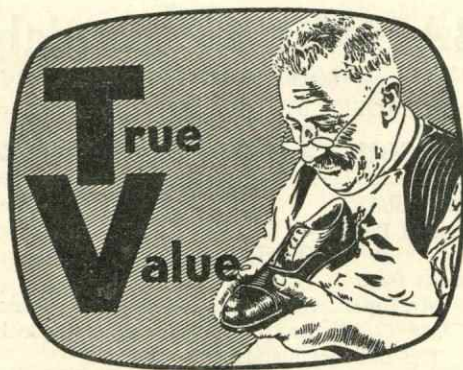

CLUB NOTES

WELCOME to Willie Davie and his merry men from Huddersfield on their first visit to Kenilworth Road since they won promotion season 1952/53. When we visited Leeds Road last October our lads were playing their very effective football and won fairly comfortably by two goals to nil. Shortly after this we had those great wins against Sunderland and Wolverhampton Wanderers which, amongst others, took us to third place in the Table. Huddersfield on the other hand have found the going very hard all the season with very few successes to lift the gloom until these last two Saturdays when they have beaten Preston North End, at Preston, by two goals to one and last Saturday when beating Burnley at Leeds Road by an only goal. These two wins, both unexpected against such formidable opposition, not only gained them four valuable points but must have given them much more confidence in their own ability. They therefore come to Kenilworth Road today in a much happier frame of mind than would have been the case two Saturdays ago. We on the other hand have been through a most lean time since the turn of the year, when very little seems to have gone right with us. At West Bromwich although we lost we felt that we were getting back into that rhythm which, for various reasons, we had lost lately and felt that at last the corner had been turned. But we then lost at home to Manchester United through two goals practically handed to them on a plate, and then again nothing to show for our journey to Blackpool last week-end left us realising we still had a problem to solve, although it must not be forgotten that we had such players as Syd Owen, Bud Aherne and Bob Morton unable to play due to injuries. It was a great blow to our hopes when informed at practically the last minute that Bob Morton would not be able to travel to Blackpool, for we had decided to play the same forward line which earned us our last away win—at Sheffield United by four clear goals. This plan however was not to be, due to Morton's injury and in addition Wally Shanks received a kick on the Achilles tendon of his right leg after only ten minutes play which was most painful and prevented him from playing his normal game. There seemed to be just no end to our continued misfortune.

The team selection for today's match due to injuries and the prospect of a continuance of a snow-bound pitch has caused the Team Manager much thought and in fact the selection had not been made when these Notes were being prepared on Thursday. "Dally" had decided however to bring back George Cummins to the Inside Left position in view of his brilliant first half display here last Saturday against Bristol Rovers Reserves and to bring in Jimmy Adam at Outside Left if reported fit, moving Roy Davies who is now quite fit, over to Outside Right, which is his best position. Mike Cullen did very well when the pitches were firm but he has not adapted himself well to the changed conditions brought about by our wintry weather.

Our Reserves had a much better match here last Saturday despite the atrocious conditions and in fact it was a very good match to watch. All played well, and apart from the skill of George

Cummins already mentioned Alan Collier had a particularly good game, his handling of the ball under all kinds of difficulties being very good, but the player who took our eye most was John Groves in his new position of Left Half Back. The cool way in which he beat his man and then to put a lovely pass all along the ground for the receiver to take on in his stride was a revelation and a joy to watch. Here surely is our left half of the future if all goes well.

Congratulations to Syd Owen and Bob Morton upon being selected by the Football Association to tour South Africa from May 6th to about mid-July this year. Both selections are well-earned and we hope both will be fit enough to go right through the tour without feeling any ill effects. This will be Syd's third tour with the F.A., for he has already been to Australia and the West Indies. His experience should therefore be most valuable.

Roy Davies has been selected to play for an Anglo South African XI against a Scottish XI at Ibrox Park on Monday, March 12th, kick-off 7.15 under Floodlight, proceeds to go to the Olympic Appeals Fund. We trust he has a good match.

The first three days this week our Office Staff was kept busy answering the telephone denying rumours of the sudden demise of both our first-class goalkeepers. On Monday we were particularly busy denying the fate of Bernard Streten, and then on Wednesday Ron Baynham was the victim. However such rumours get about in the first place is very difficult to imagine for surely no-one deliberately starts such silly nonsense. We would not bother to mention such rubbish here but for the fact that Bernard's wife heard about it while out shopping, which was most upsetting to her. The person who started these rumours has that dubious satisfaction for his trouble.

Charles Buchan's "Football Monthly" for March has a very good coloured photograph of Ron Baynham on the outside cover, as well as a large action-photo on the centre pages of an incident when we played at White Hart Lane this season. The magazine is full of interesting articles and tit-bits, and well worth the price of 1/6 to any soccer fan.

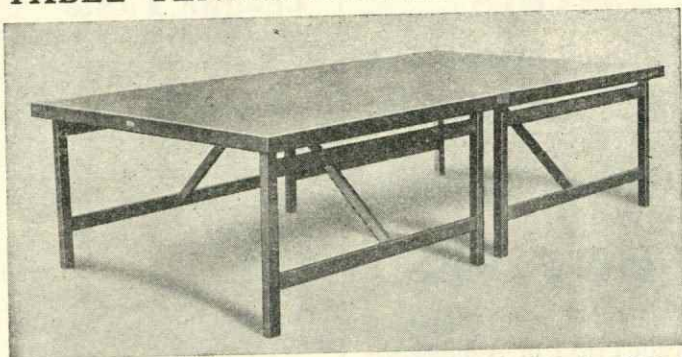
