**TO-DAY'S VISITORS.****FOOTBALL LEAGUE—DIVISION II.**

For our last home League game this afternoon we have as visitors Luton Town with whom our early days as a professional club are associated, when both clubs were members of the old Southern League and the older generation of City supporters will remember the "invasion" of Cardiff of thousands of straw-boaters wearing supporters of the Town whenever the sides met at Ninian Park in those days—hence the sobriquet of "Strawplaiters" by which Luton are known.

The Bedfordshire side this season have to date won 9, drawn 13 and lost 17 of their 39 matches and their lowly position belies the true form shown by the team throughout when on many occasions they have completely outplayed opponents and yet scraped through with a draw or even lost. The attack have scored 52 goals—one more than ourselves—while the defence have yielded 62 goals.

In the corresponding game last season Bernard Streton, Luton's English international goalkeeper, gave a remarkable display and was mainly responsible for gaining a point for his side in a goalless draw. Earlier this season at Luton the score was 1-1.

HERE ARE THE ANSWERS.

1. That of Stamford Bridge in December, 1907. Ten minutes from the end of a First Division game Chelsea led by 3-1, but Bury won by 4-3.

2. "Fanny" Walden (5ft. 2½ins.; 9st. 4lb.) and Sam Brooks (5ft. 4ins; 9st.), who first filled the wing positions in the same match with Tottenham Hotspur in 1922.

3. Only two. William Abbott's 38 goals in 1898-99 still rank as the highest total ever reached for Birmingham City in one season, and the late Robert Whittingham's 30 in 1910-11 still likewise stand as a Chelsea record.

4. Only eight—Aston Villa, Blackburn Rovers, Derby County, Nottingham Forest, Notts County, Preston North End, Sheffield Wednesday, and Wolverhampton Wanderers.

5. That of Hussein Hegazi, a pure Egyptian born in Cairo, whom Fulham introduced to the League as a centre forward in 1911.

6. That created by Stephen Bloomer, Derby County's chief scorer in First Division games in each of the 14 seasons from 1892-93 to 1905-6 inclusive.
