

CLUB NOTES

ALL things considered we had a very successful day last Saturday, when none of our five teams lost their matches. The Senior side did very well indeed to come away from Eastville with a point and no one could have grumbled if we had come away with both for undoubtedly the better football came from our lads. Only three opportunists goals from their centre forward Geof Bradford kept the Rovers from defeat, and here we must in all fairness say that his second was one of the most spectacular we have seen for many a long day. He flicked a long ball past Les Hall with his head (Les had anticipated him nodding it to his inside forward and had moved over to intercept the pass but the wet ball did not go where it was intended) and Bradford, seeing the position very quickly, ran onto the ball, took it on about twenty yards and then from about thirty-five yards out, let fly. It was a goal from the moment it left his foot despite a full length dive by Bernard Streten. The applause, which lasted well over a minute, was most richly deserved for it was a goal which those who were present will never forget. All our lads played better together than they have done for a long time and it was nice to see how the ball was made to do the work. Jesse Pye had his best game so far this season, being in fact on a par with his last season's brilliance and we all know what that means. He has been most unlucky up to this match with his shooting but the two goals he scored should give him that confidence which unfortunately for us seems to have been lacking this season. Bob Morton had an excellent match both in defence and attack, Les Hall came through his game very well, and Bernard Streten brought off some spectacular saves when on two occasions at least all seemed lost. But as already said the whole team played better and seemed to welcome the softer going.

Our reserves, as quite a few of you saw, were successful against Portsmouth reserves here to the tune of four goals to two, but undoubtedly the early injury to Jack Froggart went a long way towards their defeat. They started off very well and played some very nice football but gradually superior numbers told their tale and we finished well on the right side. Both Wally Shanks and Jim Pemberton had excellent games at wing half and were the two best players on the field.

Our third team, Luton Town "A" playing against Tottenham Hotspur "A" team, at Cheshunt in the Metropolitan League, ran out comfortable winners to the tune of six goals to one, with a personal triumph for Jimmy Adam playing at outside right for he scored five of the goals. Our fourth team, Luton Town "B" went to Cholsey, in Berkshire, to play them in the Second Round of the F.A. Youth Challenge Cup and after finding themselves in arrears at half time to the extent of three clear goals turned on the pressure in the second half when they had the advantage of the wind and rain at their backs and run out winners by four goals to three, after a most enjoyable and sporting match. It was the first time the Cholsey lads had been beaten this season. Our fifth team, the Luton Town Youth XI went to Shillington to

play their Reserves in a Luton and South Beds. League fixture, winning their match by four goals to two. And then to crown it all the Luton Schoolboys, playing here in the morning, beat their opponents, the South East Beds. Schoolboys by ten goals to two, in the Second Round of the English Schools' Shield Competition. All very creditable.

We welcome the "Bees" to Kenilworth Road this afternoon to continue, no doubt, the lively encounters we always have had in the past whenever we have met. It seems that no matter how badly one or both of us are playing at the particular time we both come up to scratch when we meet. The last five weeks Brentford have done much better, having picked up seven points out of the last ten. They were most unlucky not to have made this eight points, for in the dying moments of the game at home, last Saturday, they gave Notts. Forest their goal to finish one all. The previous Saturday they went to St. Andrews and found themselves on the wrong side at half time by four goals to nil, but pulled their socks up in the second half during which Birmingham scored one more only, while the "Bees" themselves scored one. They are under their new Manager, Mr. Bill Dodgin, late of Fulham and Southampton, so he is no stranger to Kenilworth Road. They have certainly done much better since he took up his new post with them just over five weeks ago.

We went to Grimsby last Wednesday to play in a Floodlight Match, and after a most enjoyable game won by two goals to one. It was very nice to meet old friends again. Our team was Streten; Dunne, Aherne; Shanks, Morton, Watkins; Davies, Downie, Moore, Cummins and Taylor. Davies and Downie were our scorers.

Next Saturday we have the honour of staging the England v. France Amateur International Match, kick-off 2.45 p.m. It should be a match well worth seeing for the Frenchmen are very fast as well as accurate with the ball and though we have won in the past by sometimes double figures those days are now definitely in the past and our lads will do well to beat them. Tickets to the Centre Stand only are available at the Office or by post at 5/- each, entry to other parts of the ground are by turnstile only. Come along and give this match your support, for if it proves a financial success we shall undoubtedly be called upon to stage other outstanding matches.

The British Railways are running an Excursion to Derby next Saturday, leaving Luton at 9.59 a.m. Fare 13/- return. Full details can be obtained from the station.

Next Wednesday, November 11th, we are playing Millwall Reserves here. This will be a floodlight match, kick-off is 7 p.m.

Arrangements have practically been completed for a floodlight match with Sportclub Admira of Vienna to be played on Thursday, November 19th, kick-off 7 p.m. Confirmation is awaited, being dependent on permission by the Austrian Football Association. The local press will state whether or not this match will be played and if so, when tickets for the Centre Stand at 5/- each will be available. Season Ticket Holders will have the opportunity to apply for their usual seats.

opened his account until last Saturday's match at Bristol when he scored twice. Obtained one Cup Final Medal while with the Wolves and has two Football League Medals as well as two International Caps, against Belgium in 1949 and against Eire, 1950. Is brilliant in possession—his control of the ball and his passing are points which every schoolboy should note and try to copy.
