THE OFFICIAL VIEWPOINT

GOOD EVENING—Way back in January, the original date for our clash with Luton, the fixture looked nothing more than an average attraction although the Hatters were then running second to Blackburn Rovers after 25 games, and Blues were occupying the eighth position in the table with a game in hand. Circumstances alter cases, and although Luton's position has not changed a great deal, ours has, and there is no need to stress the urgency of to-night's match.

We have had some pretty hectic tussles with Luton these post-war years, but none has been more heavily loaded with speculation and possibility than this game, the result of which means so much to both clubs. During one of their most successful seasons in which they have maintained a regular place with the promotion challengers—they headed the table last Autumn, slipped a little and then crept back to lead Blackburn Rovers early in March—Luton have proved one of the most consistently attractive teams in the Division.

Blues 1955 record will take some beating, and the Easter maximum of six points from the three games, enabled us to start our final challenge as promotion prospects with a favourite's chance. But that memorable run of away successes had to end, and it was no use trying to hide the disappointment last week end.

Our forwards could not find the form which produced eleven Easter goals, and the Staffordshire side were more at home on the dusty Vale Park pitch.

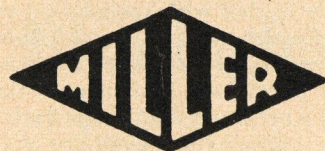

CUP FINAL TICKETS

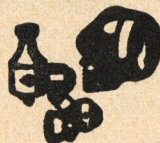
