

CLUB NOTES

OUR luck still holds for the draw of the F.A. Cup for we again were first out of the hat, having as our opponents that very colourful Cup fighting team Blackburn Rovers. Although they were having a very poor time last season, in their Second Division fixtures they played magnificently in their Cup matches and it took the winners themselves Newcastle United, all their time to beat them in the Semi-Final. Again this season, so far, Blackburn are experiencing a thin time in the League, and we soundly thrashed them only a month ago on this ground by six clear goals, but we have no illusion that when we meet them again, on January 10th, they will be a vastly different proposition. Certainly if we can again beat them in so convincing a manner in the Cup competition we shall have grounds for thinking we have a team good enough to meet any other team in the country.

In our last ten matches we have scored 34 goals, 14 against, 16 points and these 14 against include the seven scored by Huddersfield and Notts. Forest in our two defeats during that time. It is a remarkable run of success and the lads, having settled down to a nicely balanced side, can confidently be expected to continue the good work. With our next three matches all at home, although against such formidable opposition, should see us even better placed in the Table than we are at present.

We think we are right in saying that never in the history of the Club have both the First and Second Teams been prevented by the weather from playing on the same day as was their experience last Saturday. It must have been very disappointing for those of you who made the journey to Griffin Park only to find your worst fears confirmed, and the lads themselves were very disappointed too for with such a magnificent following they are sure they would have justified the confidence shown in them. As it happened it may be just as well the fog did prevent the teams having to play for the ground itself was treacherous and there may have been some bad injuries as a result. Our pitch was in even worse plight, thick snow and solid ice covering the whole ground. Last Monday, all the Players and the Ground Staff set to with a will with the help of a snow plough and got it all heaped up ready for carting away on the following day. By noon on the Tuesday no one would have believed they were looking at the same ground as on the Monday morning, and we are very grateful to the lads for the way in which they set about this task. It was very nice to see the cheerful way in which they tackled this unusual (for them) job, but the spirit between these lads is wonderful and so pleased are the Board about it that all the Players and Staff, with wives, were entertained to Luncheon and Dinner, with a matinee at a leading London Theatre, on Wednesday last, as a mark of appreciation of this fine spirit. It is this feeling which has had a lot to do with our success this season and we are very grateful to the lads for it. The spirit in the Dressing Rooms has

always been good here, but the present feeling has never been surpassed.

We have the pleasure of a visit from Doncaster today but we are sorry to say that the inclusion of that great football personality, Player-Manager Peter Doherty, is very doubtful. He has been suffering these past two weeks from the flu' which is still keeping him under Doctor's orders, so the match unfortunately will be lacking his personality and the Doncaster side will therefore be playing under a severe handicap, for although Peter might be well enough to be present at the match he cannot be the same force from the touchline as on the field of play. Since November 1st, Doncaster have lost at Leicester 4-2, drawn at home with West Ham 1 each and Leeds 0 each, won away at Fulham 3-1, and won at home against Rotherham 2-1. In those last 6 matches, therefore, they have scored 8 goals against 7, points 7, which is an improvement on a very shaky start. They are a hard working side with a very strong defence, with Irish International Bill Graham a tower of strength.

The Luton Schoolboys did well last week when they beat Watford Schoolboys by three clear goals to enter the last 32 teams for the English Schools' Shield, for the second year running. They were beaten by Cambridge Boys last year by a solitary goal scored in the last few seconds after having all the play. We all in Luton sincerely hope these lads will go on to even better things this year and perhaps make history. The competition from now on, of course, is hard but these youngsters are playing very well and it will take a very good team to beat them. We wish them further success in their efforts.

After much consideration—for whatever scheme we adopt for the distribution of Cup Tie tickets causes some discontent—we have decided for the F.A. Cup match with Blackburn that each Season Ticket Holder be entitled to one ticket for his own seat and the rest of the tickets to be on sale on Saturday, December 27th, when the Reserves play Ipswich Reserves. Each person passing through the turnstiles at that match may purchase if he so wishes, one ticket for the Blackburn match until all are sold or if not all sold then the rest will be on sale at the Reserve match with Watford Reserves the following Saturday, January 3rd. Already we have received applications from near and far, one in fact from Plymouth, but they will all be returned, including applications from Coach firms for large parties. In this latter case for instance we are aware of the difficulties, especially if a regular coach is booked each week, but once we start trying to satisfy one Coach firm all the others expect the same treatment and we must therefore treat all alike. It is hard on the regulars we know, but from experience we find it is the only way. We are ticketing only the Centre Stand, Wing Stand and Standing Enclosure, which will all be at normal League prices, as will also the Bobbers Stand and Terraces. We trust that each one of you who attends on Saturday, December 27th, will be able to obtain a ticket, but we can only repeat that these will only be available so long as the supply lasts.

THE COVERMAN
Gordon Reginald Turner

Gordon Turner was born in Hull, June, 1930. Played for Doncaster Schoolboys, 1944/45, moving on to Doncaster Rovers Nursery Team, 1946/47. Called up December, 1947, joining the Navy, where his prowess as a footballer was soon spotted. Played regularly for his Station Unit and selected to play for Air Command (Fleet Air Arm) versus Hampshire League, at Newport (I.o.W.) in December, 1949. Signed Amateur Forms for Luton Town, December, 1948, his first game being at Coventry, for the Reserves, at Outside Right, but although in an

unaccustomed position it was seen there was good football ability. Demobbed December, 1949, and after a few games signed Professional Forms for Luton, March, 1950. Scored 4 goals for First Team last season and 2 in F.A. Cup. The one he scored against Charlton Athletic, by which we won the match, will always be remembered by those who saw it. This season so far has scored 6 goals in 6 First Team appearances and 14 goals in the Combination League side in 10 appearances. Was selected to play for F.A. XI versus Cambridge University, at Cambridge, last month, when he scored 3 goals from the Inside Left position. Undoubtedly a player with a future.
