## VOICE OF ARSENAL

ALTHOUGH the dispute in the printing trade is now over, we regret very much that the resumption to normal working did not take place in time for the Easter programmes to be published on normal lines. We shall, however, revert to the magazine type programme for the last home League fixture v. Birmingham City on 14th April, when the normal features will return and many of the match records (omitted through force of circumstances) will be included.

Despite the fact that our space is so limited, our welcome is no less to our friends from Luton who come to us today in their first visit to Highbury in a League match. Finishing third in Division II in 1953-54, it was their consistent play which gained them promotion last season when they finished Runners-up to Birmingham. Runners-up in name, they scored the same number of points as Birmingham. Playing cultured football, they lost only one home match and scored 38 of their 54 points at Kenilworth Road. Yet, such is the fickleness of the public, their average home attendance did not exceed 18,000.

This season, of course, their attendances have improved and their average "gate" is nearer 22,500, the best being on the occasion of the visit of Wolves in November when 26,000 saw the game. Even this, however, was more than 2,000 less than the record attendance, created when we went to Luton in the 6th Round of the F.A. Cup in 1952.


