IT WAS a pity that Town's first defeat of the season should have to happen at Leeds Road, but they have a chance this afternoon to redeem themselves before their own supporters—that is, if "redemption" is really necessary. Our view is that it is not.

The team did extraordinarily well in the hurly burly of Second Division football to play ten games without defeat—their longest unbeaten run since 1926—and their failure against Nottingham Forest last week, while it was disappointing for their followers, was not one that should disturb the players.

\* \* \*

Throughout it was "anybody's game" and Forest, with fewer chances but dangerous when they got away, deserve credit for being able to

clinch it with ten minutes left, especially since the winning goal came from their injured full-back, Whare, then playing at centre-forward. Our congratulations, then, to Mr. Billy Walker's men on being the first to "bag" our scalp! We shall be out to avenge this defeat when we visit the fair city of Nottingham next February.

Town, on the run of the play, ought not, of course, to have lost last Saturday. They were not, it is true, at their best—that early goal by Capel unsettled the defence a little—but on the other hand they did not have much luck with some of their scoring efforts. Metcalfe, in sparkling form again, and Watson, usually ready with a shot, both hit the framework of the goal and once or twice

shots were stopped by defenders on the goal-line. But these things do happen in Soccer, as do the missed chances and the clever saves made by Walker, the Forest goalkeeper, and on the whole luck levels itself out.

For the moment we have surrendered the leadership of the Second Division to Sheffield United but they have played a match more and we still have the best record for eleven games, with fifteen points, only one defeat and a goal average of 21—9.

This afternoon we doff hats to Luton Town, who are newcomers to Leeds Road, though Manager Duncan may have happy memories of visits here. We also have a link with Luton in Willie Davie, who was transferred from one Town to another Town last season. Last Saturday the Hatters gained their first away win of the season when they won 3—1 at Southampton. The week before, at home, they had chalked up five goals against Notts County.

Jesse Pye, former Wolves inside forward, whose name was linked with Town at one time and who, of course, is no stranger to Leeds Road, has been one of the shooting stars in this scoring revel, which has brought Luton's goals-for column up to 19 (they have conceded sixteen) and their League position up to mid-table, with a point-per-match average

Nevertheless, we expect our Town, without a win since they beat Doncaster Rovers here on September 17th, to finish on top.

Town Reserves followed up their creditable home draw in mid-week with Wolverhampton Reserves, Central League Champions, with an even better performance at Goodison Park last Saturday, when they drew 3—3.

## Bill Carter Introduces

### LUTON TOWN.

STRETEN, B.—*Goalkeeper.*  
Was England's goalkeeper at Maine Road in 1949, when Ireland were thrashed 9-2. That was his only representative appearance, though he has given consistent service to Luton since 1948, when he joined them after assisting Nottingham County and Shrewsbury Town as an amateur.

DUNNE, S.—*Right-back.* Has proved a sound defender during the revival which has brought Luton five points from their three most recent matches—two of them on foreign soil. Had 16 League engagements last term.

AHERNE, T.—*Left-back.* Born in Limerick, he left Linfield for Kenilworth Road in 1949, and has impressed many clubs. Missed only one Second Division outing last year. Has been chosen at different times by both Ireland and Eire.

MORTON, R. H.—*Right-half.* A local product, Bob scored two goals in 28 Second Division appearances in 1951-52, after having been selected for 24 first-team games in the previous campaign.

OWEN, S.—*Centre-half.* Succeeded as the Town pivot, Gager who was here a week ago with Notts Forest. Luton recruited Sid from Birmingham, for whom he was a left-half. The F.A. trip to Australia in 1951 was his reward for sound service

SHANKS, W.—*Left-half.* Was born in Malta. Chelsea was his first League side. From Stamford Bridge he moved to Luton, with whom he has had 52 League games in the last two seasons.

DAVIES, R. A.—*Outside-right*. Will be keen to secure his first League goal for the Town. Was limited to five League matches in 1951-52.

MOORE, B.—*Inside-right*.

Eight goals in 20 games was his haul last Winter, when he was in his second year with Luton, who took him from Hastings for whom his scoring penchant was a distinct asset.

PYE, J.—*Centre-forward*.

Twelve months ago there were indications that Jesse, then with Wolves, might come to Leeds Road. But he declined the opportunity—Hassall was lined up to go to Molyneux—and was transferred to Luton during

the Summer. With his new colleagues he has claimed five goals, including 4 in the last two games.

WATKINS, C.—*Inside-left*.

Rangers sponsored his advancement as a left-half, but Luton, who acquired him four years ago, prefer him in the attack.

MITCHELL, A. J.—*Outside-left*

His 16 goals in 41 League matches last season stamped him as one of the Division's most assertive wingers. He has not yet opened his account for this season. If he does so this afternoon he will be the first extreme raider to penetrate the Town defence this time.


