

### MANAGER'S MESSAGE—continued

However, there is no point in making excuses. I am not drawing attention to these injuries with that purpose. Our team played well enough to have had three goals lead at half-time. But the Blues—we were in Red—certainly altered their ways in the second half. We still had a good many scoring chances created. Result: a 4—1 defeat.

On Monday evening we played the last of our first team mid-week games at West Ham. We had, of course, to bring in two reserve wingers—a severe handicap to start with. No one seeing the Birmingham game and that at West Ham could have recognised the team as the same.

A very hard and uneven ground, a fair breeze and glaring sun at the end we defended in the first half made good football difficult.

Young Ron Burbeck, playing in his first League match, gave a very promising show in the first half. Afterwards he was rather overpowered. Nevertheless, there are good possibilities in the young R.A.F. boy.

We had a perfectly good goal from Derek Hines disallowed, Rowley being adjudged in an offside position that made him interfering with the play. This, without doubt, could have had a big bearing on the eventual course of a game, which ended with our defeat by 4—1.

Three of our opponents' goals came in the last 12 minutes, during which time Rowley notched one from the spot for a foul on Peter Small.

It is my firm contention that when a team is losing it should, if possible, make an all-out effort to retrieve the situation. This is apt to leave the defence wide open at times, and so a defeat which could have been minimised, say to 2—1, can be made to look worse at the final whistle. But the gamble can also have far different and happier results.

In my last notes I expressed concern at the attitude of some spectators towards the reserve team. I was delighted to learn that at the Brentford game on Monday evening the boys were given every encouragement and responded with a very good show.



When not playing soccer, Stan enjoys a game of golf and he is fond of carpentry. He also follows closely the performances of his cousin, Jackie Milburn, of Newcastle United fame.



## LUTON FOOTBALL CLUB

Meetings between Luton Town and ourselves unfailingly recall those memorable Cup matches of 1949 and will go on doing so for many years to come.

What football and what thrills those contests produced! And what goals! Eighteen of them—ten at Luton, where Jack Lee equalised for us in the last minute of extra time, and eight more on the teams meeting again at Filbert Street.

Both clubs can look back on those "cricket-score" matches proudly, for, in the midst of a rapidly-changing lead and with spectators finding the excitement a big strain, the players kept their heads magnificently.

The history of Luton Town dates back to 1885 when the two local clubs, Wanderers and Excelsior, joined forces.

In their efforts to popularise soccer in their district, Luton were among the pioneers of football professionalism in Southern England, although, of course in those days, more than 60 years ago, the payments were modest compared with present remuneration.

Luton first gained membership of the Football League in 1897, but their third season in Division II was a rather lean one for them. They could muster only 18 out of a maximum 68.

Succeeding years found them waging a campaign, with many colourful features, in the old Southern League until the extension of the Football League after the first world war.

Then they joined the Southern Section of Division III, were runners-up to Coventry City in 1935-6 and went one better to also gain the promotion prize a year later.

## OUR VISITORS

**BERNARD STRETEN (Goalkeeper).** Capped by England as an amateur and also won a full cap when England beat Ireland by 9-2 in 1949. A product of Norfolk junior football and formerly assisted Notts County and Shrewsbury Town as an amateur.

**SEAMUS DUNNE (Right-back).** Came from Shelbourne, the League of Ireland club. In his third season with Luton.

**TOM AHERNE (Left-back).** A native of Limerick and secured by Luton from Linfield in 1949. Has represented both Ireland and Eire on a number of occasions.

**ROBERT MORTON (Right-half).** Born in Buckinghamshire and one of Luton's local "finds".

**SYDNEY OWEN (Centre-half).** A Birmingham boy, who had his first experience in League football as wing-half for Birmingham City. Since his transfer to Luton in 1947, he has toured Australia with the F.A. team.

**CHARLES WATKINS (Left-half).** A native of Glasgow, he realised the much-cherished Scottish ambition of playing for the famous Rangers. Joined Luton in 1948.

**WALTER SHANKS (Wing-half or inside-forward).** Started as a wing-forward for Luton, after a month's trial, and has since played in a number of different positions. Formerly on Chelsea's books.

**MICHAEL CULLEN (Outside-right).** Secured from the Scottish junior ranks, on the recommendation of the club's former captain, Gardiner. Aged 20 and in his first season as a full pro.

**GORDON TURNER (Inside-right).** Son of a former Hull City outside-left. Signed as right-half, but developed as an inside-forward, scoring five goals in the first four matches this season.

**BERNARD MOORE (Centre-forward).** A product of Brighton junior football, whose success as a goalgetter for Hastings led to Luton securing him in 1950-1.

**JESSE PYE (Inside-left).** A Yorkshireman and first capped by England when a Notts County player. Secured further international distinction when playing for Wolves and also a Cup Final medal in 1949. Scored two of their three goals against us at Wembley. Joined Luton this year.

**ALBERT MITCHELL (Outside-left).** A native of Stoke and in turn played for Stoke City, Blackburn Rovers, Kettering Town and Northampton Town before going to Luton.




