



SOME OF TO-DAY'S PROBABLE VISITORS

Ron Baynham (Goalkeeper).

Joined Luton Town from Worcester City and quickly developed into a custodian of international quality. Has displaced another international in Bernard Stretten. Ron was born in Birmingham, stands over 6 feet and turns the scales at 12½ stones.

Seamus Dunne (Right-back).

A hard tackling defender who joined Luton from Shelbourne five years ago. Is an Eire international and stands 5 ft. 9 ins.

Leslie Jones (Left-back).

Although born in Wales, Leslie has spent most of his life in Luton. A cool and classical player bordering on international standard Leslie can play on either flank.

John Groves (Right-half).

Formerly an inside-forward, John has developed into a first-class wing-half who improves in every game. Is the son of an old Derby County player.

Sid Owen (Centre-half).

Previously with Birmingham City. Captain of the team and one of the best players in his position in the country. Has taken part in many representative games.

Mike Cullen (Outside-right).

Born in Glasgow, Mike plays typical Scottish football and is very clever when in possession of the ball. Played for the Scottish "B" team against England "B" last year; he also played for his country against Austria.

Gordon Turner (Inside-right).

A hard hitter of the ball, allied to cleverness, Gordon scored 37 goals in season 1954-55. Gained his first honours in the game when, in 1955, he played at Sheffield in the Football League team.

Bob Morton (Centre-forward).

A versatile player who is good in any position. Born in Luton Bob has done excellent work for his town and club. Has been Reserve for an England eleven and was a member of the F.A. touring team in South Africa in the summer of 1956.

Alan Brown (Inside-left).

A great international player of Scottish birth who was originally with East Fife before joining Blackpool, from whom Luton obtained him last season. Is one of the game's unluckiest of players for owing to injuries he has had to miss not only international games but also two Cup-finals when with Blackpool.

Jimmy Adam (Outside-left).

A fast and clever winger who joined Luton from Spennymoor United. Plays the typical game associated with his country — Scotland — and is a man to be feared by most defenders. Has been on the injured list recently.

PUNCHLESS VILLA

Leeds United 4 **Aston Villa 0**
(Baird 2, O'Brien, Brook)

At Elland Road, on Wednesday, September 4th, Leeds United deserved their win but certainly not by a four-goal margin. Villa played excellent football in mid-field and did as much, if not slightly more, of the attacking. But time and again Villa's attacks broke down on the edge of the penalty area with the ball being short-passed from man to man without any progress being made. There was no drive or directness in the penalty area and so the Leeds' defenders were given an easier time than they should have had.

Up to the 43rd minute Villa had looked capable of at least gaining one point. Then Pat Saward attempted a pass-back to Sims, failed to hit the ball hard enough and centre-forward

Baird ran in to score a simple goal. The second half was much the same story with Villa always promising much up to the penalty area and then falling away so badly that their two best shots throughout the second period both came from wing-half Saward. Then in a four minute spell Villa were really sent reeling as Leeds notched three goals in four minutes through Baird, O'Brien and Brook.

Villa wing-halves Crowther and Saward again did well, supplying an excellent service to the men up front. Dugdale again was in magnificent form against a Leeds centre-forward who had vastly improved on the form he showed at Villa Park in the earlier match between the clubs.

CHAPMAN GOAL SAVES POINT

Sunderland 1 **Aston Villa 1**
(O'Neill) (Chapman)

At Roker Park, on Saturday, Villa once more had Smith on the right wing, but with Myerscough rested Chapman was brought in at inside-left, with Dixon in the centre, and a header by the newcomer enabled us to bring back a valuable point after a game ruined by a strong, swirling wind.

Again, though, this was a rather disappointing performance by the forward line against a Sunderland defence which never appeared very strong. The Villa defence again did well, despite the difficult conditions and the sharpshooting and intelligent running of Sunderland's 19-year old inside-left, Allan O'Neill. O'Neill and Sims fought a tremendous personal duel with our goalkeeper making at least five international-class saves. He was beaten only once, after 36 minutes, when a Dugdale slip let in O'Neill for the first goal. Well into the second half a shot by Elliott crashed against the crossbar and, only three minutes from the end, Sunderland's young outside-left Goodchild scooped a simple chance over the bar from four yards.

All in all, Villa's ill-luck of the early matches definitely turned in this one and they were rather lucky to come home with a point. Sims, in superb form, was the star of the match and Peter Aldis performed well, notably in the opening 20 minutes when he three times kicked the ball of a forward's foot with a goal looking certain. Chapman justified his inclusion twenty minutes from the end when he leaped to head in a Leslie Smith centre.


