CLUB NOTES

WE WELCOME newly promoted Leeds United to our Ground this afternoon in this League I fixture, with every prospect of a great clash in store. Having won promotion last season for the fourth time in their history, which began only as recently as 1920, they have started off this season very well as a look at the Table shown elsewhere in the Programme will testify. Football is undoubtedly a team game, no one man can 'be the team,' but in John Charles, Leeds United have almost the exception. Wherever he plays, Centre Half, Centre Forward, Inside Forward, seems to make no difference, he is always in the picture and devastating anywhere inside the penalty box. The rest of the team however play their part nobly, and so perhaps it is not out of place to give pen pictures of them so that we may have a better idea of their various qualifications:

Wood, Royden. Goal. 6 ft. 2 ins. 12 st. 8 lbs. Transferred from Clitheroe, 6th May, 1952. Born Wallesey, was an ever-present last season.

Dunn, James. Right Back. 5 ft. 8 ins. 12 st. 2 lbs. Born in Glasgow, and was secured from Rutherglen Glencairn in 1947. An ever present in the first team last season.

Hair, Kenneth G. A. Left Back. 5 ft. 9 ins. 11 st. 11 lb. Born Burton-on-Trent and graduated through Junior teams. Made 34 appearances last season. Chosen for the F.A. team on the West Indies Tour, 1955.

Gibson, Archie. Wing Half. 5 ft. 9 ins. 10 st. 10 lbs. Born Girvan and secured in 1951 from Coylston Juniors. Graduated through the junior teams. Completed his National Service with the R.A.C.

Marsden, Jack. Centre Half. 5 ft. 11½ ins. 11 st. 12 lbs. A local boy signed in 1950, and graduated through the junior teams. Has understudied John Charles with no little success.

Kerfoot, Eric. Left Half. 5 ft. 9 ins. 10 st. 6 lbs. Transferred from Stalybridge Celtic, December 5th, 1949. Born at Ashton-under-Lyne, and a regular first team player. 42 appearances last season.

Meek, George. Outside Left or Right. 5 ft. 8 ins. 11 st. Just completed his National Service with the R.A.S.C. Army International, and obtained from Hamilton Academicals in 1952. Had a period with Walsall during his National Service. Born Glasgow.

Charles, Wm. John. Centre Half or Inside Forward. 6 ft. 1½ ins. 13 st. 12 lbs. Born Swansea, and a Welsh International. Equally at home in any position, and was top League goal scorer in 1953-54 with 42. Selected for the Great Britain team August 13th, 1955.

Brook, Harold. Centre Forward. 5 ft. 10 ins. 11 st. 10 lbs. Obtained from Sheffield United, in July, 1954. 32 League appearances last season, and scored 16 goals. Born at Sheffield.

Forrest, J. R. Centre or Inside Forward. 5 ft. 10 ins. 10 st. 6 lbs. Born Rossington, and secured from Retford Town in 1952. Deputised fairly often as leader of the attack.

Overfield, Jack. Outside Left or Right. 5 ft. 10 ins. 10 st. Another local player, local born and signed from Yorkshire Amateurs, May 11th, 1953. Just completed National Service with the R.A.F.

They are of course, as most of you know, managed by that astute player and one of England's greatest Inside Forwards, Raich Carter. He has certainly done a very fine job in the short time he has been in charge at Elland Road.

After our resounding defeat at White Hart Lane last Saturday when, without a doubt, the Spurs were the better team although the score

does not reflect a true picture for we had at times quite a lot of the play but our finishing was woefully weak, it was considered an opportune moment to make a few changes when we met Chelsea here last Wednesday evening in the Southern Floodlight Cup Competition. Although Chelsea have not done too well up to now they are not a team to be taken lightly, and the fact that we beat them by four goals to two showed that the changes were successful, especially when it is remembered that we had scored only two goals in our last four encounters, conceding nine. There was a refreshing vitality about the whole side which was most pleasing to see, only Reg Pearce not quite fitting into the scheme of things, although in all fairness we must point out that Reg had a nasty swelling on the side of a foot before the match which was aggravated quite early in the game. If such form can be repeated this afternoon we should be well back again to the success we enjoyed in the early part of the season when we scored sixteen goals in our first five matches.

The most difficult decision Team Manager "Dally" Duncan has had to face for a long time was the choice of who should stand between the sticks against Leeds United today. Ron Baynham had reported fully fit and is still on the short list as England's Goalkeeper, while on the other hand Bernard Streten had filled admirably and with much success the vacancy caused when Baynham received his injury during a training match before the season opened. Both are excellent goalkeepers, and we are very fortunate to have two such fine players available but unfortunately both cannot appear at the same time. The final decision was to choose Baynham, but Streten has the satisfaction of knowing that only Ron Baynham could have ousted him, whom we consider to be the best goalkeeper in England. But many thanks, Bernard, for your clever and at times courageous displays which have brought you many more friends up and down the country and especially at Kenilworth Road.

In a fortnight's time, on October 13th we will be holding our Annual Dance at the Winter Assembly Hall. We hope quite a few of you will come along and enjoy a pleasant evening to the music of The Regency Dance Band. Details are on opposite page.

A very nice little ceremony will be performed just before the commencement of the match today when we will have the very great pleasure of being presented with the big Clock on top of the Bobbers' Stand by G. A. R. Mead, Esq., acting on behalf of Skefko Ball Bearing Co. Limited. It is a most handsome addition to the Ground, and we do assure Mr. Mead and all connected with the "Skefko" that this very fine gesture is very much appreciated by us all.

Did you all make some contribution to the collectors acting on behalf of Toc H and Round Table when you arrived outside the Ground today? If not you will have a further chance to do so as you are leaving, for they will again be on duty then. The proceeds are to go towards an instrument for making a direct commentary of each match to St. Mary's Hospital. This will be in addition to the one already in service direct to the Luton and Dunstable Hospital which, as we have mentioned before, is proving immensely successful. All such collections we know are for most worthy causes, but we do hope each one of you has made some contribution today, however small, for by doing so it will enable you to say a quiet "thank you" to the Nurses wherever they may be, with whom most of us in some way or another have come in contact and for whose tireless devotion to duty we shall always be most grateful.
