CLUB NOTES

WE sincerely trust you all had a very happy and most enjoyable Christmas, and that you are all feeling on top of the world. Particularly do we hope you will all be in this frame of mind when the final whistle has blown this afternoon, for this match is a very important one to us and we do want a nice win to keep us well in the running. Of all the nice Xmas boxes you, the supporters, have received perhaps two points today will be as welcome as any of them.

The two points we picked up on Saturday last, against Plymouth were very well earned, although they were obtained by an only goal, scored by Roy Davies, his second of the season. That we were fully worthy of both points we think all of you who saw the match will agree, and with any luck at all would have won by a much bigger margin for the way the Argyle's goal escaped at times was just as miraculous as against Doncaster the previous Saturday. We are glad to report that Wally Shanks' injury is not as serious as at first thought but his appearance today was rather doubtful at the time these Notes were being prepared. We do know however that if he possibly can without weakening the side Wally will be on view here this afternoon. Considering the conditions both sides are to be congratulated on the game they played and how they kept it up for the whole ninety minutes speaks volumes for their training and enthusiasm. Again taking into consideration the weather, we think the attendance of 13,055 was quite good, and compared most favourably with other grounds. We are experiencing a most unhappy sequence of bad weather for first team matches, which is a great pity for the lads were playing some wonderful football on the firmer surface, and of course the bad weather has made a big difference to our gates. We feel if we can keep well in the running during this bad weather we shall have a very good chance of having to be reckoned with when the final positions in the Table are being worked out.

The Stiffs put up another good show last Saturday, at Bristol, when they beat the Rovers by 5 goals to 3. Considering we were twice in arrears during the match the final result speaks well for the football ability of these youngsters as well as for the team spirit. We were very pleased to see that Billy Cooke played very well in this match and happily has lost none of his skill. When the lads found themselves on the wrong side by 3 goals to 2, they threw everything into attack, all five forwards attacking supported by the Wing Halves, and this policy proved the best in the long run. It was a most exciting match, and everyone who saw it certainly had their money's worth.

We welcome Leeds United to Kenilworth Road today, and we have the prospect of meeting them again tomorrow at Leeds in the return match. Both teams are leaving for Leeds almost immediately after this match, and as the Leeds party had to travel yesterday it has not been a very nice Christmas for them. THE COVERMAN—Bernard John Moore

Bernard Moore was born at Brighton, December, 1923. Played for Brighton Intermediate School for 3 seasons, chosen to play for Brighton Schoolboys when 14, but at Right Half. Continued to play in Brighton local football, and was playing for Brighton Juniors when they won the Sussex County (War) League in 1945. Signed professional forms for Brighton 1946, being called up the same year, when he was sent out to Singapore. Played for his Station out there, being selected to play for the Combined Services and for the Singapore State. Upon being demobbed in 1948 when a Sergeant in the R.A.F.,

they get home again to their families. It is the lot of a footballer at these festive times but why the fixtures cannot be arranged to pair with local teams at holiday times is something we cannot understand.

Leeds beat Huddersfield Town by 2 goals to 1 at Elland Road last Saturday, and from all accounts were good value for their money. Since they put John Charles at Centre Forward they seem to have gone from strength to strength, although it is noticed that they have yet to win their first away match this season, but this is offset to some extent by the fact that they have drawn no less than seven times away from home. Although we have won away on three occasions we have only obtained one more point than Leeds for we have drawn away only twice. Below are pen portraits of the Leeds team who are hoping to take the field this afternoon.

Scott (Goalkeeper) John is in his third year with the United Club. Was signed in May, 1950 as a professional, having previously had two years service with Workington F.C.

Dunn (Right Back) Jim is Rutherglen born and joined Leeds from the Glencairn Club. In 1947 moved south and his service since then has been consistent and whole hearted.

Hair (Left Back) A Major Buckley discovery who made his debut in League Soccer while still in his teens—a system which the Leeds boss has instituted with much success in the past!

Kerfoot (Right Half) Several Clubs were interested in this talented Wing Half who was playing for Stalybridge Celtic. He joined Leeds in 1949, at a fee of £3,000.

McCabe (Centre Half) Has recently been playing Wing Half for United but took over the Centre Half berth upon John Charles' move into the forward line.

Burden (Left Half) Tom is Andover born and acquired soccer experience with Chester F.C. He liked the idea of joining the United Club and signed in 1948, and appointed Captain.

Meek (Outside Right) One of the good "little uns." George is 5ft. 4ins. tall and weighs around 9st. 6lbs., but his light weight measurements provide no obstacle to him. Was spotted playing for Hamilton Academicals.

Nightingale (Inside Right) Albert has been with four senior Clubs in the space of the last four years. Developed with Sheffield United. Started his travels by moving to Huddersfield in March, 1948.

Charles (Centre Forward) Some say a waste of great talent playing John at Centre Forward. Has proved once again the old axiom that a good player can do his stuff anywhere.

Iggleden (Inside Left) Able to occupy either Inside Forward positions; he was signed by United from Leicester City in 1949.

Tyrer (Outside Left) 6ft., 12st. signed from Mossley, September 8th, 1950, born Manchester, February 1931.

joined Hastings United F.C. and in the three seasons he was with them scored 144 goals in 136 appearances. We watched him play several times during 1951 and in the match which decided us to sign him Bernard scored 5 goals against Headington United in the Southern League. Has scored 11 goals in 18 appearances so far this season, and will undoubtedly score many more before the present season draws to a close. Bernard's greatest thrill on the field to date was when he scored the first goal conceded by the Arsenal in last season's F.A. Cup matches when we met in the 6th Round at Luton.


