## CLUB NOTES.

NOT for many months have the City more worthily gained a point away from home than that they secured from their visit to Nottingham last Saturday. Within 30 seconds of the start of the game we were a goal down, the County in their move on the kick-off scoring without any of our men being able to check or touch the ball before it was in our net and ere some of us had realised play had commenced.

It was a shock, but our lads took this initial blow in fine spirit and immediately set about consolidating a weakness the Notts players had exploited, and for the remainder of play any repetition of the move was ably countered by our defence, in which Charlie Rutter, Alf. Sherwood and Stan Montgomery once more proved outstanding and adding to the high standard they have set themselves as one of the finest defensive trios in League football.

Iorie Hughes and Ken Hollyman both had a good match, while Bill Baker gave one of his classic displays in attack and defence.

Doug. Blair and Mike Tiddy formed an excellent right wing, with Doug. almost pulling off an outright win for us with a brilliant dribble in which he beat four opponents, only to see a grand shot swerve inches wide of the post with the goalkeeper hopelessly beaten.

Wilf. Grant played one of his best games and was unlucky not to break his "away" duck, for on beating Leuty, the County centre-half, in a tackle, he crashed the ball into the net at the moment the referee, who handled the game most efficiently, blew for a foul against the Notts player, but the resultant "free" was cleared by the home side.

Our left flank of George Edwards and Roley Williams contributed their share in a game in which all played with that team spirit that is bound to bring good results.

Stan. Montgomery received the congratulations of all his team mates on scoring our goal, when he headed in a George Edwards corner kick.

Perhaps last Saturday's Combination game with Reading was one of the best we have seen for many seasons. Despite the wretched conditions, with rain falling throughout the 90 minutes, both teams contrived to play grand football and the Biscuitmen did not belie their leadership of the Combination table, in that they played championship-styled soccer only to be denied success by sterling work from Ron. Howells, Ron. Stiffall (his best game since his injury last season), Derrick Sullivan, Harry Parfitt and Don Moss. Griff Norman and Les Evans scored the two goals by which we won this remarkable game, a game worthy of a far greater crowd than braved the elements to attend.

Glyn Williams has made a good recovery from the injury to his ankle and has resumed full training.

### SOCCER QUIZ. HERE ARE THE ANSWERS.

1. In a Second Division match on 28th September, 1947, John Jordan scored for Tottenham Hotspur, following a handling incident by a Doncaster Rovers defender. Doncaster appealed for the award of a penalty-kick against them, but the referee insisted on granting a goal instead.

2. That in which Jack Fairbrother kept goal on Charlton Athletic's ground in three successive seasons—with Preston North End in the fifth round in 1945-46 and sixth in 1946-47, and with Newcastle United in the third in 1947-48.

3. In season 1921-22, William Rawlings was England's centre-forward against Wales and Scotland, and Ernest Simms against Ireland. Rawlings was with Southampton and Simms with Luton Town, and both clubs at the time were in Division III (South).

4. That established when Clapton (Now Leyton) Orient signed 26 new players during the close season of 1933.

5. Frank Crawley, a back transferred from Blackburn Rovers to Lincoln City in 1923. In his first Football League match with Lincoln his knee gave way after 20 minutes, and he never played again.

6. In a Cup-tie at Trent Bridge Notts County were leading Stoke by 1-0 and near the end Hendry, a County back, deliberately fisted the ball out as it was going into goal. The free-kick was cleared and the incident caused a heated controversy which led to the penalty-kick law being introduced soon afterwards.
