


## CLUB NOTES

AT THE TIME these Notes were sent to the printers a clean bill of health had been reported, and so we are hoping to field the team which appears on the centre page of this programme. So many teams have been hit by this epidemic, however, and at such short notice, that all Clubs are left wondering if it is their turn next. We fully expected some absentees after the visit of Everton a fortnight ago, for several of their players reported ill shortly after that match, but so far we have been most fortunate, and are very thankful it is so.

Our visit to Roker Park last Saturday resulted in three goals being scored against us without reply. The three goals, apart from the one from the penalty spot, were not the result of brilliant movements well conceived, but the ball found the net, an achievement which our lads could not copy despite their brilliant at times football in midfield. In an attempt to try and find a solution to this all-important matter of getting the ball into our opponents' nets George Cummins has been recalled into the forward line following his brilliant displays in the Reserve side these last two matches. Certainly if he can repeat his display of last Saturday against Bristol Rovers Reserves we should see our 'goals for' column in a healthier position, and with it of course a few more points in the bag.

Burnley, our opponents today, we welcome once more to Kenilworth Road, but it is a different Burnley from the one we have met in the years gone by, for they have always boasted a strong defence which gave very few goals away. In their promotion year from the Second Division for instance, season 1946/47, they conceded 29 goals only in the 42 matches played, and only 43 the following season when they finished in third place in the First Division. So far this season, however, in the 10 matches played they have had 24 goals scored against them, 16 of these in their last three away matches, and then to add salt to the wound they were beaten at Turf Moor last Saturday by Newcastle United by two clear goals. Burnley however have been very hard hit by the 'flu bug these last few weeks, and today two of their recognized first team players, goalkeeper Colin McDonald and international left half Leslie

Shannon are still on the sick list, together with centre forward Alan Shackleton who has been proving very useful in that position this season. To make matters still worse for them, Jimmy McIlroy their international inside right has been chosen to play for Ireland versus Scotland in the International match being played at Belfast this afternoon. An honour, certainly, but it makes one wonder if the Club would have been justified in asking for their player to be released from International duty in view of the circumstances in which they find themselves at the moment. There is nothing vitally at stake in this match here today, except that points are of course acceptable at any time. McIlroy with his experience—he was first capped in 1951—might have made some difference to the result if he had been playing here today. We like to give our players every opportunity to play for their country when selected and apparently to their credit, particularly under these difficult circumstances, Burnley like to do the same.

Seamus Dunne and George Cummins played for their country last Wednesday when they beat Denmark in Copenhagen by two clear goals, one of them being scored by our player. Eire thoroughly deserved their victory, both our players we are pleased to note thoroughly justifying their selection.

Another of our players, Reg Pearce, has been selected to play for the English Football League versus the Irish Football League to be played on the Leeds United ground on Wednesday evening next, October 9th, kick-off 7.30 p.m. by Floodlight. Prices of admission are Ground 2/-, Popular Enclosure 2/3, Paddock 3/6, Lowfields Road Stand 5/6, West Stand 7/6, Centre Stand 7/6. Tickets are available in advance for all Stands by applying direct to Leeds United F.C. with remittance and stamped addressed envelope.

The Luton Schoolboys will be playing here on Thursday night next, October 10th when they play Hertford Boys in the First Round of the English Schools' Shield Competition. Kick off has been arranged for 7.15 p.m. by Floodlight, which is the first time a match in this competition has been played under the lights. We hope there is a good turn out to see these boys in action, for as a rule some very good football is played by these youngsters.

IT is with much regret we announce that Mr. Henry Richardson, a Director of this Club, passed away peacefully on Wednesday night last, October 2nd, at the age of 77. Elected a Director on 24th March, 1937, Mr. Richardson has been a most conscientious Member of the Board, and the Club has lost a great and valuable servant. Appointed Vice-Chairman of the Board on 15th June, 1954 he carried out his duties in an efficient and capable manner until his health began to fail following an illness in 1956 when he asked that his nomination to continue in that Office be withdrawn as he felt he could not now carry out to his satisfaction the duties which the Office of Vice-Chairman demanded. His wishes were respected, but it was with much regret, for he had worked very hard during those two years, attending the Club often three and four times a week to see that the various works being carried out, particularly the extension behind the Main Stand were to his satisfaction. We shall certainly miss his presence at our Board Meetings where his views, particularly on matters of finance, were greatly respected.

WE also greatly regret the passing on Saturday last, 28th September, of one of our pre-war players, Jock Finlayson, at the age of 46, after a long illness. Coming to Luton from Clapton Orient in Season 1935/36 as a full back he was soon reverted to a wing half back, the position he played for his native village Thornliebank in Scotland before going to Motherwell, then on to Cowdenbeath before being transferred to Clapton Orient. Jock delighted the fans of his day with his uncanny skill in being able to bring the ball under immediate control from anything up to elbow height with either foot, and for his attacking ideas. He and Billy Fellowes on the other flank made the ideal wing halves to pivot Jack Nelson, playing a big part in our promotion to the Second Division, Season 1936/37. Jock was cremated at Bedford, last Wednesday, where a wreath from the Club was sent ending with the words "in remembrance of a good and faithful servant." Two very sad blows in one week.






