## CLUB NOTES

THE fog at Coventry was so bad last Saturday that there was never any chance of the game between the City and Wednesday being played to a finish. In fact it is open to argument as to whether it should ever have been started.

The referee having once started the match, carried on, hoping every few minutes that the mist might clear. But it never did.

Coventry scored a goal but few could see how it had been scored and that apart there was the question of off-side. However, there is no need to say anything more.

AS Gannon was held up by fog on his return from Eire, where he had been attending the funeral of Jimmy Dunne, Norman Jackson had to be called on to play at right-half back. He joined Wednesday last season from Bradford junior circles. He has been developed in the Yorkshire League and Central League teams.

The abandonment of the match cost us second place in the table as Hull won at Luton and by their win became two points better off than ourselves, though we have this Coventry match in hand.

You will have read about our new motor coach which was used for the first time last Saturday. It is the very latest in style and comfort and gives the players more freedom of movement.

Wednesday do their best always to consider the comfort of their players and in various ways the management contribute those little extras which make all the difference. For instance, the players were taken to Manchester to see the England v. Ireland International match, just as earlier on in the season they were taken to one at Liverpool.

TOTTENHAM continue to lead in the race for promotion. Unquestionably they are a very fine side but they have been fortunate in being able to field an unchanged team

throughout, except the one instance when Burgess, their Captain, was away on international duty. They have only dropped four points in 17 matches and they may not be halted until Christmas. They might be beaten in one of the Yuletide matches. It would be a very unusual Christmas if there were not some upheavals!

Tottenham have fixtures with Blackburn Rovers and Chesterfield. Blackburn, who had been having a thin time, revived against Barnsley and followed it up with an away win at West Ham. As Blackburn are the only team to have beaten the 'Spurs' this season, at White Hart Lane at that, they will be out to complete the double at Ewood Park on Christmas Eve.

WE have to take serious notice of Hull City who have strengthened their playing resources by acquiring John Revie from Leicester City. The City directors and manager Carter are intent on following last season's Northern Section success by securing a promotion ticket to the First Division.

Well, Wednesday are also keyed up about promotion and those who saw our match with Southampton a fortnight ago could not help but realise what a grand team spirit exists and how valiantly the men fought.

Froggatt's goal was a beauty and Witcomb's equaliser a good opportunist effort. Many thought victory had been achieved when there was that remarkable struggle in the goal-mouth after Rogers had headed in and Black had fallen on to the ball on the line. It was a most exciting incident.

Next Saturday, Wednesday visit Barnsley and in view of their record this season the "Reds" will take some holding. Last season Wednesday lost 4-0 at Oakwell.

## SOME LUTON TOWN CONTRASTS

LUTON TOWN, welcome visitors today to Hillsboro' have a record of contrasts this season. Until Hull City defeated them last Saturday by 3-0 they had not been defeated at home. On the other hand although they have played eight away matches, they have not won one, but have lost five and drawn three. Whereas they have scored 13 goals at home they have scored but four away.

They are eighth from the bottom of the table at the moment, but are five points better off than Coventry, though only three in hand of the next two clubs, Plymouth and Cardiff.

It was in an effort to improve scoring power that a few weeks ago, the "Hatters" secured George Stobbart from Newcastle. Stobbart is no mean player and did well as a centre-forward, but he has been playing at inside-right with Luton and Walsh has been leading the attack. Stobbart scored four of Luton's five goals against Blackburn Rovers on November 5th.

### INTERNATIONAL GOALKEEPER.

Streton, who used to play for Shrewsbury Town in the Midland League as an amateur, had amateur caps for England at home and on the Continent. This was his first cap as a professional. He had so little to do that at times he was just a spectator.

He is a goalkeeper with a very colourful style and it will be recalled that he played very well in the corresponding match on this ground last season, when Luton forced a goalless draw.

Cooke is a steady defender and is well partnered by Tom Aherne, the Irish International back, whose brother William, by the way, a wing-half-back of Limerick, signed for Luton last August.

Luton's defensive record is useful. In nine home matches only nine goals have been conceded and in the away games 13. A man who has contributed much to Luton's stability is Owen, a very determined centre-half, though that has not always been his position.

During the closed season Luton transferred their inside-forward Bobby Brennan to Birmingham City and Tommy Kernan, well known Scottish forward was also released.

### WHY "DALLY."

"Dally" Duncan is the manager of Luton. He took over when George Martin became manager of Newcastle. Mr. Duncan has played more than one good game on this ground when he was Derby's outside-left. No one needs to be told that he gained International honours for Scotland. Why he was nicknamed "Dally" we have never heard. He never dallied on the field.

Founded in 1885, Luton adopted professionalism in 1891 when they paid their professionals 2/6d. for a home match and 3/- for an away engagement. The players also received pay for lost time up to 12 noon on a Saturday. Half-a-crown buys only a packet of cigarettes these days, but in 1891, 2/6d. was a very useful sum of money, its purchasing power was very nearly worth 7/6d. in comparison with the present time.

In those days, of course, professional football was in its infancy and no one could have visualised the amazing growth of the game and that it would become such a vast business as well as a sport.

They became original members of the Southern Section of the Third Division when it was formed after the first war.

Southern Section champions in 1936-37, they have been in the Second Division ever since. They have very steady support and their "Bobbars" club is well-known for the good work it has done in various directions.


