

CLUB NOTES

We sincerely trust each one of you has had a most enjoyable time these last few days, augmented by good news from Tottenham last Saturday and from Sheffield yesterday. When these Notes were being penned last Thursday there was every prospect of this Christmas being the best for many a long day, for the shops were doing excellent business and there was a general air that everybody was going to enjoy himself or herself this holiday. We hope these expectations were fulfilled, for a Happy Christmas is a great send-off for the New Year just round the corner. Two points today, especially if they are gained after a match as thrilling as we experienced in our last home game, will be a great finale to the holiday, and send you all back to work tomorrow well satisfied on the completion of this Festive Holiday.

It is with great pleasure that we welcome Sheffield United to our ground today, although we have no doubt that they themselves would have much preferred a visit to a Club much nearer home at this time of the year. Our lads had the long and tedious journey to Sheffield on the afternoon of Christmas Day, hoping that the nine inches of snow which had fallen during the week had subsided sufficiently so as not to make their journey unnecessary. Although we were lucky in that we did not get a heavy fall of snow in Luton, Johnny Sanderson nevertheless had much with which to contend, for our pitch has been ankle deep in mud when not bone hard due to the heavy frosts, and it has been most difficult for him to do very much in the short time the pitch was workable. Johnny and his staff however take their job very seriously, and we have no doubt that the pitch today is in the best possible condition human endeavour can make it. When you see the pitch today do not forget that two matches have been played on it in the last three days, on top of the glue pot which was left after the match with Charlton Athletic.

Sheffield United are surprisingly having a poor time this season for they occupied third place from the bottom of the Table before last Saturday's match. Out of eleven matches played at home the United have lost four of them, having scored only 13 goals at home. Their away record reads, Played 10, Won 2, Lost 8, Goals "for" 16, "against" 22, the two wins being at Huddersfield and Preston North End. They have suffered rather badly from injuries, their great schemer Jimmy Hagan unfortunately for them being no exception. He was back in the side last Saturday, and no doubt his presence on the field has a great psychological effect on the rest of the team for his ability and experience are undoubtedly a great asset. Now under the management of Joe Mercer we shall be surprised if the United continue under the shadow of relegation much longer. Ted Burgin is back in the team after a spell in the Reserves and now playing with all his old confidence. Though not of the spectacular type Ted is a very sound goalkeeper and we have always been impressed with his displays at Kenilworth Road.

It is nice to see that young John Chambers has been chosen to play for "The Rest" in the England Amateur Youth Trial match to be held at Derby County's ground on Saturday, January 7th. Although not in his accustomed position of Right Half we feel that the position of Right Back chosen for him is a good move for he is big and strong and a very good tackler. We wish him well, trusting further honours will come his way.

Quite a shock awaited us when we opened our papers last Tuesday morning to read that Leon Leuty had died at the age of 34. We remember his great displays on this Ground, always cool and methodical, and a great general. His passing

particularly at so early an age is a great blow for he had the personality of making a success of whatever job he tackled and as football was his particular interest we are quite sure the football world has lost one who would have made a great administrator. We have always classed him as being one of the four best Centre Half Backs in the country with Billy Wright, Neil Franklin, and our own Syd Owen. Notts. County F.C. are opening a Testimonial Fund for the dependents of Leon Leuty—his wife and two small children—and if any of you would like to make a contribution we can assure you that the Chairman of Notts. County who is making arrangements for such a Fund would be very pleased to hear from you.

The Luton Band collected the sum of £24-12-0 at the Combination Match with Portsmouth Reserves on December 10th and the whole of the money has been sent to the National Children's Home at Harpenden to help swell other moneys with which to buy Christmas presents for the youngsters. The Band has asked us to thank those of you who contributed towards the collection thus helping to make Christmas at Harpenden just that little more enjoyable.

Applications for Tickets for the Leicester City Cup Match are coming in steadily but there are still quite a few Season Ticket Holders who have not yet applied. There is plenty of time before January 2nd but for your own sakes do not leave it until the last minute. We must emphasize again that Centre Stand Season Ticket Holders will not on the occasion of Home Cup Tie matches receive a Ticket for their own particular seat, but that a Ticket for a seat will be allocated to them if application is made in the proper manner as shown in the "Luton News." We have received one or two letters from Season Ticket Holders stating that they will require a Ticket but not enclosing the necessary remittance. We state here and now that such letters will be completely ignored for it is quite impossible to try and marry these up with the proper applications made later enclosing the money, and we fail to see why we should be expected to do so. Those of you therefore who have not applied in the proper manner are advised to do so without delay, for there is the further drawback in delaying your applications in that some of you will be seated in the section usually known as the Wing Stand—the whole Stand is being called the Main Stand for the Cup Tie—and naturally those who apply last will be allocated tickets for the extreme Oak Road end of the Stand. Some of you would have to be moved to accommodate the Leicester quota and it would be unfair as well as impracticable to try and let some of the Holders have their usual seats.

Having been given permission by the Football Association to do so if we wished until the end of March we agreed as from the Charlton Athletic match to allocate two 3/6 Cup Final Tickets at each First Team home match to the two persons purchasing Official Programmes bearing numbers to be announced over the mike at half time. Last home match the lucky numbers were 1752 and 7689, but so far the persons who purchased the two Programmes bearing these two numbers have not come forward. All the Programmes at today's match will be numbered, and two numbers will be given out during half time. If the lucky persons will call round at the back of the stand after the match the Secretary will take particulars so that they will be advised when the Tickets are available. They must of course be purchased at their face value.

New lapel Badges have been received and are on sale at the Bobbers Club or at the Office in Kenilworth Road at 1/6 each. They are very neat, and we feel quite a serviceable emblem for the "Hatter" fan.
