

## CLUB NOTES

WE WELCOME to Kenilworth Road today  
in our last match but one of the season one of  
the Finalists in this year's F.A. Cup Competition,  
Manchester City. They are as attractive opponents  
just now as any Club, and we feel fortunate that  
the fixtures have worked out that their visit to  
Kenilworth Road coincides when they are on top  
of the world. The team selected to play here  
today is most likely, barring injuries, the one  
which will do duty at Wembley a fortnight today.  
We are pleased to see that Bert Trautmann, voted  
the player of the year, is on duty today, also  
Bobby Johnstone their lively centre forward whose  
meticulous through-balls can be so devastating to  
the visitors' defence as we found to our cost when  
we played at Maine Road last December. At  
one moment late in the second half we seemed to  
be coasting along nicely to a well-deserved win  
for we were leading by two goals to one, when  
suddenly from two passes by Johnstone two goals  
were scored in two minutes to put paid to  
our hopes of bringing any points away from  
Manchester that day. Strangely enough he did  
not have a very good game last Saturday at  
Hampden Park when playing for Scotland against  
England, but this was due apparently to a pulled  
muscle received during the match which was felt  
would prevent him playing here today, but  
fortunately the trouble has responded to treatment  
and so we have every hope of him being seen in  
action this afternoon. The City rather blotted  
their copy book last Saturday at home to Burnley  
when they lost by three goals to one, thus making  
their chances of finishing in the top four not quite  
so rosy. They will undoubtedly come here today  
with every intention of putting right that relapse  
and so we should see a very good match indeed.  
They will have to win today if their hopes of  
earning talent money are to be fulfilled, for their  
remaining match of the season is at Portsmouth  
next Saturday where it is always difficult to avoid  
defeat. Unfortunately our own hopes of finishing  
in the top four in our first season in the First  
Division, which at one time did seem a feasible  
possibility have not materialised, but we shall  
finish in the middle of the Table which, after all,  
is not bad going for new boys in such august  
company. Until the turn of the year we had been  
doing very well indeed, but somehow we just  
could not get going in the first two months of this  
year and did not pick up a single point during  
that time. Without a doubt injuries to our  
players has played a big part in this setback to  
our hopes of accomplishing some outstanding  
honour this season, but we hope for happier  
tidings this time next season.

Our fourth and fifth teams have done very  
well this season, both having virtually won their  
Championships in the First Divisions of the South  
Midlands League and the Luton District and  
South Beds. League respectively. These two teams  
are comprised mainly of local youngsters who  
have come to us straight from School. It is a  
long-term policy but already there are signs that  
these young lads are developing into very talented  
teams. In appreciation of both these teams'  
achievements this season we had arranged for the  
'C' team to play on this Ground on Monday  
evening next, and our 'B' team to play here on  
Thursday evening next. Unfortunately our 'C'  
team's opponents, Caddington 'B', cannot field a  
side that evening as their first team is also playing  
and it is not possible for them to turn out two  
teams on the same evening. Our 'B' team  
however will be playing here on Thursday evening  
next as arranged, and we do hope quite a few of

you will come down to see these youngsters in  
action. They will be playing Barton Rovers in  
the 2nd Leg Final of the South Midlands Shield  
Competition. The result of the first Leg played  
at Barton last Saturday was a win for our lads by  
five clear goals, but this result is not a true  
reflection of the game for until half time, when  
the score was 2 goals to nil, the Barton lads were  
playing some very nice football but their finishing  
let them down, while our lads on the other hand  
took their chances. As a matter of interest our  
'B' team has beaten three teams in the Premier  
Division of the South Midlands League in reaching  
the Final and altogether have scored 28 goals  
against 4. Considering the average age of our  
lads is only 19, and playing against other lads  
much older than themselves, they have done very  
well indeed.

ending with our last League 1 fixture this season
