Defeats at the hands of Plymouth Argyle and Leeds United were very unpalatable and keep us at the foot of the Second Division table.

After our convincing victory over Hull City, which was the result of splendid team work, we could be forgiven for hoping that the tide had turned, but alas! practically the same eleven gave a most disappointing display and once again Argyle proved to be our "bogey team."

It was very difficult to believe that a team could show such a marked falling off. These surprise results may be the spice of football but unfortunately we seem to be fated to be the sufferers!

At Elland Road, our inside forwards never got together. The good work of Kaye was one bright spot but it was not taken advantage of by his colleagues, and Leeds United scored four times against our overworked defence.

Six points from 12 games is a very poor yield and there is no getting away from the fact that we are in a very parlous position. To make matters worse, we cannot plead narrow defeats. On five occasions our defence has conceded three goals, Leeds United registered four and earlier Huddersfield Town rubbed in half-a-dozen.

TO-DAY'S VISITORS.

Luton Town, whom we welcome to-day, defeated Sheffield United last Saturday by four goals to one. Their scorers were Watkins, Moore, Pye and Mitchell (penalty). Here are pen-pictures of our opponents :—

Bernard Streten (goal)—Not very big but a grand goalkeeper. Agile and competent. Gained amateur caps before going to Luton five years ago, and played for England in 1949.

“Bud” Aherne (right back)—Has six Irish international caps. Very reliable and good with either foot. Left Linfield for Luton three years ago.

S. Dunne (left back)—Another Irishman who got a regular place last season and has kept it by consistent displays.

Bob Morton (right half)—A local discovery and a tireless worker.

Syd Owen (centre half)—Formerly with Notts Forest. A “B” international and among the best centre halves in the Second Division. Not merely a stopper : makes constructive clearances.

Wally Shanks (left half or inside left)—Born, Malta. Played for Chelsea before joining Luton.

R. A. Davies (outside right or left)—Fast and clever. A danger to opposing defences.

Bernard Moore (inside right)—Developed as a centre forward with Brighton and Hove Juniors. Cost Luton £4,000 from Hastings two years ago. Well built and speedy.

Jesse Pye (inside forward)—Rotherham born, was given a free transfer by Sheffield United just before the war. Fast, constructive and possesses a hard shot. Played for Notts County, was in the England team against Belgium in 1945-6 and soon afterwards moved to Wolverhampton. Scored twice when Wolves beat Leicester City in the 1949 Cup Final, and played for England against Eire in 1950.

Charlie Watkins (inside left or left half)—Developed with Glasgow Rangers and went to Luton in 1948. Like Aherne, missed only one game last season.

Bert Mitchell (outside left) — Gained experience with Stoke, Blackburn and Northampton Town. A useful winger who scored 16 goals last season.


