



CLUB NOTES

THE match played at Bramall Lane last Saturday was described by many who saw it as the best played there for some little time. It was indeed a game which had everything, good football, excitement right away through and particularly in the closing eleven minutes after Gordon Turner had opened the scoring. We certainly shook the confidence of the leaders by our clever football, and if only one or two chances had been accepted we would have brought two well-deserved points home with us instead of just the one. After our fall from grace those last three Saturdays in February—what a disastrous month that was for us—it was most refreshing to see the way in which this re-arranged team tackled their job at Sheffield, playing as if they had been together all the season. Everyone of them played extremely well, and the few of you who made the journey were well rewarded we feel for your trouble in making the trip and watching our lads confounding the critics.

And many critics there were, even amongst some of the spectators on their way to Kenilworth Road to see our Reserves in action against Northampton Reserves. One such critic was heard to say very loudly, with all the authority of one who knows, that we should lose by six goals at least at Sheffield, "with that team." We are all entitled to our own opinions of course as to what should be, it would be a very dull affair if it were not so, but we feel more confidence in our players' abilities ought to be shown, particularly in view of the very successful season we have had the pleasure of witnessing. It has been a most trying time lately due to excessive injuries suddenly cropping up, necessitating positional changes and promotion for some players from the Reserves. As it turned out the changes were not a success, but they might easily have been as successful as those made for last Saturday's game. Apart from the actual goal-scoring our lads held their own, and even against Huddersfield it was only two half-chances they had from which they scored that we had to admit defeat. We still have an outside chance of gaining promotion this season, for both Sheffield United

and Huddersfield have very stiff programmes to complete and anything may yet happen. But for goodness sake don't go about saying Luton do not want promotion. The "know alls" have been going about lately telling everybody this, but it simply is not true. The players themselves are very disappointed and it will not be for the want of trying if they are yet to fail in this quest. The Directors certainly want it, for it is an honour they would dearly like to bring to the town of Luton, First Division football, so where these people who know everything get their information just beats us hollow. Believe us when we say there is simply no truth whatsoever in such silly rumours.

Our visitors today are from Barnsley and we are very sorry to note that they hold a most unenviable position at the moment at the bottom of the Table. It looks on paper an almost foregone conclusion that they will not be able to extricate themselves from that position, for they are 7 points below the present third from bottom Club, having played one more game than they, with only ten more matches to play. Barnsley have had the misfortune of being without a Manager most of the season, for Mr. Angus Seed has been an ill man for some little time, but even then his sudden death last month came as a great and most unpleasant surprise to us all. No doubt the absence of such a capable man at the helm has had a most unsettling effect on the team, and we at Luton will miss the cheerful personality of Mr. Seed in our Board Room today.

It must not be taken for granted however that today's result is a foregone conclusion, for this new Barnsley team can fight with great tenacity, as was shown at Oakwell last Saturday, when, despite the fact that they were two goals in arrears against Leeds United, fought back most courageously and in the end obtained a good point. We also remember most vividly their storming finish against us at Barnsley last October when, only 10 minutes from the end we were enjoying a three goals lead, only to find ourselves in the closing minutes with only a goal to the good and having to fight most tenaciously to finish on the winning side. Most assuredly they will fight every inch of the way today and so we can expect a good fight.

Terence William John Kelly

Terry Kelly was born in Luton on the 16th January, 1932. Played for Old Bedford Road School, from 1943 until 1946, his team winning the Schoolboys' League 1945/46 undefeated. On leaving school joined Park Rangers in Luton and District Youth League, helping them to win the Beds. Minor Cup and League in season 1947/48. Was skipper in that Cup Final, playing at inside left and scoring a hat trick. Was also Captain

of the County Youth Team in 1948. Joined Vauxhall Motors in 1949, playing for them in the Spartan League, signed professional forms for Luton Town on 19th April, 1950. Called on Active Service in June, 1950, when he played for his Station and the Command at both football and cricket. Also plays cricket for Luton Town C.C.
