

CLUB NOTES

THREE points out of the five games we have played so far this season is certainly not promotion form and our efforts up to now have proved most disappointing, especially as we began with even higher hopes than usual that this was to be our promotion season. There is still plenty of time of course in which to make up lost ground and certainly we are not in any way getting panicky about the position but a great opportunity has been lost of getting off to a flying start, and the battle to get back into a challenging position is thereby made all the harder.

All last season only two clubs scored a double against us, and yet here we are with one chalked up against us already. There is no gain saying that the Forest should have been beaten down here last week for apart from reasonably good chances allowed to go begging there were two open goals missed. Last Wednesday, at Nottingham, we gave them a goal on a plate through a silly and unnecessary pass back to Bernard Streten which never reached him and so enabled the Forest to open their scoring. Until that goal our lads were more than holding their own, but this was a big blow to us whereas, of course, it gave the Forest all the confidence in the world and they fully deserved their second goal on the subsequent run of the play. In the second half we played much better after one or two switches had been made, and indeed we might have snatched the equaliser in the last few minutes if Gordon Turner had not been bundled off the ball at the last split second to send the ball just the wrong side of an upright. But our forward line never really got into its stride right through the match—it just does not seem to have clicked yet somehow. The introduction today of Bert Mitchell, and we hope as these Notes were being penned, also Jesse Pye should make a big difference, for there is no doubt we have the players to make a good show if only they were all fit. We think this is borne out by the very fine display here last Wednesday evening when our Reserves beat Birmingham Reserves by the convincing margin of four clear goals, and with any luck at all it could easily have been by double figures. We struck the uprights at least three times and how the "Brum" goal escaped on other occasions had to be seen to be believed. Everybody who saw this match left the Ground very satisfied with their evening's entertainment, for it was a game well worth going a long way to see. The forward line played some beautiful football, no easy matter against a team of Birmingham's calibre. The goal scored by Joe Scott was a gem of the first water,

which sent an already contented crowd into ecstasies of delight. Even the Birmingham side stood in silence for a moment or two absolutely flabbergasted that the ball was in their net. But all the way through the match our lads were the masters and played the type of football which will undoubtedly draw the crowds. They also did a good job of work by winning at Northampton last Saturday—no mean feat.

There were two games played here last Saturday, and despite the atrocious weather there was some very good football seen. Our Youth XI were much too good for the Youth Team from Sheffield, winning comfortably by six goals to one, and immediately following this match our 'A' Team took the field against Tottenham Hotspur 'A' Team when again some very nice play was seen, our lads winning by four goals to two after twice being in arrears. There are some very good up and coming youngsters in these two sides, a fact which augers well for the future.

Talking of youngsters reminds us that in the Swansea side we shall see today and whom we welcome to Kenilworth Road again with the greatest pleasure, no less than nine of them are youngsters born and bred practically on the doorstep of Vetch Field. This is the ideal all Clubs are trying to achieve but up to this instance there has been a remarkable lack of success. It is very strange but a local youngster rarely makes good, or so it has proved in the past. A lot depends on the encouragement given these young lads by their own spectators, for some people are much too ready to criticise a lad, especially if they happen to know him it seems. That so many young lads have come through to earn a place in the Swansea First Team shows that it can be done and we hope with the right encouragement the youngsters we are coaching will one day in the very near future have the thrill of playing in our First Team. It is a prospect which should be capable of achievement and we ask our supporters to do their best to help bring it about.

We have arranged for the Turkish Champions, Fener Bache, to be our opponents at our Opening Floodlight Match to be held on the evening of Wednesday, October 7th. For those of you interested in reserved seats for this match we are reserving the Centre Stand only. Tickets will be 5/- each, including tax. Season Ticket Holders are being given until the Saturday previous to the match in which to make application for one ticket for their own seat, after which date the tickets not applied for will be available to the public. Has scored three goals already this season, and the way he is shaping we can confidently expect a few more.
