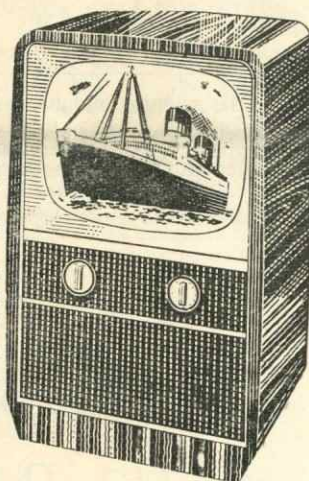

### CLUB NOTES

ONCE again it is our pleasure to welcome to Kenilworth Road our friends from Tyneside, Newcastle United. The United are a team with a high reputation for playing fine soccer and this match is one eagerly awaited as each new season approaches. The "Magpies" have always proved a big crowd-puller here at Luton and we hope their lowly League position will not adversely effect today's gate, for they are an attractive side to watch. At Luton they can always be certain of a warm welcome, for amongst our cosmopolitan population there are many who hail from the North-East and who will, no doubt, have divided loyalties this afternoon.

Today Newcastle visit us with only 11 points from 16 games and lying 20th in the League chart. The Newcastle Directors have diagnosed their trouble as failure of the forwards, a complaint so often heard these days from teams in the relegation area.

It is surprising to find Newcastle in this situation for they have a wealth of talent on their books and one cannot help but feel that this is just a passing phase and that the team will 'click' into gear sooner or later. Whatever their current League position we can expect Newcastle to be on top form when Cup Tie time comes round. Renowned throughout the soccer world for their splendid Cup record, United have appeared in the final on no less than ten occasions, winning the Cup six times.

We must not under estimate their strength here this afternoon for with players like Jimmy Scoular, Ron Simpson and Bobby Mitchell, they have the experience to turn the present gloom which hangs over St. James' Park into the brightest sunshine!

The two points collected at Stamford Bridge, last Saturday, came as no real surprise. Our Manager, Dally Duncan, visited Chelsea, last Thursday week, to witness their display against the Red Army team from Moscow, and after their rather indifferent showing against the Russians he was sure we could win. Even when Ted Drake's young "Ducklings" went into an early lead his confidence was not shaken, and as it turned out we came home easy winners. However, the factor that the "Ducklings" showed such mediocre form against the Red Army team should not be allowed to overshadow our own fine display. We were superior to Chelsea in every department and this was confirmed by the number of very favourable Press reports our team received.

Our 3-1 victory was a personal triumph for Gordon Turner. This was his first appearance at Stamford Bridge and his brilliant hat-trick will be remembered for many years to come. Each of the three goals he fired in left goalkeeper Matthews as helpless as a snowman in a heat wave! It will be a great injustice if the Selectors fail to recognise the talent of our inside right and grant him a place in the England team. Honour must surely come his way now.

But this was not a one man win by any means. Gordon received excellent support from the rest of the team and in particular from Alan Brown, who

has developed an uncanny understanding with him, and he seems to have made the centre forward berth his permanent position. Indeed, Alan was himself very unlucky to have what seemed a perfectly good goal disallowed by the referee.

We are certain that the seven points we have collected from the last four games—and in particular our wins over Birmingham and Chelsea—will have done much to give our team the fillip they need to face the heavier grounds we can expect to encounter in the next two or three months. Traditionally the muddy grounds have been our downfall but perhaps at last we can say goodbye to this bogey once and for all.

Whilst recollecting on past matches this is the first opportunity we have had through this column to comment on the Charity Match the Town played against an All Star XI on November 4th. The local Spastics benefitted by several hundred pounds whilst the supporters who braved the elements on that particular evening to visit Kenilworth Road were treated to as fine a display of football as could be expected under such appalling conditions. Our 7-0 victory was of little consequence as we could not expect the older members of the All Star team to be as fit as our lads in the mud; indeed some of them only play in such matches and daily training is a thing of the past. Despite the conditions the crowd saw some of the touches which labelled our opponents masters of the art of soccer and we were treated to a fine display of sportsmanship.

One event which stood out above all the others on that evening was the welcome return to Kenilworth Road of Jesse Pye. Jesse is still a great favourite as was shown by the cheers he received every time he had the ball, and it was a tonic to see his skilful ball control in the mud. Jesse is now giving valuable service every Saturday to Wisbech Town.

Last Saturday morning we were treated to a fine display of junior football by the Luton Schoolboys. Our talented youngsters defeated Southend-on-Sea Schoolboys to the tune of 4-0 and thus assured themselves of a place in the third round of the Corinthian Shield. Had it not been for the fine display by Axcell in the Southend goal the score sheet may easily have been as long as their world-famous pier! One would have expected Southend of all teams to have felt at home in the mud! In the next round our Schoolboys visit Leicester just one week from today.

In the next round of the Southern Floodlight Cup we have been drawn away to Brentford whom we defeated in last season's tournament. In the junior equivalent of this competition we have to play Charlton here at Luton.

As a special treat for all you soccer fans we are introducing a touch of glamour to Kenilworth Road this afternoon. It is our pleasure to welcome back once more the Butlin's Young Ladies to give us one of their popular displays. We hope the weather will be kind and that mud and rain will not prevent them from showing us how to keep fit. The girls are all volunteers of course, and we, the Club, wish to thank them most heartily for coming along this afternoon to entertain us.

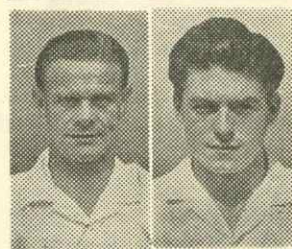
