




CLUB NOTES

EVERY match we now play until the end of
the season, a matter of ten in all, will be fraught
with importance and not a little anxiety. Having
occupied first or second position for so long we
are quite determined to stay there but every match
now is becoming more and more difficult with the
opposition trying their very best to oust us from
our perch. Two points today will place us five
points clear of our opponents whereas the
alternative would mean the County being only
one point behind us and right bang in the
promotion race once more. It is a match full of
possibilities and if we do not today get our biggest
attendance of the season then we just do not know
what will attract the crowds, for this match has
everything about it one would wish.

It is therefore with much pleasure that we
welcome Notts. County to our Ground today.
When we visited them early last November we
felt we were well on our way to a useful away
win for we were leading by three goals to one
with only about ten minutes to go, when suddenly
the County found some inspiration to pop in two
goals and were going hammer and tongs to snatch
a victory when the final whistle sounded. Our lads
until those closing minutes had been playing some
delightful football, finding their own men with
wonderful accuracy which must have made the
County supporters wonder what was happening to
their team for only the previous week at Hull they
had been well and truly beaten to the tune of
five goals to two. The return of Jimmy Jackson
from Canada late in November however seems to
have added the missing link in their forward line
for in the 13 League matches in which he has
played he has scored 11 goals. The "Magpies" as
they are called (not to be confused with Newcastle)
have the best "away" record this season in the
Second Division for they have been on the
winning side no less than seven times, at Plymouth,
Notts. Forest, Bury, Ipswich, Bristol Rovers (4
goals to 1), Middlesbrough (also 4 goals to 1),
Blackburn (5 goals to 4), with two drawn matches
at Port Vale and Derby County. With so much
at stake they will undoubtedly go all out to
improve on this very satisfactory record and so we
should see a most entertaining match. The County
are the oldest Club in the Football League, in fact
we believe there is only one other Club in the
country which is older. Founded in 1862 the
County were one of the original twelve Clubs
when the Football League was formed in season
1888/89. Their honours are many, although they
have won the F.A. Cup once only, season 1893/94,
when they beat Bolton Wanderers at Everton by
four goals to one. They were hoping to emulate
this feat this year but unfortunately met York City
in the Sixth Round on one of those days when
nothing would go right and so had to accept defeat
at the hands of their Third Division opponents
by the only goal scored.

A most creditable performance in every way
was given by our Reserve string here last Saturday
when they beat a very strong Tottenham team by
the odd goal in three. We saw some lovely

football from the Spurs, reminiscent of their
palmy days of three and four years ago. Their
quick interpassing and taking up of the open
spaces were object lessons for all football fans,
but it was not all one-way traffic, for our lads
played some splendid football at times and only
the experience of Ted Ditchburn on at least two
occasions prevented George McLeod from scoring.
George had a very good game right through and
undoubtedly we have a great forward here in the
making. When "Sos" Allen had to leave the field
with a dislocated arm shortly after the Spurs had
been able to penetrate our defence the match
looked as good as lost for Allen was out for the
rest of the afternoon, but the remaining ten
seemed to gather strength from such misfortune
and from then on surprisingly there was only one
team in it. We simply hammered the Spurs'
defence and the two goals we scored during the
closing ten minutes of the game made a most
thrilling finish to a game in which there was never
a dull moment. Well done the Reserves for a
game won against great odds.

Our congratulations to Harry Wright for
again being selected to act as Trainer to the
England 'B' team for their match against
Germany 'B' team at Hillsborough last Wednes-
day, and to Gordon Turner for his inclusion as a
Reserve. Although not called upon to play it does
show that the F.A. are aware of this brilliant
young inside forward's form as well as his
capabilities. We trust this will lead to further
recognition for with 31 goals in the bag he is a
player the Selectors must take into consideration
when discussing their national teams. At the same
time Turner is the first one to say that his goals
have come as a result of team work rather than
from his own individual efforts. All the same it
is nice to see that he is being recognised.

We shall probably stage our last Floodlight
match of the season, certainly as far as our First
and Second teams are concerned, when our
Combination side meet Charlton Reserves on
Thursday next, kick-off 7.30 p.m. Our previous
match with Cardiff Reserves was a very good
match and we have no doubt this next match
under the lights also will be well worth watching.

We are sorry to say we shall not be extending
our Main Stand this next season as had been
hoped. Plans had been drawn up, but after
visiting other Grounds where new Stands had been
erected recently the Board decided to incorporate
certain improvements which will necessitate more
steel and re-inforced concrete. As it is now too
late to put this extra work in hand for this year
a decision has been made to delay the work for
twelve months. We shall therefore not have the
new seats ready for Season Ticket Holders which
at one time we had hoped would be available, but
so as not to disappoint those of you who have
already applied for seats for next season the
matter of a slight extension to the Centre Stand
to incorporate these will be considered by the
Board at an early date. As soon as a definite
decision has been made details will be given in
these Notes as well as by the local Press.




