## CLUB NOTES

WE COMMENCE the 1956/57 season to-day with the visit of the lads from Sunderland, and what better attraction could one wish for the opening match of a season? A team containing eight Internationals is a great attraction at any time, and our visitors bearing the proud title of "The team of all the Talents" are certainly in the first six attractive sides of the country. When they visited us last season to be humbled as few senior teams have been for many a long day everybody wondered just what reaction such a defeat would bring about, but these lads from the North are made of stern stuff and while no doubt smarting under such a defeat soon settled down to their normal game, finishing one place above us in the Table and only being knocked out of the F.A. Cup in the Semi-Final. We can expect a great battle here today for our opponents will be all out to retrieve some of the prestige lost as a result of their last two meetings with us for on our visit to Roker Park we obtained the double over them and so must have made their cup as far as Luton Town was concerned rather overflowing with unpleasant thoughts. These we must state straightaway to avoid any misapprehension are entirely our own thoughts on the matter for the Sunderland players and Officials and their supporters took their two defeats at our hands in the best sporting spirit. We were lucky on our visit to Roker Park in that we played them on the Wednesday following their great win at Newcastle against the United in the Sixth Round of the F.A. Cup, and we undoubtedly caught them on the rebound after that glorious and unpredicted win. Whatever the result today we know we shall witness a game of football played in its most sporting manner and we say in all sincerity, may the best team win.

Unfortunately we have two major injuries to contend with before the season begins preventing Ron Baynham and George Cummins appearing today. This could be a serious blow but we have two worthy players to take their places in Bernard Stretton and John Groves and so have no fears on that score. These are the only alterations, we hope, from the side which played against Sunderland here last November and is a team nicely blended with youth and experience. Mike Cullen, the reigning Scottish winger, is preferred to Roy Davies as a result of the brilliant games he has been giving in the trial matches, and we sincerely trust he can continue this form to make him automatic choice when the Scottish side is next being selected.

We welcome to the professional playing staff four youngsters who have signed on the dotted line since the close of the 1955/6 season — they are Brendan McNally, left back, age 21, from Shelbourne United; Gerald King, just turned 18, son of former Luton player Tom King; Leonard Smith, age 21, local boy of whom great things are expected at centre half; and another local lad in Roland Legate, age 17, who showed great promise at outside left when he played in a Combination match at Southend, last May, as well as in his other outings in the Town's colours. We trust they all make names for themselves in this great game of football and that they have many happy years at Kenilworth Road. Also showing much promise is the son of another former Luton Town player whom many of you will remember with pleasure, Melville Daniels, popularly known as "Danny." A big boy for his age much is expected of this next generation in the Daniel saga.

While thinking of these additions to our playing staff, all youngsters, we are reminded of the letter appearing in this week's "Luton News" under the title "Some Supporters are disappointed." We do not bother as a rule to answer letters in the

Press but this one was meant to be helpful although showing some perplexity regarding our activities, or apparent lack of. Let us say straightaway that this problem of bringing new players to Luton has been given long and thoughtful consideration by the Board. We will try as briefly as possible to put you in the picture as we see it — firstly, there is a money squeeze, and you all know what that means; secondly — we have spent over £30,000 these last two close seasons in improving amenities inside the Ground for the benefit of supporters as well as the players and for future development; thirdly — Bob Morton we consider is among the six best centre forwards in the country and likes the position, with Tony Gregory rapidly picking up experience and showing great promise in that position, with Reg Pearce in the background if the necessity arises (he played very well in that position on the Continent last May in all five matches); fourthly — if another centre forward is brought here — and from where and at what price? — Gregory would have to be relegated to the third team for Morton would most likely be continued in that position unless the new capture proved of outstanding ability for Jim Pemberton is a most capable wing half, and failing that Alwyn McGuffie's undoubted ability in that position; and lastly, we have some very good local youngsters coming along who, although taking time, are improving all the time and will soon be knocking at the door for first team duty. Meanwhile, as the writer to the Press so nicely says, 'I know the (present) playing staff will give of their best at all times,' and when it is realised that the present senior side is young compared with most teams we feel sure their best will be good enough to keep us in our present high company.

In view of the fewer applications compared with last season by Season Ticket Holders for the Bobbers Stand it was obvious some alteration had to be made with the arrangements made last season in this section. It was decided after weighing all the pros and cons to allow the holders the exclusive use of the Bobbers Club on match days, where ladies' and gents' toilets are available, and where minerals will be on sale, also tea if the demand warrants it. In addition they will have practically the centre of the Stand to themselves protected from the cold North winds, and so we trust all Bobbers Stand Ticket holders will enjoy the amenities available to them. It is very difficult to please everyone, so we trust these Season Ticket Holders will accept the decision in the knowledge that we feel we are satisfying by far the greater number of people by allocating to them this particular portion of the Stand.

After much feverish activity the extension to the Bobbers Stand behind the Oak Road goal is in use today, although not as complete as we would have wished. At one time it was touch and go whether or not the extension would be usable but a lot of hard work by the builders these last few weeks has made its use possible today. Unfortunately the Refreshment Room under the extension will not be ready for a few weeks but the matter is in hand and everything will be done to get it ready at the earliest possible moment. We think you will agree with us that this extension has greatly improved the appearance of the Ground, and as it is all under cover it is added amenity for the cash customers.

Lastly, our thanks again to Johnny Sanderson and his staff for the hard work entailed in getting the playing pitch and its surroundings in ship-shape order for another season. The pitch looks a picture. Many thanks also to Messrs Flowers Breweries Ltd. for improving the Half Time Scoreboard entirely at their own expense. This gesture on their part is very much appreciated by us all.
