CLUB NOTES

WITH their fine display at the 'Hawthorns' on Saturday last to encourage them, our lads will be all out to gain another home victory at the expense of Chesterfield who are our visitors to Kenilworth Road this afternoon. Chesterfield are one of those teams who perform better away from home than on their own ground and so far this season have only suffered one away defeat. The Town have a very good chance of drawing level with their visitors this afternoon as only two points separate the teams, although six places separate us in the League Table.

It was obvious to all at West Brom. on Saturday that Tommy Kiernan will, once he has settled down prove a very valuable asset to us, and give the team the all-important generalship that has been so apparently lacking in their displays of late. We welcome him on his first appearance at Kenilworth Road and wish him the best of luck in his future with the "Hatters."

Again one of those queer turns of fortune, which are becoming all too numerous in the matches in which the "Hatters" are concerned, robbed us of a point at the "Hawthorns" last Saturday. With only seven minutes of play left, a bounce-up was awarded after a scrimmage on the edge of the penalty area. Elliot fastened on to the ball and his hard shot from close range was partly stopped by Bernard Streten and with the ball just crossing the line Jimmy Wilson kicked away, only to see his clearance-strike the legs of Walsh who was in close attendance and so enter the net. This was a most unfortunate happening and was all the more regrettable from our point of view as it seemed we were going to hold this lively Albion side to a well earned draw.

Apart from this incident the match was a "thriller" and both sides produced some fine football to wet the appetites of the 25,000 odd supporters present, including a good number of our own staunch followers.

The Stiffs came out on top once again and although their display was not up to the standard of some of their previous matches they did all that was necessary to secure full points from West Ham Reserves with the one very good goal scored by Bill Burtenshaw. As the Chelsea Reserve side went down at Norwich our lads now have a very good chance of regaining the leadership of the Combination Table, as they are still a game in hand and only one point behind Chelsea. But they have a very stiff task in front of them at Birmingham this afternoon, for they will be without Duggan and Daniels whom we were hoping to play but injury prevents them from doing so. If our boys can share the points they will have done very well indeed for Birmingham have a very good side.

Will all supporters please note that owing to our very small allocation from the Football Association we cannot entertain any more applications for tickets for the England v. Scotland International Match to be played at Wembley, next April 9th.
