## CLUB NOTES

WE WISH all of you here today a Very Happy and Prosperous New Year. The year 1955 has every prospect of being a most momentous one in the history of Luton, for big extensions are taking place in various parts of the Borough and its near neighbour Dunstable which in turn means new houses being built to accommodate the extra people who will be required to fill the new factories. There is every evidence of prosperity in the area, and if Luton Town can cap the whole enterprise by gaining promotion to the First Division, there will be very few people in this land of ours who will not know where Luton lies. We hope that all the projects in mind come to pass—both on and off the field, so to speak—for we feel such enterprise deserves success.

Congratulations to our lads on their truly magnificent win at Hull on Boxing Day when we won by the decisive margin of four clear goals. After the display here on Christmas Day, and we must admit it was not an inspiring one—just one of those days when little would go right—our hopes of obtaining at least three points over the holiday seemed rather faint. The thrill we all received when the final score became known was stupendous, and many a pencil came out on Boxing Night to work out our position in the League. Those who saw the match at Hull say that they have never seen football like it. It was simply magnificent. What a tremendous difference Bob Morton has made to the side since he was moved to centre forward against Notts. County on November 6th. We have scored 28 goals since then, conceding 13, and of those 9 matches 5 of them were "away." We could extol at great length on the splendid way in which each member has knitted into the side, especially since that day, but space will not allow. We would like however to say how well George Cummins has fitted in since his recall to the side against Liverpool, and in particular his masterly game at Hull last Monday. George has found great difficulty in settling down here in Luton, but we are happy to say this phase has now passed and with his wife expecting their first-born any day now, we feel we can look forward to a continuance of great football from this player. We wish them both all they wish themselves in this coming event.

Tom Mackey remarked during the week, "I wish it was the end of the season instead of just the end of the year." If his wish could be granted then of course promotion would be ours for certain instead of having another four months of ups and downs in front of us. Even now the "know-alls" have been heard to remark that if we do get promotion we shall be back again next year. We do not ascribe to such pessimism, for

we are quite sure our lads would at least hold their own in the higher circle, and in addition we have the reserves to step in when required. What we do say is that even if we do come down again as forecast we would at least have the satisfaction of being able to say that we had been in the First Division. So let us go ahead with the fight and you the supporters give the lads all the encouragement they so richly deserve.

The lads from Ipswich are our guests today, and we welcome them to Kenilworth Road on their first visit in a Football League fixture. Although formed in 1880 it was not until 1936 that Ipswich Town became a professional Club, waiting only two years before they were elected to the Football League, Division 3 (South). Last season they at one time looked as if they were going to walk away with the League 3 Championship, but about the turn of the year passed through a very bad phase. They recovered in time however to eventually win promotion with a comfortable three points lead over Brighton, their nearest challengers, and eight points over Bristol City occupying third place. Ipswich started their first season in Division 2 as if they were going to take it all in their stride without much worry, but injuries kept cropping up necessitating many changes, resulting in a series of lost matches and a consequent loss of confidence. Their last three away matches must make depressing reading for them for sixteen goals were conceded while scoring only three. For their Christmas Day fixture they had the long trek to Liverpool, where they lost by six goals to two, but made some amends by defeating Liverpool at home on Boxing Day by two clear goals. They are finding the course a pretty stiff one, which they expected for there is no doubt the Second Division is a tough one, but there is a long way to go yet and their struggle to get away from the bottom will be watched with much interest.

Our visitors next Saturday will be Workington in the F.A. Challenge Cup—Third Round. Tickets will be issued for the Centre Stand and Wing Stand only, entry to rest of Ground including Enclosure will be by payment at the Turnstiles. Applications for Tickets are being dealt with as quickly as possible and most of you who have made application will have received a reply by now. Although losing most unexpectedly at home to Southport on Christmas Day by the only goal scored Workington got back into the promotion fight by winning the return game on Boxing Day by two goals to one. While it would be one of the sensations of the day if they won here next Saturday, we ourselves are not taking the result as a foregone conclusion for we have found to our cost before that therein lies disaster. It should however be an entertaining match with some very nice football from both sides.




