### CLUB NOTES

BEATEN at last but not disgraced. That was a remark heard at the Molineux Ground, last Wednesday evening, as the players were walking off the field after the most thrilling match played within the last twenty years, if not ever. Certainly one cannot imagine any football match which could have given more pulsating thrills and near heart attacks. The way the game swayed first one way and then the other, with a thrill every minute and the most polished football into the bargain had to be seen to be believed. When the excitement had died down and one tried to analyse this match two players stood out above every other, although every one played his part heroically. These two were Gordon Turner and Mike Cullen, as brilliant a wing as one could wish to see, ably backed by Jimmy Pemberton. But the whole play, particularly in the first half, was just scintillating, and without a doubt was the match of the century. When those of you who saw the match with Wolves down here last week visualise it was even better than that game, with nine good goals into the bargain for good measure, you have some idea of this wonderful performance. Nothing too good can be said about it—the pity of it was that both sides could not be granted two points. If it was possible we are sure even the most ardent Wolves' fans would have agreed. If Syd Owen had been playing it would most probably have made all the difference to the result, but Terry Kelly played his part very well and certainly did not let the side down. He was disgusted with the penalty kick decision given against him, for it was a very harsh decision and should never have been awarded, but there it was and much credit is due to him for not allowing it to put him off the game. If a film had been taken of this match it would have stood for a very long time as the classical example of how football should be played. What a pity it was not televised. The Wolverhampton Officials were most lavish in their praises of our lads, a great tribute from this wonderful Club. What a Final it would make if we both got to Wembley this season, and this match could be repeated!

In all these eulogies we must not overlook the fact that we are hosts today to another famous Club, and indeed to the F.A. Cup Winners of 1955/56. Manchester City won Talent Money last season in both Cup and League for as well as winning the Cup they finished in fourth place in the Table, a very fine achievement. They have not started too well this season, having obtained only two points so far from two drawn games but of course the season is still very young. Their visit to White Hart Lane, last Wednesday, not only resulted in one more defeat to record but their clever inside right, Johnny Hart, was rather badly hurt and so not able to take his place on the field here this afternoon. Bert Trautman is also still a casualty as a result of the injury he received at Wembley last May, but if his deputy, John Savage, plays as well as he did here last season and as well as against Tottenham, last Wednesday, then our lads will have to have their shooting boots on to finish on the right side. Coming on top of such a splendid start to the season and after the wonderful write-up we received from the Press after our game at Molineux, and against such attractive opponents as Manchester City we should have a near-capacity gate today. We hope all of you as you arrive will assist the Stewards in the difficult job of packing, taking their directions in good spirit knowing that they do it with the best of intentions. Do please move away from the entrances to enable those behind you to follow

suit and so that all of you can watch the game in some comfort. There was much grumbling after, and no doubt during, the game with Wolves here last week because quite a few were not able to see the game properly, but due to thoughtlessness on the part of quite a few people who were content to stop where they were as soon as they could see the play, the gates had to be shut with only 26,715 people inside. In view of the fact that we had already been able to accommodate 28,433 at a match, since when improvements have been made to increase the capacity by at least 3,500, it was most disappointing to have to turn away people who had taken the trouble to come to the Ground. We do ask you all therefore to pack well, especially on those occasions when there is a likelihood of a big crowd and please **KEEP CLEAR OF THE ENTRANCES.**

The match here, last Wednesday evening, with West Ham Reserves was not one to enthuse over and could not be compared in any way with the very good match with Tottenham's second string, last Saturday. One pleasing point however about the match, last Wednesday, was the very fine showing of Alan Daniel who, brought in at the last minute on account of injuries to three of our full backs, was certainly not out of his class and confirmed our good opinion of him.

During our marvellous Tour this last close season behind the so-called "Iron Curtain," when we visited Czechoslovakia, Roumania and Bulgaria and thoroughly enjoying every minute of it, we were asked, if such a visit could be arranged, would we receive at Luton any of the teams we played. Each of the five teams we played were very good and felt quite sure they would be a success here in England and we therefore told them we would be pleased to give them a game if the opportunity arose. This week we have heard that the leading team of Roumania, the C.C.A. containing when we met them nine Internationals and who beat us by five goals to one, are hoping to come to England towards the end of October. We hope to be able to arrange a match with them here at Kenilworth Road, for they are brilliant footballers and most entertaining to watch. We shall be very honoured if we can get them to play here for having to travel such a distance naturally they want to play before the biggest crowds in order to recoup some of their heavy expenses. We hope to have more definite news about this proposed match in the near future. It will of course be played by Floodlight if the match can be arranged.

Today, rain or no rain, St. Mary's Hospital is holding a Fair which, if everything has gone to plan, Roy Paul, the Captain of the Manchester City team, kindly opened at two o'clock, on his way to this match. A cordial invitation is extended to every one here this afternoon to call in at the Hospital in Dunstable Road after the match. Admission is free and teas and refreshments are available. With the money raised it is hoped to build better facilities for the Nursing Staff and to have an extension to the St. Mary's Hospital of the Football Commentaries Scheme which is proving such a success, we are very pleased to hear, at the Luton and Dunstable Hospital. Both are most worthy causes so we trust quite a few of you will call in and complete, what we hope will be, a most pleasant afternoon for you all.


