

**CLUB NOTES**

WE have the great pleasure this afternoon of receiving our near neighbours Chelsea in a League One fixture, and trust we all enjoy a game of football at its best. Losing at home to Sunderland, last Saturday, has left the "Blues" lower in the Table than was expected for today's match, and while we both feel quite comfortably placed nevertheless we both would like to win today in order to get that little more breathing space. That, of course, is not possible, so we can anticipate a very eager effort on both sides to get that advantage over the other and so gain the better position. Chelsea are in the process of bringing along a young side which will stand them in good stead for many years, and, in fact, their forward line is about the youngest in the Leagues, certainly in the First League. While this development process is going on there are bound to be many disappointments for the home fans, but Ted Drake, their Manager, knows what he is doing and it is felt that in two years time Stamford Bridge will probably again be celebrating the honour of being League I Champions, an honour they have enjoyed only once in their long career, which was in the season before last. It is very surprising that a Club of Chelsea's calibre and potential, which entered the Football League in 1905, should have to strive for fifty years before gaining this honour, but gratifying in a way that it should come in its Jubilee year. The F.A. Cup has still eluded them, although they were in the Final in 1914 / 15 only to be beaten by Sheffield United at Old Trafford by three goals to nil. So they, like ourselves, have still to wait for this honour of winning this coveted prize.

We have for this match more or less our recognised First Team back on duty after Reg Pearce, Wally Shanks and Gordon Turner have had to cry off since the match at Portsmouth due to injury. "Shay" Dunne still is not fit enough to play, but is progressing very well, as also "Bud" Aherne who will, we are pleased to say, resume light training next week. Ray Smith slightly pulled a muscle at Griffin Park, last Tuesday, so is out of action today altogether. The goal he scored in that match incidentally from 30 yards out was worth going a long way to see. It was a glorious bit of quick thinking and powerful shooting which did us all good to see. Once we had taken the lead in this match by a very well taken goal by Tony Pounder we gradually took over control until in the end we were playing exhibition football. But not until we had established a two goal lead could we in any way relax against this promising Brentford side, who played the game in a most sporting spirit. The "Bees" are another team in the course of building from youth, and we felt we shall be seeing Brentford in a higher sphere before very long if they can continue to play these young lads and keep them from serious injury.

Having beaten Brentford in the Semi - Final of the Southern Floodlit Challenge Cup, we are now to meet the winners of the Reading v. Arsenal match, which will be played at Reading, on April 3rd. We shall not know until that match has been played where or when the Final will be played, but details will be given later.

Our second string gained a well deserved victory over Birmingham City's Reserves here, last Wednesday afternoon, by four goals to two, and considering we had two new youngsters in the forward line not used to this class of football felt it was a very good victory indeed against this very experienced team. M. Dixon playing at centre forward showed in his fourth game in this class that he is improving, and when he gets the real feel of this football we shall be surprised if he does not get quite a few goals, especially with his head when he learns to time the ball better in the air. This will come with training. He looks a very good prospect. The other forward new to Combination football was the local boy George Britton, who had the satisfaction of scoring the first goal and who settled down quite nicely as the game progressed. We have heard many good things of this boy which all look well - founded, and next season we hope it will be possible to find him a regular place in our Combination side. It was a very promising debut.

Next Wednesday, we play Birmingham City in a League I fixture here at Kenilworth Road, under the Floodlights, kick - off 7.30 p.m. Having beaten this bogey team of ours already on this Ground and thus broken the ice, we hope to continue this good work when we meet them next Wednesday. Tickets obtained for the original date, March 2nd, are, of course, applicable for this new date.

Other dates to bear in mind in the near future are Wednesday, April 10th, when we play Bedford Town in the Final of the Bedfordshire Professional Cup, kick - off 7.30 p.m., also Monday, April 8th, when we are staging the Seaward Trophy match between Luton Schoolboys and West Ham Schoolboys, kick - off also at 7.30 p.m. This is a unique occasion for the Schoolboys as it will be the first time they will be playing under the lights. We hope it will be a great success, not only from the football point of view which we are sure from past experience will be the case, but from the financial point of view for the proceeds are donated to the Old People, a cause in which Alderman Seaward, the donor of the Trophy, has taken a great interest for a good many years. The Luton Schools' F.A. are to be congratulated on giving such worthy assistance to Alderman Seaward in this splendid work, as also the boys who take part.






