CLUB NOTES

THE Rotherham lads are our visitors today and considering the result of our encounter with them on their home ground recently they must be facing this match with very mixed feelings. That they did not allow this defeat to upset them too much was evidenced last Saturday when on their visit to the Belle Vue Ground they trounced the Rovers by no less than four clear goals. Undoubtedly Doncaster had their eyes on their further clash with the Villa in the Cup Replay on the Monday but at the same time the Rotherham lads must have played well to have won so decisively.

Despite the drubbing we gave them a fortnight ago one thing stood out in this Rotherham side and that was their very sporting spirit right through the match. They never once reverted to unfair means to try and get back into the game when they found themselves three goals down in so short a time and it is to their credit that they continued to play good football and even in the last minute or two went all out to try and get another goal even though the result of the match at that time was a foregone conclusion. The crowd too took their team's defeat in a most sporting way, a fact which impressed us all very much indeed. We trust we shall see further evidence of this sporting attitude to the game from both sides today and we say with all sincerity—may the best side win.

Our lads did very well to bring back a point with them from Stoke last Saturday. Defences were mostly on top right through the match but there were one or two instances when a goal could easily have been scored. We did get the ball into the net on two occasions but both were disallowed on the grounds of "offside." We agreed with the decision when Mike Cullen beat the keeper but could not see eye to eye with the Referee when he also disallowed the shot by Gordon Turner who had beaten the "offside trap" with his quickness off the mark, but the official in charge thought otherwise on his Linesman's signal and there the matter stands. Unfortunately Turner was still feeling the effects of the slight attack of 'flu he had experienced earlier in the week otherwise on two occasions at least he felt he could have improved the "goals for" column if he could have got off his mark quicker. But all the same it was a very good and valuable point and further evidence of the skill and stamina of this team to gain another "away" point, so keeping their position at the top of the Table. We sincerely hope we are still there tonight.

The Reserves rather spoil a good chance of getting amongst the leaders of the Combination Table when they allowed West Ham's second string to beat them here last Saturday. After our

lads' most creditable displays lately this match came as rather an anti-climax, but it must be said in all fairness to our lads that the conditions were all against them playing their usual type of quick neat passing on the ground. They never adapted themselves to the state of the pitch as the London lads did. We should have been two or three up at half-time if the chances had been accepted, despite some very good goalkeeping, but they were allowed to go begging and once West Ham got their noses in front we never looked like saving the game. A great pity for it was before our best attendance for a Reserve Match this season.

We are dealing with the Cup Tie applications as quickly as we can and hope to finish them by Tuesday at the latest. There has been a colossal demand for tickets for our match with Manchester City, even beating the Arsenal occasion. In view of the very poor attendances at League matches this season, despite the very good football our lads have been playing, it is rather surprising the demand there is for tickets on this occasion and particularly remembering the poor response when Workington were our visitors recently. Apparently there is no telling what will happen in love or football!
