CLUB NOTES

OUR very good run of successes came to an end at Nottingham, last Saturday, when we lost by the odd goal in seven, but it was a game we might easily have won for there were several chances which were not accepted. It was a very good match which held its interest for the spectator right to the end, but although Bert Mitchell did reduce the arrears three minutes from the end there was not time to improve on it. Certainly the better football came from the Luton lads and everybody was pleased with their display for at times their football was a treat to watch. There was the unusual sight in the first half of one or two of our lads playing the ball several times before parting, but in the second half resumed their normal game of pushing it through first time which made them a much more potent force. However we cannot expect to win every match but it could be seen why we hold our present position in the Table and on this display it will be maintained, for we shall play much worse and yet win.

Before leaving the Nottingham match we must apologise for the wrong scores given over the loudspeakers last Saturday on two occasions. We gave the scores out as we received them and, of course, believed them to be correct, following a method which has been in use a number of years. However we are making arrangements to try and improve on this method and we trust there will be no more wrong announcements. It must have been very disappointing to those of you who left the ground thinking we had drawn level after being two goals in arrear and trust you will accept our apologies for this unfortunate occurrence.

We extend a hearty welcome to Everton this afternoon and trust the weather is much improved on the conditions prevailing when these Notes were being penned. The "Toffemen" are finding the going this season so far very sticky for they have to go back to October 25th for their last win, when they beat West Ham at Everton by two goals to nil. They drew at home last week with Leeds United two goals each, but lost their previous home match, with Rotherham United, by the only goal scored. Of the nine away matches Everton have played to date maximum points have been obtained from Barnsley and Brentford, while they have played a draw with Southampton and Swansea Town. Altogether Everton have scored 28 goals in the 17 matches played to date but they can crack the ball at times for it was only two months ago when they registered seven against Doncaster Rovers. Injuries have had a lot to do with their present position for

they were looked upon as promotion aspirants at the beginning of the season, and for today's match three of their recognised first team players—Fielding, Parker and Donovan—are very doubtful starters. To have three such players looking on is a headache for any team manager but at the same time we ourselves know only too well what this means. We remember vividly Fielding's display against us here last season and no doubt such a forceful player is sadly missed in the Everton forward line. Nevertheless we can be assured of a very entertaining game and may the spoils go to the side most worthy of them.

Everton did even better than ourselves recently when they consented to release three of their players to take part in the Eire v. France International match at Dublin. Considering their predicament due to injuries this was a magnificent gesture which was much appreciated by the Eire Officials and all connected with this great game.

We are very sorry indeed to record the passing of our own Fred Hawkes, who played for Luton Town from 1901 to 1920, apart from the First War interval, when he guested for Millwall. He was a native of Luton, playing first with Christ Church School Boys, on to a Club called the Stanley, then on to Luton Reserves and once in the senior side formed with Bob Hawkes and Fred White, a most powerful half-back line. Although not very big, he was only 5ft. 6½ ins., he was a great player and his coolness and distribution of the ball was always a joy to behold. It is very sad indeed to see these old stalwarts passing on but we can, and do, reverse his memory.

Another honour was paid to Luton Town this week when the Football Association selected three of our players to take part in their annual match with Cambridge University. Sid Owen, Bernard Stretten and Gordon Turner were asked to play and although the F.A. XI were never really extended our three players all played their part well, Gordon Turner scoring three of his side's eight goals, although in the unusual position of Inside Left.

It was nice to see the Schoolboys win their way through to the Divisional Finals here last Saturday morning when they beat Peterborough Boys by three clear goals. Considering the conditions the lads played very well and are to be congratulated on the way they adapted themselves. The outstanding player on the field was Michael Eells, who played a real captain's part. Well played lads and here's wishing you all further success.


