CLUB NOTES

AS with this afternoon's game here with West Ham, League matches all over the country become momentarily forgotten while Clubs struggle for supremacy on the long trail to Wembley and the Cup Final. Each of the sixty-four Clubs involved today no doubt feel that with a bit of luck they could be in the hat when the draw for the fourth round takes place on Monday next. Due to the knock-out character of the competition each Club is very anxious to win their match and this makes the F.A. Cup Matches the big attraction they are. For the second year in succession the "Hatters" are drawn against a Club from their own Division and we of course hope that, for the third consecutive year we will successfully negotiate our first hurdle in the competition.

Our lads will start the game today with the comforting knowledge that they have already beaten the "Hammers" on their home ground this season, and also that their opponents have not beaten them at Kenilworth Road in their two encounters since the end of the war. This fact, however, will not daunt the thousands of supporters of the London Club who are making the journey today from London to cheer their side into the next round, and especially those who believe in the old theme, "Third time lucky."

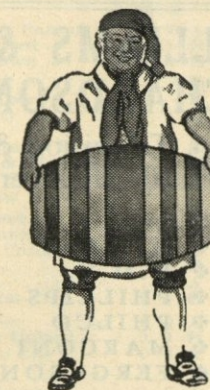

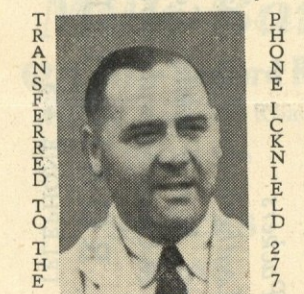
