NOT all the successes of the football world can be defined in such precise terms as "Cup winners" and "League champions". There is such a thing as having a reputation for sportsmanship and a determination to succeed by good football with the emphasis laid on attack.

And in bidding a hearty welcome to Luton Town this afternoon may we say that "The Hatters" have built up in the post-war years a reputation of which any club would be proud.

Although they are the "Babes" of the First Division, having won promotion only at the end of last season, they are already well into their stride in the upper circle and last Saturday, at Kenilworth Road, had the satisfaction of gaining a 3-1 victory over the current League leaders, Blackpool.

That means, of course, that we shall have to be at our best today.

It will not be the first time, however, that a fixture with Luton has demanded an "all out effort" on our part. In the promotion season we had two first class encounters with them, winning 3-0 at Leeds Road and 2-0 in the return towards the end of the season when victory for Luton would have put them, and not us, on the road to promotion. What a match that was—with Jesse Pye pulling out all the stops in an endeavour to halt our progress!

Mention of Luton Town always brings to mind simultaneously the name of Willie Davie who joined Town from the Kenilworth Road camp, and to offset setbacks we have experienced so far this season there has been a most welcome return to form on the part of the former Luton player.

True, the ball could run more kindly for him but we feel sure that

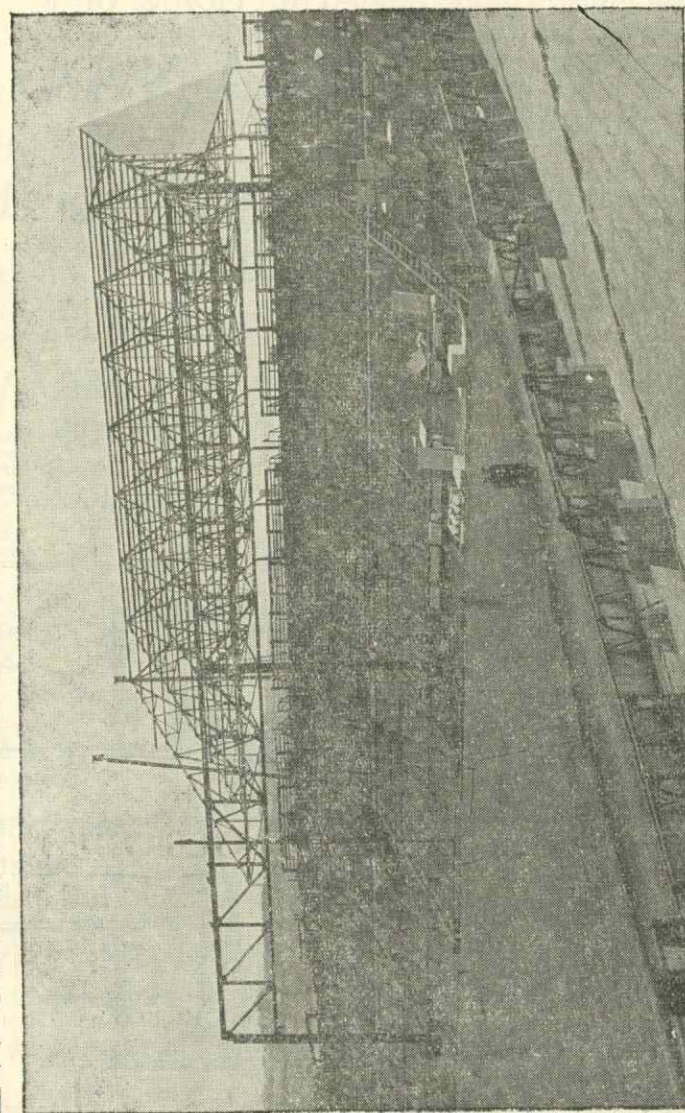

with a little more of the perseverance that he has been showing recently the tide will turn in his favour—and ours, too, for if Willie's shot at Turf Moor last Saturday had gone into the net instead of hitting the upright we should probably have brought back at least a point, notwithstanding the unfortunate injury to Brian Gibson.

