he is now back in favour.

Millington, outside left, was secured towards the end of last season from Notts County, being one of a number of players engaged then in their efforts to avoid relegation.




