CLUB GOSSIP

After the promising manner in which our team shaped against Hull and Southampton, the defeats by Notts County and Sheffield United came as a disappointment.

Our defeat by four clear goals by Notts County at Meadow Lane was not as bad as it looks on paper. In the first half, it has to be admitted, we did not do too well but the ball did not run kindly for us. Afterwards, although the County had established a two goals lead, there appeared every reason to expect a recovery but shots struck the County woodwork and other scoring chances were missed.

Against our old rivals, Sheffield United, we established a two goals lead inside the first quarter of an hour but, unfortunately, McCormack's injury, sustained in the Southampton game, re-asserted itself and to add to our troubles Baxter sustained a facial injury, which necessitated the insertion of two stitches, while before half-time he received an ankle injury.

Our attack was disorganised, United applied strong pressure and we were forced on defence with the result that we lost a hard and exciting game by the odd goal in seven. Had we had eleven fit men throughout, we feel that we should not have been defeated.

Gate receipts at our practice game were £148 7s. 9d. and this has been allocated to twenty charitable organisations.

OUR VISITORS.

Luton Town, whom we welcome to-night, had a moderate record last season, finishing fourth from the foot of the Second Division table but they are doing much better this season.

They were beaten 3-0 by Sheffield United at Bramall Lane, on Monday, August 20th, but in the return game last Wednesday they took their revenge, winning 2-1, their goals being obtained by Taylor and Stobbart.

On Saturday, they accomplished a good performance in sharing six goals at Leicester, thanks to a "hat trick" by Taylor, whom they obtained from Stockton in February 1949. Fast and direct, Taylor scored a magnificent goal from 25 yards range, headed his second skillfully, and after a quick 40 yards dash got his third goal near the end.

Stobbart was formerly with Newcastle United; goalkeeper Streten has played for England; and Aherne has six Irish international caps.

Last season, Stobbart and Davie were Luton's chief goal scorers, each getting nine.

Luton have a strong half back line and our visitors can be expected to put up a good fight.

Last September at Oakwell we triumphed by 6 goals to one. McCormack scored five goals — one a penalty — and Alex Wright obtained the other. A few days later Wright was transferred to Tottenham Hotspur and last week he joined Bradford, for whom he scored two goals against Wrexham.

On account of his wife's indifferent health, Cecil McCormack has asked to be placed on the transfer list.

His request has been discussed by the Board and will be further considered next week.

KNOW THE GAME.

Here is the law relating to Off-side:—

A player is off-side if he is nearer his opponents' goal line than the ball at the moment the ball is played unless:—

- (a) He is in his own half of the field of play.
- (b) There are two opponents nearer to their own goal-line than he is.
- (c) The ball last touched an opponent or was last played by him.
- (d) He received the ball direct from a goal-kick, a corner kick, a throw-in, or when it is dropped by the referee.

Punishment. For an infringement of this law an indirect free-kick shall be taken by a player of the opposing team from the place where the infringement occurred.

A player in an off-side position shall not be penalised unless, in the opinion of the referee, he is interfering with the play or with an opponent, or is seeking to gain an advantage by being in an off-side position.

Mr. Ernest Dennis, who has been our chairman since the Supporters' Club was formed, has resigned his membership which has been regretfully accepted. He has done excellent work for the club and we are sorry to lose his valuable help and experience.

Barnsley's tall, well built Irish international, had a good grounding in Irish football. He gained two school-boy caps and later played with Linfield and Belfast Celtic in the Irish League. His first International game was against England in 1947. Joining Manchester City he had to alter his style of play to fit in with quicker pace and he improved his ball control.

After a spell with Leeds United, he came to Barnsley just over a year ago and the "big boy" quickly became a favourite with the Oakwell crowd who are always on the look out for his strong bursts.

He was a useful goal-getter in Ireland — he set up records with 57 goals for Larne and 59 for Belfast Celtic — and although he scored only ten goals last season he helped McCormack to establish an Oakwell record.
