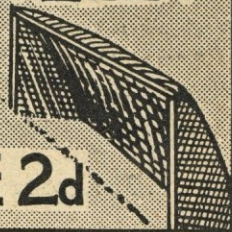

Here we are for the third year in succession in the Fifth Round of the F.A. Cup Competition and hoping this time that we shall go one better at least than on the two previous occasions. Our lads are playing extremely well these days and given normal luck will take a very good team to beat us on our own ground so it is with quiet confidence that we are expecting to overcome this present obstacle to our further advancement in the Competition. Nevertheless we give a great welcome to our Leicester City friends whether they be Officials, Players or Supporters, and may we all witness a fine and sporting game with the spoils going to the team most deserving them.

Cup Tie fever has surely reached its peak this week in Luton and we must say in passing that although we have tried to allocate the tickets for this game fairly, many of our supporters have been disappointed. It is impossible to find a way of giving everyone satisfaction especially when the demand for tickets is so greatly in excess of supply, but we have done our best by spreading the limited number over as wide a field as possible. And we must add here that all applications already received for Round 6, will be returned without any satisfaction being given. It is very nice to have such faith in one's team but it does not give the chap who is conforming to the Rules and Regulations a fair chance, nor is it fair on the Staff who have already got their hands more than full dealing with this present hurdle. If we do get through any application received before Wednesday morning next, (the day after the announcement in the local Press) will be dealt with after all other applications have been considered.

THE LATE MR. W. C. CUFF

We should like to pay tribute and express our deepest sympathy in the passing of Mr. W. C. Cuff. Mr. Cuff had been President of the Football League for ten years, and commanded the respect of all who knew him. In memory of his predecessor, Mr. Cuff once wrote, "I have been called upon to succeed Mr. C. E. Sutcliffe as President of the Greatest Competition in the World of Association Football and in that high office it is my duty and my privilege to put on the mantle which Mr. Sutcliffe had to relinquish, and to his work as well as to the merits of the causes he had so greatly at heart, I will give of my best." Mr. Cuff, we can safely say, fulfilled that promise to the full.

Leicester City have not this season until recently been having a very happy time and have found the going very sticky. They made some acquisitions to their playing staff however and these have resulted in some very praiseworthy efforts both in the League and the Cup. Their efforts in the Cup may almost be termed 'giant-killing,' for to dispose of Birmingham City and Preston, both well-known Cup fighters, is no mean achievement. Leicester have now equalled their 1946-47 post war record of playing eight games without defeat. Naturally they are out to break that record, but for our sakes we hope that achievement is to be delayed a little longer. It is worth noting in passing that the Managers of the two teams are of the same surname, a coincidence which would have been remarkable if both teams had been in the Final! Leicester must be quite relieved that Ted Duggan is not playing for us today for in our last three encounters he has scored five goals. When we met Leicester here last October the score was one goal each, our goal being scored by Duggan and theirs by their right half, W. Harrison. Our team that day was: Streten; Wilson, Cooke; Gardiner, Hall, Owen; Brennan, Duggan, Arnison, Daniel and Waugh. Only seven of these players are in the line-up today and of those only Streten, Wilson, Cooke, Hall and Waugh retain their original places. It is surprising what changes can take place in so short a time.

Two points last Saturday against Barnsley helped us to strengthen our position in the League Table and also to gain our first double of the season. The Reserves too did quite well to bring a point away from Coventry, especially after the forward line had been altered so drastically.

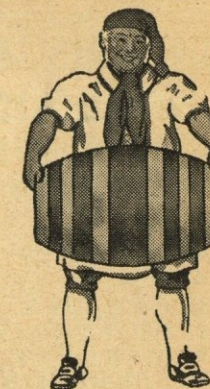
