



## CLUB NOTES

ALTHOUGH we finished well on the losing side at Huddersfield, last Saturday, our lads in no way disgraced themselves, for very few teams will come away from Leeds Road this season with any tangible reward for their efforts. Huddersfield Town this season are a vastly different proposition than they have been these last few years, and on top of this we met them in one of their business-like moods, with the half backs never once allowing our forwards to get hold of the ball properly, so quick was their tackling and so keen. Vic Metcalf, their outside left, was in International form, never wasted a ball and though Seamus Dunne tried all he knew to put a stop to this danger, he never once wrested the initiative from Metcalf so well did he play. It is a long, long time since we came up against anyone anywhere approaching this classical display. Our lads earned nothing but praise for their brave showing against odds and left many friends behind them in Yorkshire.

We are called on this afternoon to meet the present leaders of the Second Division and the way both our teams are now playing, a thoroughly interesting afternoon's sport should be the outcome of this meeting. The United have the edge on our last week's opponents by one point, but have played one more match than they, so that the "Blades" will be very anxious to try and keep their leading position at our expense this afternoon. They are playing exceedingly well this season, for as well as Jimmy Hagan still playing as well as ever and, if anything, a little more craftily, they have Eire prospect Alf Ringstead still doing his stuff on the right wing and Derek Hawkesworth on the other wing, fully aided and abetted by Len Browning in the middle. It is a combination which will pierce most defences this season and our lads will do well if they can keep our "goals against" column from being increased today. The "Blades" defence is also very strong, with that very good custodian Ted Burgin still knocking at the door for International honours. When we last met here we ran out winners by the odd goal in three and we still remember very vividly the great game Charlie Watkins had that day against Jimmy Hagan, which fact had a big bearing on our win. We hope Charlie will have as good a game today in his new position at inside forward.

The Stiffs go from strength to strength, five more goals being added to their aggregate when they met Swindon Town here last Wednesday afternoon. The surprising thing of this match was that despite it being a lovely day and the opportunity was there for many people not able to see a professional

football match on a Saturday to see a successful team in action on a day when they can attend, there were only 796 people present to see this win. Considering all the circumstances we did expect to see at least the thousand mark reached, but it was not to be. It was a match well worth seeing, if only for the glorious goal scored by Hugh McJarrow halfway through the first half when by sheer football skill he beat several of the visitors to flash in a shot from the edge of the penalty box which the Swindon goalie just had not an earthly of preventing entering the net. A very fine effort and well applauded by the few spectators who had the fortune to see it. It was good to see Gordon Turner in action again after almost a month's absence and to see his usual nicely taken goal. It was also pleasing to see Ron Baynham's return to confidence after his absence due to injury. Only once last Wednesday did he go up for a high cross and not be successful, and this was due to being nudged off the ball at the critical moment. The Stiffs have now scored 49 goals in fifteen matches, and have not suffered defeat. Those of you who were here last Saturday, must have been impressed by the very good quality of the football seen and there have been many pleasing remarks passed about it. We hope to see at least as many here next Saturday afternoon when we play Crystal Palace Reserves to help the lads feel that their efforts to please the spectators as well as to win their matches is appreciated and well supported.

Also on Saturday next, kick-off 11 a.m., there will be a match here between Luton Schoolboys and Barnet Schoolboys in the Second Round of the English Schools' Shield. Last Saturday, the Luton Boys beat South East Beds. Boys at Biggleswade by six clear goals, while the Barnet Boys received a bye. If our lads get through this hurdle successfully they will again be playing here, probably against Peterborough Boys. Believe us these Boys are always worth watching and we hope there will be quite a good turn-out to see them on the trail and try to emulate their splendid record of last season's successful run.

The fact that we have not had a Boys' Entrance to the Bobbers Stand has been under consideration some little time, but the trouble was that there seemed no place for one. However we have at length been able to arrange one, which is at the Maple Road entrances. Boys therefore wishing to enter the Bobbers Stand must pay at this entrance and parents bringing their children and wishing to stand with them in the Bobbers Stand are asked to enter the Stand by the turnstiles next to this entrance. It is regretted that it is quite impossible to arrange any other Boys' Entrance to the Bobbers Stand due to lack of facilities.

### THE COVERMAN

#### Thomas (Bud) Aherne

Bud has been and is one of the most successful Full Backs ever to emerge from the Southern part of the Green Isle. He signed professional forms for Limerick City in 1943, was transferred to Belfast Celtic in 1945, moving on to Luton Town in March, 1949. Has played for his Country in every International match during the last three seasons, having obtained 20 International Caps so far. Is being watched

today with a view of again being selected to play for his Country against France, in Dublin, on the 16th November next. Missed only one League match all last season, and this because he had been again selected to play for Eire. His keen positional sense and beautiful kicking of the ball is appreciated by all who see him play. Is in the unenviable position this afternoon of playing against a fellow countryman, who is also being watched by the selectors, for the above mentioned game. The duel will be watched with interest.


