Our club is growing in fame and prestige—there is no doubt about that, for the news from Austria, the Channel Islands and the Midlands I have to tell you about this week, is ample confirmation.

From Austria comes a delightful and sincere tribute to Doncaster Rovers from the President of Sportclub Wacker who, it will be remembered, came to play "under the lights" on Monday, October 20th, but who were prevented from showing their undoubted ability because of the fog which caused the abandonment of the game.

The visit of Wacker club to Doncaster will be a happy memory for these Continentals.

The letter, written by Mr. Frey, President of Wacker, obviously after a great deal of thought in trying to put what he felt into English, praises our club for its hospitality and the supporters for their sportsmanship. It is too long to quote in full, but Mr. Frey concludes "With the sincere wishes for getting into the First Division. I hope for a new meeting as soon as possible and remain, with many thanks and best sporting wishes, Alfred Frey, President."

What nicer tribute could we have than that?

Then from the Channel Islands comes a letter to Mr. J. C. Morris, a director and popular secretary of our Supporters' Club. This sports "fan" writes asking to become a member of the Supporters Club. He says he has heard a great deal about the Rovers.

But one of the most amazing letters of all comes from a Birmingham City supporter who wants to become a member of the Supporters Club. And the reason why? Well, he enjoyed the Rovers and Birmingham match so much that he felt he would like to have some connection with the club that beat his own.

What a grand sporting spirit!

Needless to say, both applicants will be made members and help to swell the growing ranks of an organisation which is of great importance to the parent club. Mr. Morris, in giving me this news, also makes an appeal for more members. He points out that a club in the top flight as the Rovers are

at the moment should command a bigger membership for its Supporters' Club. I agree, and urge those who regularly attend at Belle Vue to join at once. The subscription is small and the privileges great.

Were you at the City ground, Nottingham last Saturday? I hope you were. It is quite true that we surrendered the leadership of the Second Division to Leicester City as a result of our drawn match, but our stock rose considerably.

Frankly, I could not be blamed, along with hundreds of others, for feeling a little pessimistic about the result when the interval arrived. We were two goals down; we had seen very little of our attack; and our defence had had more than it could contend with. Yes, Nottingham Forest had played like a team in the running for promotion, and the prospects of them carrying on triumphantly in the second-half was well "on the cards."

But we had forgotten something—that fighting spirit of the Rovers and for 45 minutes of the second half we saw a team fight back to draw level and nearly win a match which looked lost. In fact, with a bit of luck at all—and you can ask Jackie Teasdale about that—we could have won the game.

Perhaps, on reflection, a draw was a good result for this grim, exciting and often exhilarating match which attracted a grand crowd of over 28,000.

LUTON TOWN did not make a very auspicious start to their 1953-54 Second Division programme, and this was a big disappointment to their supporters, but they have now settled down to play first-class football, and their quality and strength is obvious from their present position in the table—eighth from the top, with 21 points from their 19 matches.

Their away record may not be as impressive as that at home, for they have gained only two successes in eight encounters, but they can be formidable opposition on any ground.

Their manager, Mr. "Dally" Duncan, is one of the best-known personalities in football. He reminds me that Mr. Albert Turner, old Doncaster Rovers forward, played alongside him when they were at Hull City.

Here are pen-pictures of some of the players who will be wearing Luton's colours this afternoon:—

BERNARD STRETEN (Goalkeeper)—Was kept out of the Town side for a spell owing to the brilliance of Baynham, but has got back into the team and is showing his usual good form. This competent and agile keeper who has received international honours is a warm favourite at Belle Vue. A product of Norfolk junior football.

SEAMUS DUNNE (Right-back)—Eire international who played for his country recently against Luxemburg.

OUR VISITORS

A stylish, but forceful defender. Went to Kenilworth Road from Shelbourne, the Eire club and had his first game in the 1951-52 season.

BUD AHERNE (Left-back)—He, too, played against Luxemburg for Eire. Was Dunne's partner in that game. Also played and played well too against an Austrian side last week in a floodlit match. Versatile, difficult to beat and excellent distributor of the ball.

LESLIE JONES (Full-back)—Has had a recurrence of groin trouble, but may be back in the side. A young Welshman of great promise, he is a strong tackling player who has rapidly risen to the front rank. Developed in local league football.

BOB MORTON (Right-half)—Another local "discovery" who is a native of Buckinghamshire. A good connecting link with the men in front, Bob served his apprenticeship with Eaton Bray and Waterlows before Luton persuaded him to go to Kenilworth Road. Played against Rovers last season.

SYD OWEN (Centre-half)—One of Luton's best and outstanding players, this pivot joined the club as a wing-half from Birmingham City, but is a highly successful conversion. Went with the F.A. touring side to Australia. Few centre-forwards get the better of this stalwart centre-half.

CHARLES WATKINS (Left-half)—Back in his role of wing-half again after appearing at inside-left against the Rovers on April 30 in the last match of the season at Belle Vue. Formerly with Glasgow Rangers and played for them against the Russian Dynamos. A clever scheming footballer.

ROY DAVIES (Outside-right)—Was playing for Scottish club Clyde when recommended to Luton by a former player. Was persuaded to travel south and has never regretted that decision. Very fast and with good ball control he is always dangerous.

GORDON TURNER (Inside-right)—He is a Doncaster boy who once graced the Doncaster and District Boys team.

Was recommended to Luton after showing up well in Navy football. Son of former Rovers player Albert Turner and is a worthy son of his father.

JESSE PYE (Centre-forward)—Jesse has had more than his share of bad luck owing to injuries, but Luton are hoping to see this famous international, who did so much to make Town promotion aspirants last season, back in his best form. Was given a free transfer by Sheffield United to Wolves. Was born at Rotherham you may recall.

GEORGE CUMMIN (Inside-left)—Has not been at Kenilworth Road very long and is a man to be reckoned with in their attack. Joined them from Everton. Is only 22 years of age. He too played for Eire against Luxemburg. A lively, scheming forward.

ALBERT MITCHELL (Outside-left)—Has been a match-winner for Luton on more than one occasion. Knows the shortest route to goal. Was with Northampton Town formerly until clubs agreed to his transfer. Northampton got a player in exchange and a fee. Previous experience with Blackburn Rovers and Kettering.

JOHNNY DOWNIE (Inside-forward)—A young Scot who was developed by Bradford Park Avenue and transferred to Manchester United at a big fee. A goal-getter who, when in form, is a constant menace to opposing defences. Son of a railway official.
