

CLUB NOTES

WITH the result of last Monday evening's game at Ninian Park still fresh in our minds—and what a wonderful thrill it was to those of us who were here when the half-time score came through—we look forward to the return match with Cardiff here this evening with great anticipation. To force a draw at Cardiff, especially after twice being in arrears, is a wonderful achievement and our lads played really well. It was a different game altogether than our opening match of the season and if our boys can reproduce the form they showed at Cardiff then we are in for a real treat tonight. The Cardiff boys, like last year, are never beaten and go all out the whole time in their efforts to win. The first half was very good, but the second was thrilling from start to finish with Luton trying (and all but succeeding) to increase their lead, while the Welshmen strove tooth and nail to get at least another goal, and eventually succeeded. And then of course having done that they wanted to do it again and not until the final whistle could the supporters of either side (and we had quite a few) really relax. A thrilling game and one which the spectators will remember for a long time.

We do not know the result of last Saturday's game at Leeds at the time these notes were being prepared so cannot give any opinion on the game. The lads, when they set out on Friday afternoon, were confident of bringing back with them both points and we hope they were successful. That we did it last year is not much indication of what we shall do this, but if they have brought back one point they will have done quite well.

Those of you who saw the game here on Monday evening last, against Leyton Orient Reserves, must have gone away very pleased with the showing put up by our lads. In the second half particularly our team played wonderfully well and it was very nice to see our centre forward popping in the goals. Leyton Reserves are not a bad team, this they showed in the first half, but they simply could not cope with our boys' splendid display after half-time. If our lads could keep up this form we would see a lot of goals at Kenilworth Road this season.

Anyone contemplating buying 5/- tickets for the Southampton and Tottenham matches are advised to do so very soon.
