CLUB NOTES

WE have now obtained thirteen points out of the last eight matches, scoring 22 goals against 9, in this remarkable run of success. It is indeed a splendid achievement, especially when it is seen that five of those games were away from home. Even Huddersfield, the present leaders cannot boast a better record, for in their last eight matches they have obtained 12 points, and five of those fixtures were at Leeds Road. Our lads therefore have cause to be proud of their run of success and if the feeling in the camp is anything to go by then that run is going to continue. There is not a happier or more contented set of lads in the country and while there is that happy spirit success will follow. The result of the match at Hull, last Saturday, was a splendid example of the team spirit prevailing. Many a team would have gone under against the fury of the Hull attack in the first half hour when absolutely everything was done to break through our defence to give their team that confidence which is so markedly missing at the moment. But our lads stood resolute, everybody helped everybody else, and then when the fury had spent itself the forwards came into their own and were able to give the defence a well-earned breather. They were two very well-earned points and taking the game right through well deserved. The result certainly sent the best crowd we have had at a Reserve game for some little time, home in a happy state of mind, particularly coming on top of the enjoyable game they had been witnessing, when our young side continued their record-breaking success in the Football Combination League. We are informed that such a run of nineteen games without defeat is almost certainly a record in the history of the Football Combination, and indeed also of the London Combination. The team spirit in this Reserve side is something too of which we are justly proud.

Blackburn Rovers, our visitors today and whom we are very pleased to see again at Kenilworth Road, are not having a very good run just at the moment. Of their away record they have lost 6, beaten Notts Forest and drawn at Swansea, having scored 8 goals against 20. Mention of Sid Owen reminds us that he has again been chosen to play at Centre Half for an F.A. XI against Cambridge University at Cambridge on Thursday, November 27th. It is nice to feel that Sid's consistent good displays are not being overlooked altogether by the powers that be.
