



We have had our game and we played it fair

CLUB NOTES

WORKINGTON were drawn next out of the
Hat after Luton when the draw for the Third
Round of the Football Association Challenge Cup
Competition was being made and so they are our
visitors today. We give them a great welcome on
their very first visit to Kenilworth Road in Cup
or League. The "Reds," as they are called, have
already in this Competition beaten Hyde United,
the Cheshire League side by five goals to one, and
Leyton Orient at Leyton by the only goal scored
on that occasion. They appear to be a team of
fighters who blend class football into their play
and we have no doubt that our lads will have to
fight all the way if this Club from the West
Cumberland coast is to make no further progress
in the Cup competition this season. Workington
were elected to membership of the Football League
in June, 1951, taking the place of New Brighton,
one of the four retiring Clubs at that Meeting.
At the end of their first season the "Reds"
finished in the bottom position, and so had to
seek re-election, which was granted. The following
season, 1952/53 they finished one place better, but
again had to seek re-election which again was
carried. Season 1953/54 saw them finish in the
more respectable position of fifth from the bottom
with the same number of points as Hartlepool
and Rochdale but with a slightly poorer goal
average so finishing below them. This season
however they are doing much better, for despite
losing at home on Christmas Day so dropping
two valuable points which has cost them at the
moment two places, the "Reds" are at present
placed in seventh position in the Third League
(North) with bright prospects of promotion on
the horizon. Dour Cup fighters in their non-
League days, when they played in the North
Eastern League, Workington have on several
occasions caused "the surprise of the Round," and
in 1934 went as far as the Fourth Round, only to
be finally beaten by the odd goal in three by
Preston North End. Present in that side was a
young player of the name of Bill Shankley,
destined to play for his native Scotland and to
make a name famous throughout the football
world. Since his appointment as Manager of
Workington they have gone from success to
success and are this season one of the outstanding
sides in the Third Division. Here are Pen Portraits
of the players who have made this team the
talking point of Cumberland:—

Malcolm Newlands (Goalkeeper). Former
St. Mirren and Preston North End custodian
who has been giving brilliant performances for
Workington since he joined them from Preston
in 1952.

Jimmy Fleming (Right Back). A close season
free transfer signing from Stirling Albion who has
made the right full back position his own since he
was given his chance shortly after the beginning
of the season. Tackles effectively and seldom
wastes the ball.

Jack Vitty (Left Back). One of a family of
footballing brothers Jack first made a name for
himself with Charlton Athletic. Later went to
Brighton from where Workington signed him. In
almost three seasons has only missed playing
through injury and this season has played in every
match. Is captain of the side.

Dennis Stokoe (Right Half). Has not missed
a game for Workington since he was signed from
neighbouring Carlisle United in October 1953. A
clever, hard working player who never gives up,
he was formerly with Chesterfield when they were
in the Second Division.

George Aitken (Centre Half). Cost Work-
ington a record fee of £5,000 when they secured
his services from Middlesbrough during the 1953
close season, but has since more than paid it back
with some magnificent displays. Blond haired and
solidly built he has missed only one game since
joining Workington and has a hundred per cent
record for this term. Several prominent clubs are
interested in him.

Rex Dunlop (Left Half). Completes the
strong point of the Workington team, the half
back line. Rex had plenty of experience with
Glasgow Rangers before joining Workington at
the same time as his partner Stokoe. A tricky,
progressive type of player he also has not missed
a game this season.

Desmond Jones (Outside Right). Another
free transfer player who has won a place for
himself in the first team. Signed for Workington
during the last close season from Bristol Rovers
having had previous experience with Swansea
Town.

Jackie Bertolini (Inside Right). A young
player who arrived at Workington from Stirling
Albion as an outside right. Lost favour in that
position but is back in the team now playing
strongly at inside forward. Scored the goal which
put Leyton Orient out of the Cup in the Second
Round.

Jim Dailey (Centre Forward). An energetic
leader who has played in all four sections of
League football. Started with Third Lanark
across the Border and came to England to join
Sheffield Wednesday and later Birmingham City.
Next club was Exeter City from where he moved
to Workington during the middle of last season.

Ernie Whittle (Inside Left). Hard hitting
pocket sized attacker and leading goalscorer with
13 goals to his credit. A grand schemer he joined
Workington from Lincoln City at the end of last
season after playing his last game for them at the
Kenilworth Road ground.

Hughie Cameron (Outside Left). Like Dailey,
Hughie has played in all sections of League
football. A Scotsman who first made his name
with Torquay United, his displays there attracted
Newcastle United who soon acquired his signature.
His next club was Bury in the Second Division,
joining Workington from there in October 1953
at the same time as Stokoe and Dunlop.

Two hard-earned points against lowly Ipswich
Town here last Saturday kept us nicely in second
place in the Table, but it was a hard struggle and
there was much relief when the final whistle
sounded. The Reserves continued their successful
way with a well-earned victory at Brighton, where
the score could easily have been six in our favour
such was our undoubted superiority. The whole
team played lovely football which was a joy to
watch.

Bedfordshire has been drawn at home to
Middlesex in the Third Round of the F.A. County
Youth Championship, and we have been pleased
to grant permission for the match to take place on
this Ground. This has been arranged for Saturday
next, January 15th, kick-off 11 a.m. Admission to
Grand Stand and Enclosure only being 1/- Adults,
6d. Boys.

We have been asked by the Luton Band to
express their grateful thanks to the many people
who contributed towards the collection made on
this ground when Birmingham City Reserves were
our visitors recently. The sum of £25. 14. 3d. was
collected, which has been sent to the National
Children's Home at Harpenden towards their
Christmas expenses. To all those who contributed
we say on behalf of the Children "Thank you."