Our opponents this afternoon were beaten 3-1 at Burnley on Sept. 5th, and they also went under by the same score on Oct. 1st at Old Trafford where we shall be performing next Saturday so that we shall await the outcome of this afternoon's game with doubled interest.

The game served to give a senior outing to our young fullbacks, Bob Parker and Robbie Ledger, and it was refreshing to see the eagerness with which Ronnie Simpson and Gerry Burrell set about their tasks on the respective wings.

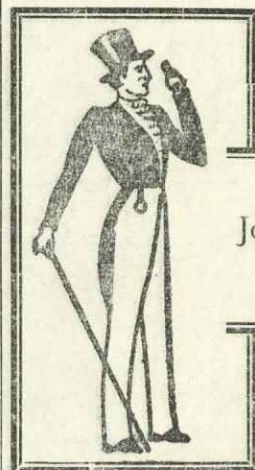

Bill Carter Introduces LUTON TOWN.

BAYNHAM, R.—Goalkeeper.

This six-footer from Worcester City was a member of the England side which won 5-1 in Copenhagen 13 days ago. Ron has taken over from Bernard Streten, who has represented his country in both amateur and full internationals.

DUNNE, S.—Right-back.

Seamus is an Eire international, who joined Luton five years ago. Made his Second Division debut during the 1951-52 season, and appeared against Town here in the following campaign.

AHERNE, T.—Left-back.

Tommy, another Irishman with representative experience, was born in Eire, but began his Soccer career in the North. Luton signed him in 1949. Turned out in every League fixture last term.

MORTON, R. H.—Right-half.

Bob is a local boy developed originally as a centre-forward to succeed Jesse Pye. His true place was proved to be wing-half, where he performed consistently last season.

OWEN, S.—Centre-half. Sid's first club was Birmingham. Another Luton "regular" who has switched positions, he started out as a wing-half. Since taking over as No. 5, he has been an England choice against Hungary, Yugoslavia and Belgium.

SHANKS, W. G.—Left-half.

Wally—born Malta of Scottish parents—had been with Chelsea before Luton gave him a month's trial. Was a wing or inside-forward in those days.

CULLEN, M. J.—Right-winger.

Michael is a Scot who is at home on either wing. A tricky type who specialises in creating the chances for rather than scoring goals, although he came along with the winner when Preston were at Kenilworth Road.

TURNER, G.—Inside-right.
Gordon is one of the best inside-forwards in the country. He is forceful, direct, and possesses a hard shot which has been rewarded with 6 goals so far. Turner, who was born in Yorkshire, first distinguished himself as a wing-half.

MacEWAN, M. P.—Centre-forward. A South African who soon found himself in the League line-up after his arrival last year. The 1954-55 season gave Malcolm 3 goals in 7 games. Is credited with six this time.

CUMMINS, G.—Inside-left.
Another Irishman, George, who was born in Dublin, was recruited by Everton, who had him in their side during the Cup run which took them to the semi-final in 1953. Joined Luton soon afterwards. A clever ball player.

GROVES, J.—Left-winger.
Jimmy is the son of "Scrogg" Groves, a talented Halifax Town inside-forward of the late 1920's. Groves junior is not yet established as a First Division choice. He is improving steadily and is rated as one of manager Dally Duncan's outstanding prospects.

Campbell was soon in the picture with skilful prompting of his forwards but though Town were in command in the early stages no worth while shot reached the City goal. When the visitors settled down they looked the more likely to score. Turner made a good save from Chandler and there was some competent work from Goodall, Roughton and Young.

Robson made a great effort to get through for Town and Bob Kelly (playing at outside-right) and Billy Smith were often prominent, but there was no tangible reward until the last ten minutes of the half. Then, with a rainstorm sweeping the pitch, Town scored twice without reply! A Smith header from a centre by Davies went in off Black for the first and Davies headed the second when Campbell centred.

Within four minutes of the resumption Town had doubled their score. Davies hit No. 3 with a first-time shot from a centre by Kelly after Smith had swung the ball across the field, and Crownshaw made it four with a header from another Kelly centre.

Leicester's deserved consolation goal came 15 minutes from the end when Hine put Adcock through to beat Turner from close range.
