CLUB NOTES.

Saunders, Secretary of the Supporters' Club, headed a delegation which met the Directors in the Board Room at the Recreation Ground. Various matters of mutual interest were discussed in a very friendly atmosphere. Mr. Harold Shentall, on behalf of the Club, thanked the delegation for the very tangible assistance the Supporters' Club has given to us over the years, and outlined some of the schemes the Directors had in hand for the comfort of our supporters.

OUR VISITORS.

The Luton Town Club was not formed until May, 1885, but it would be wrong to give this year as the commencement of the history of the club, because Luton Town came into being through the amalgamation of the two senior clubs in the town, the Wanderers and Excelsiors.

A great measure of success came their way, and to Luton goes the credit or discredit of being the first club in the South to go over to professional football. This they did in season 1891-92.

Two seasons later, on the formation of the Southern League, Luton Town became one of its leading clubs, and in the first two years of its existence ran second in the League table to Millwall. In 1897 they made application and were admitted to the Second Division of the Football League, but after three seasons they failed to hold their place, and it was not until the formation of the Third Division (Southern Section) in 1920 that we again find Luton Town in League football.

After spending sixteen years in the Southern Section of the League, Luton gained promotion in the 1936-37 season.

WHO'S WHO.

R. SOUTHALL.

"Bobby" Southall, our Right Half-back, is a one club man, and since he joined us as an Amateur in 1939 he has played for no other club.

After leaving school, "Bobby" was employed by the Rotherham Forge and Rolling Mills Co. in their dispatch office, and played football for the works club. He soon showed his paces as a player with good ideas of the game, and was recommended to us. Mr. Bullock lost no time in fixing him up, and he had two games with our Juniors before the war intervened. He continued to play for us in the Sheffield Association League during the early part of the war, came along with leaps and bounds, and in 1943 he was signed as a Professional.

He played several games in the First Team as a half-back, and a great future was visualized for him. Early in season 1945-46 he came into the First Team again as an inside-right at Blackburn when we won 7-1. The following week against Sheffield United he had the misfortune to displace his cartilage, and within a few weeks he was called to the forces. Whilst with the Forces he had his other cartilages displaced and removed, and when he finished his service in 1947 he came back to us as a full-time player. Many a player would have bemoaned his disability, but not so "Bobby." With grit and determination he has overcome any disadvantage the loss of his cartilages caused him, and he is now recognised as our regular right-half. He is a good defender and a whole-hearted club man.
