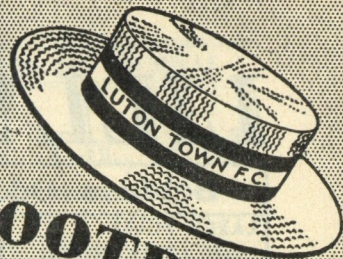

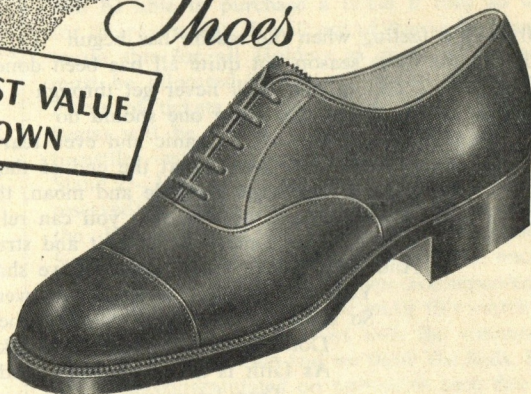

CLUB NOTES

WE maintained a one-hundred per cent home record on Wednesday night last when we beat Bury by three goals to two, but despite the fact that we had enjoyed a three goal clear lead until about eighteen minutes from the end, had to fight really hard during the closing minutes to avoid at least sharing the spoils. It was a very hard-fought game with our lads at times taking quite a buffeting. We were granted one penalty, but feel we were entitled to another when Gordon Turner, who had been beautifully put through by Jesse Pye, was brought down what appeared to us to be about four yards inside the "box," only to have a free-kick awarded us to be taken just outside. Jimmy Adam at outside left had his best game for us to date, and led his full back a rare dance until he received a rather heavy jolt, for which the penalty was awarded. Bert Mitchell delighted us again with his accurate kicking from the "spot" to keep up his record of being successful in every penalty kick he has taken for this Club since he joined us just over three years ago. When Bury scored again only two minutes from the end they naturally did everything to bring about an equaliser, but our defence held out to the final whistle and so we gained, in the end, two hard-earned points.

This afternoon we have the pleasure of receiving Birmingham City as our guests, knowing that a hard-fought battle awaits us. The "Blues" for years have been renowned for their water-tight defence, and not until we met them here last season on Wednesday evening, September 16th, had we the satisfaction of beating them. Strangely enough in this particular match we were playing under a severe handicap for Mike Cullen had dislocated a shoulder after only five minutes play and although he bravely carried on after having had it strapped up was naturally not able to pull his full weight. We were leading by a goal to nil scored by Downie from a penalty, and anything could happen when George Cummins fired in a beautiful shot a few minutes from the end which had Gil Merrick beaten all ends up. There was no further scoring and so we had achieved what we were beginning to feel we never would, and that was to beat these

boys from Birmingham, especially as we had been soundly beaten only the previous Wednesday at St. Andrews to the tune of five goals to one. Our team when we won was Baynham; Dunne, Aherne; Shanks, Morton, Watkins; Cullen, Cummins, Scott, Downie and Davies. Joe Scott we remember had a particularly fine game in that victory and gave the "Brum" defence quite a chasing around that evening.

On September 25th next, when both our First and Reserve teams are playing away, a very interesting match has been arranged to take place here between Crook Town, the F.A. Amateur Cup holders, and Bedfordshire F.A. XI for the honour of holding the A. E. Ansell Shield, a most handsome trophy. This year also coincides with the Diamond Jubilee of the Association, and so the occasion is being used to augment the two. Season Ticket Holders will not be entitled to their usual reserved seats for this match, but tickets will be on sale and where-ever possible Season Ticket Holders will be able to purchase a ticket if they so wish for their own seat. It will not of course be possible to do this for all Holders as some of the seats must be allocated to various bodies taking part. Prices of tickets for the Centre Stand (Reserved Seats) will be 4/6 each, other prices—payable at turnstiles—will be Terraces 1/-, Boys 9d.; Bobbers Stand 2/-, Boys 1/3; Enclosure and Wing Seats (not reserved) 3/-, Boys 2/-. Tickets will be on sale at the Kenilworth Road Office from Wednesday, September 8th. Applications by post please enclose a stamped and addressed envelope accompanied by the remittance. It is hoped to make this match for the Trophy an annual event with the winners of the F.A. Amateur Cup and we think the Beds. F.A. are to be congratulated on putting to such fine use the medals of the late Albert E. Ansell which had been presented to the Association.

The Reserves are at home to Birmingham City Reserves next Wednesday, in a Football Combination Cup fixture, kick-off 6 p.m., when no doubt another enjoyable match will be at your disposal.

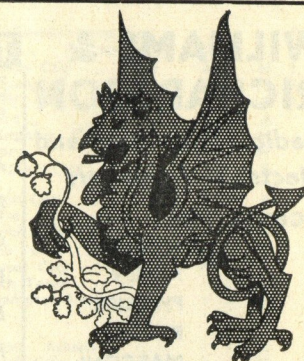

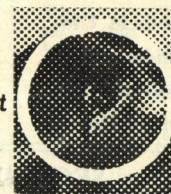

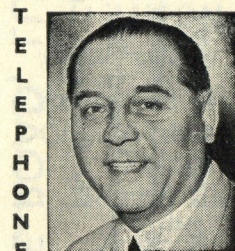
